Time

3 Stn Calgary is in Mountain Time Zone and is on Mountain Standard Time.

Telephone - Telegraph

4 Telephone - All information regarding telephone service is contained in the Directory at each phone. Long distance calls must be authorized prior to the call by the PAO during normal working hours and the Stn Orderly Officer at other times. The Switchboard is open 24 hours each day.

8 Telegraphs - Personal telegraphs may be sent and received from the Canadian National Telegraph and CPR downtown office.

Medical and Dental

9 Medical treatment is available from the MIR in Bldg 13 with Sick Parade at 0830 hrs, daily. Form M25 will be obtained from the SWO in the HQ building prior to attending sick parade.

10 Personnel requiring emergency medical treatment shall proceed directly to the MIR. If unable to do so, personnel must call Cpl Brewer at local 49 in addition to notifying their section.

11 Personnel are reminded that, in accordance with (QR Air 19:18), any officer or airman who is suffering, or suspects he is suffering from a disease shall, without delay, report himself sick.

12 Smoking is prohibited at all times, in all hangars, workshops and places where inflammable material is kept. Particular attention of all personnel is drawn to the fact that SMOKING IN BED IS PROHIBITED.

Fire

13 On the sounding of the Fire Siren all personnel not detailed for special fire duties are to fall in:

- (a) During working hours outside their place of duty
- (b) During off duty hours outside their quarters, under the direction of the senior airman present.

On discovering a fire the person is to shout "FIRE" and sound

the Fire Alarm box nearest the fire or phone the Fire Hall. When reporting a fire by phone shout "Fire" to the operator when she answers. The operator will connect the caller direct to local 6 (fire hall). When answered, pass the information and wait until the fire fighter repeats the location to you.

Extreme caution must be exercised to avoid fires.

Accidents, Loss or Damage

14 Personnel will report, as soon as possible, all accidents, loss or damage to the WAdO.

Security

15 Admission to Station - The only authorized point of entry and exit from the Station is through the guard house at the main gate. Proper identification must be produced on entry to the confines of the Station.

16 Area Out of Bounds -

- (a) The Officer's Mess is out of bounds to all other ranks except those detailed on duty or have official business therein.
- (b) The Sergeant's Mess is out of bounds to all ranks below the rank of sergeant unless detailed on duty or have official business therein.
- (c) The kitchen is out of bounds to all unauthorized personnel.
- (d) All buildings not in use are strictly out of bounds to all personnel with the exception of those whose duties warrant them entering the building.
- (e) Telephone switchboard is out of bounds to all personnel except those whose duties warrant them entering same.
- (f) The boiler rooms are out of bounds to all unauthorized personnel.

- (g) All male quarters are out of bounds to female personnel.
- (h) All women personnel quarters are out of bounds to male personnel.

Quarters

- 17 Quarters shall be kept neat and clean at all times.
- 18 The following is Prohibited:
 - (a) the introduction or consumption of any type of alcoholic beverage in quarters.
 - (b) all forms of gambling.
 - (c) lewd paintings or photographs.
 - (d) smoking in bed.

Breakages and Damages

19 Officers and airman, who through a wilful act or negligence, cause damage, may be required to pay for such damage. Damage caused by unidentified officers or airmen, may be charged to all personnel who were known to occupy the building during the period the damage occurred.

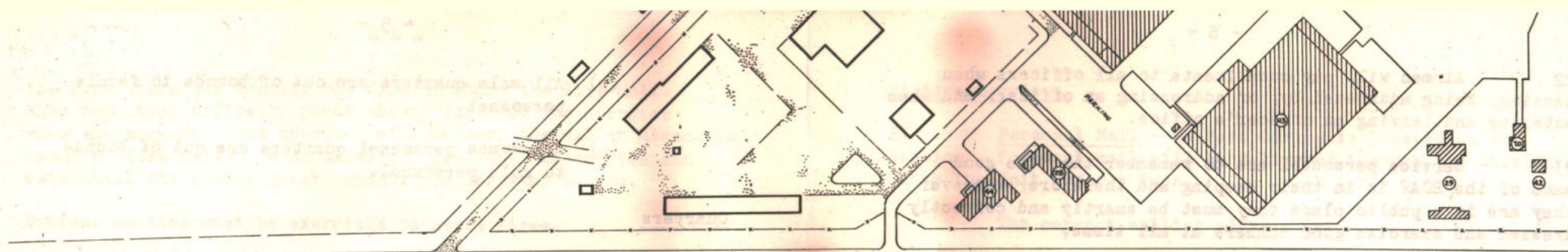
Station Orderly Room

20 The Station Orderly Room is located in Bldg 1. Inquiry hours are:

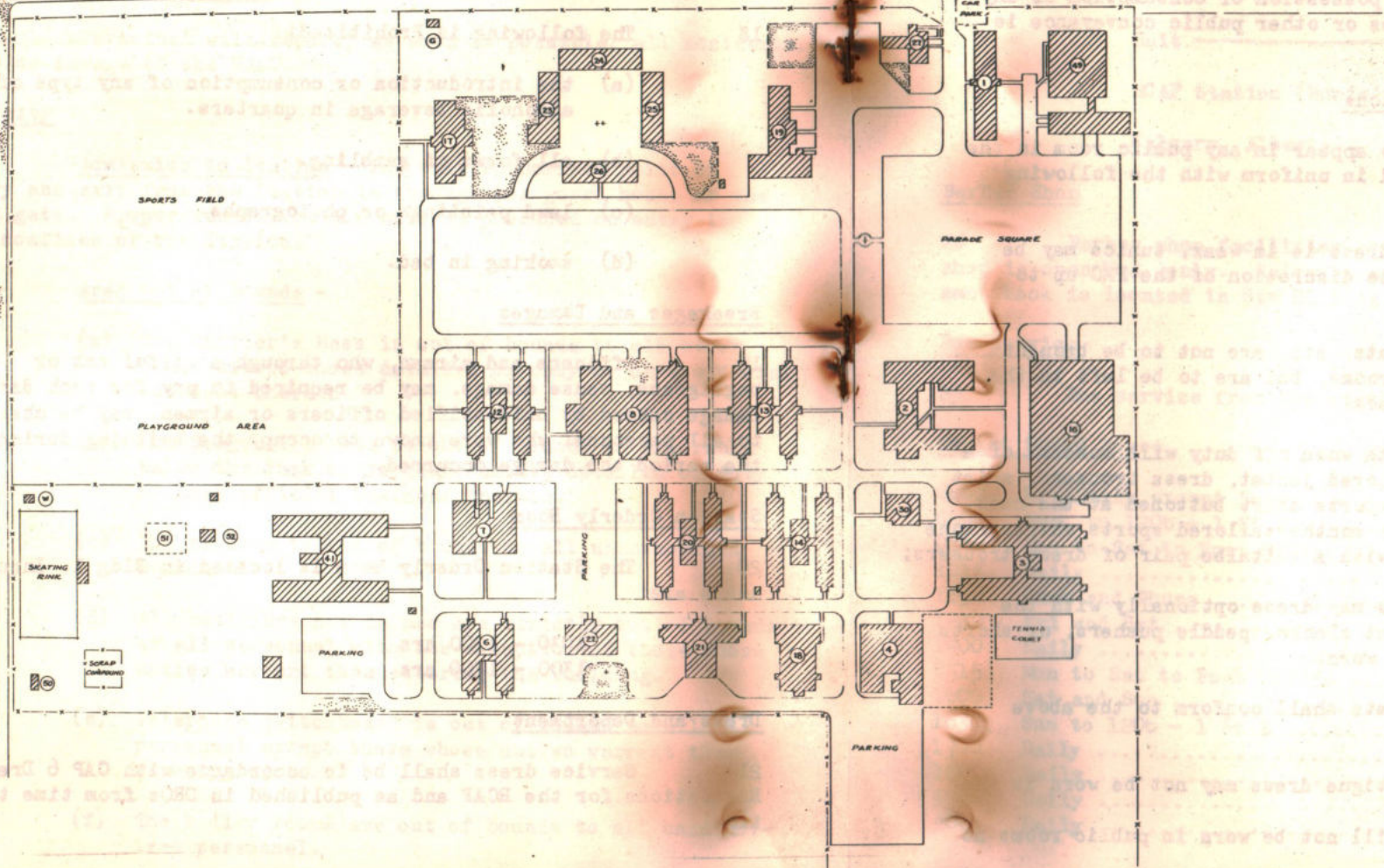
- 1030 - 1200 hrs

22 Airmen will pay compliments to all officers when passing, being addressed by, or addressing an officer, and when entering and leaving an officer's office.

23 Service personnel are to remember that the good name of the RCAF is in their keeping and therefore, whenever they are in a public place they must be smartly and correctly dressed and exercise good manners at all times.

24 The introduction, possession or consumption of any intoxicant in railway coaches or other public conveyance is forbidden.

Airmen's Mess Dress Regulations

26 Members are not to appear in any public room in the club unless properly dressed in uniform with the following exceptions:

- (a) When summer dress is in wear, tunics may be removed at the discretion of the PMC up to 1900 hrs;
- (b) Hats, overcoats, etc, are not to be brought into public rooms, but are to be left in the appointed place;
- (c) Civilian dress when off duty will consist of a suitable tailored jacket, dress trousers, shirt and tie, or sports shirt buttoned at the neck. During summer months tailored sports shirts alone may be worn with a suitable pair of dress trousers;
- (d) Female guests may dress optionally with the exception that slacks, peddle pushers, or shorts shall not be worn;
- (e) Civilian guests shall conform to the above regulations.
- (f) Sports or fatigue dress may not be worn in the games room.
Tee shirts will not be worn in public rooms at any time.

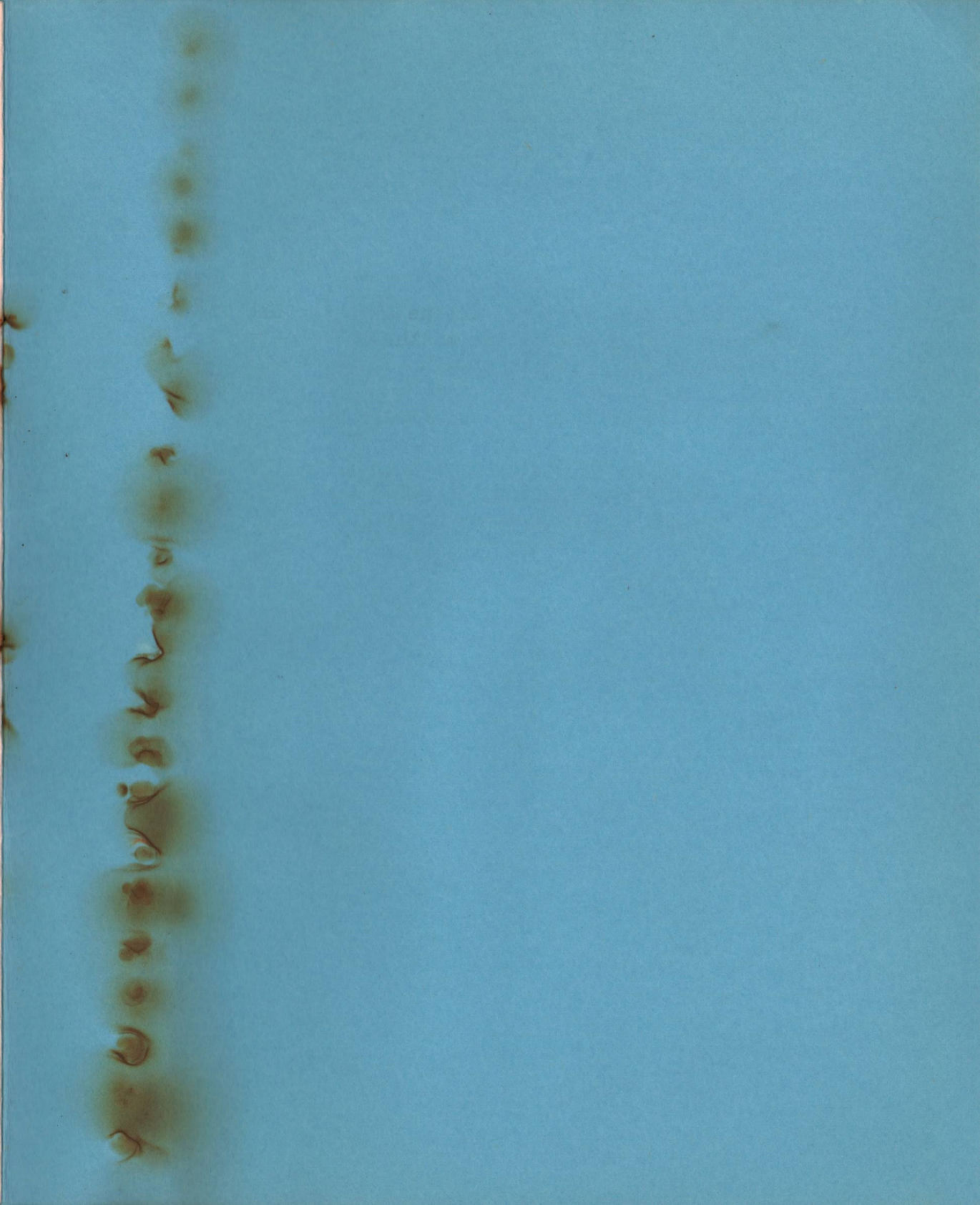
