SOCCER

Gimli now has the distinction of representing zone 3 for two consecutive years, following their defeat of Portage and Winnipeg last week. The games were played on Friday and Saturday at Portage.

During the early stages of the first game Gimli was playing fairly cautiously until left winger, Clive Loader placed the ball into the Portage net with the accuracy one would expect to see on the rifle range rather than on the soccer field. There was no further scoring, so the first half ended with Gimli one goal ahead. However, the fact that Portage were unable to score during the first 45 minutes and only managed to scramble the ball into the Gimli net once in the second half, is no indication of the number of attempts made upon the Gimli goal. This was the result of a superb job of goal tending done by Erwin Sippert. When play resumed, it was Ron Burkowski who scored the 2nd goal. This was followed by a zero degree shot by Clive Loader, to make it 3-0.

Then it was the oppositions turn and Portage got their goal. By way of retaliation Ron scored once more and the final goal was netted by Jim Thomson.

At 12:30P.M. on Saturday the team was limbering up on the field in preparation for a 1 o'clock kick off, but the opposition was not ready to play until 2:00 P.M. The tension and restlessness created by the long wait was of no help, but fortunately the game was still won. It was a hard rough battle against Winnipeg and the Gimli defencemen had their time cut out keeping the attackers at bay. Once again goalie Erwin Sippert put on a masterful display, stopping shots that looked like certain goals. Jim Thomson booted the first one in for Gimli and then shortly before the orange break, Winnipeg scored.

The superior fitness of the Gimli team was apparent in the 2nd half. Ron Burkowski waded through their defences and gave Gimli a 2-1 lead. Then Jim Thomson aided by Dave Hartley, broke through their defence to boot in Gimli's final goal. Winnipeg later scored again, thus the game ended 3-2 in Gimli's favour.

Every member of the Gimli team exerted himself to the utmost and they are all to be congratulated for their ability, which has placed the team top of the zone.

From the 11th to 15th October Gimli will be competing against seven other soccer teams at Winnipeg, for the Pearkes Trophy.

ARMAMENT SAFETY

In one year Manitoba had 31 firearm accidents. Nineteen of these were caused by shooters 21 years of age and under; 14 by shooters 16 and under. Twenty were inflicted by the .22" rifle - 2 of which were fatal. In 22 cases the victim was within 10 yards or less of the muzzle of the gun. Nine of these accidents were caused by licensed hunters during hunting season; one of which was fatal.

Here are some examples of needless accidents:

1. Victim retrieved duck with butt of loaded shotgun. Trigger caught on reed; weapon discharged striking victim in upper arm and shoulder.
2. Victim was carrying loaded .22" rifle into the house. He tripped on a rubber mat and fell; gun discharged wounding him in the stomach.
3. Shooter and victim dragging buck by the horns. Shooter bent down to get fresh grip on horns. Gun which was being carried by sling over shoulder partly slipped forward, trigger caught on bush and gun discharged killing partner.
4. Friend put loaded rifle into vehicle. Victim was hit while removing what he thought was an unloaded rifle from the vehicle.
5. Shooter swung on flying bird and fired when bird was between him and victim, inflicting wounds to forehead, jaw and arm of victim.
