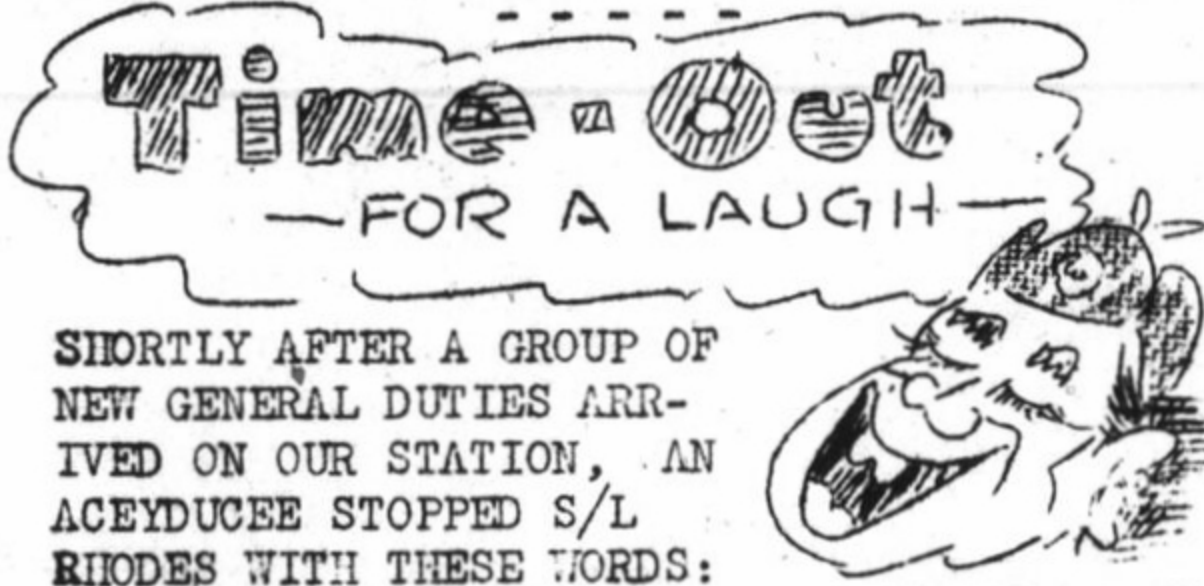

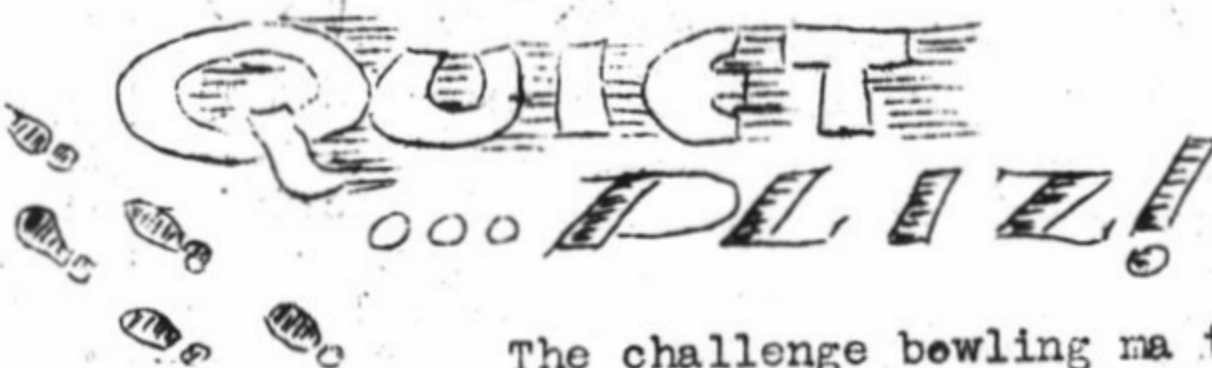
# PUGSLEY-SCARFE DOUBLES WINNERS

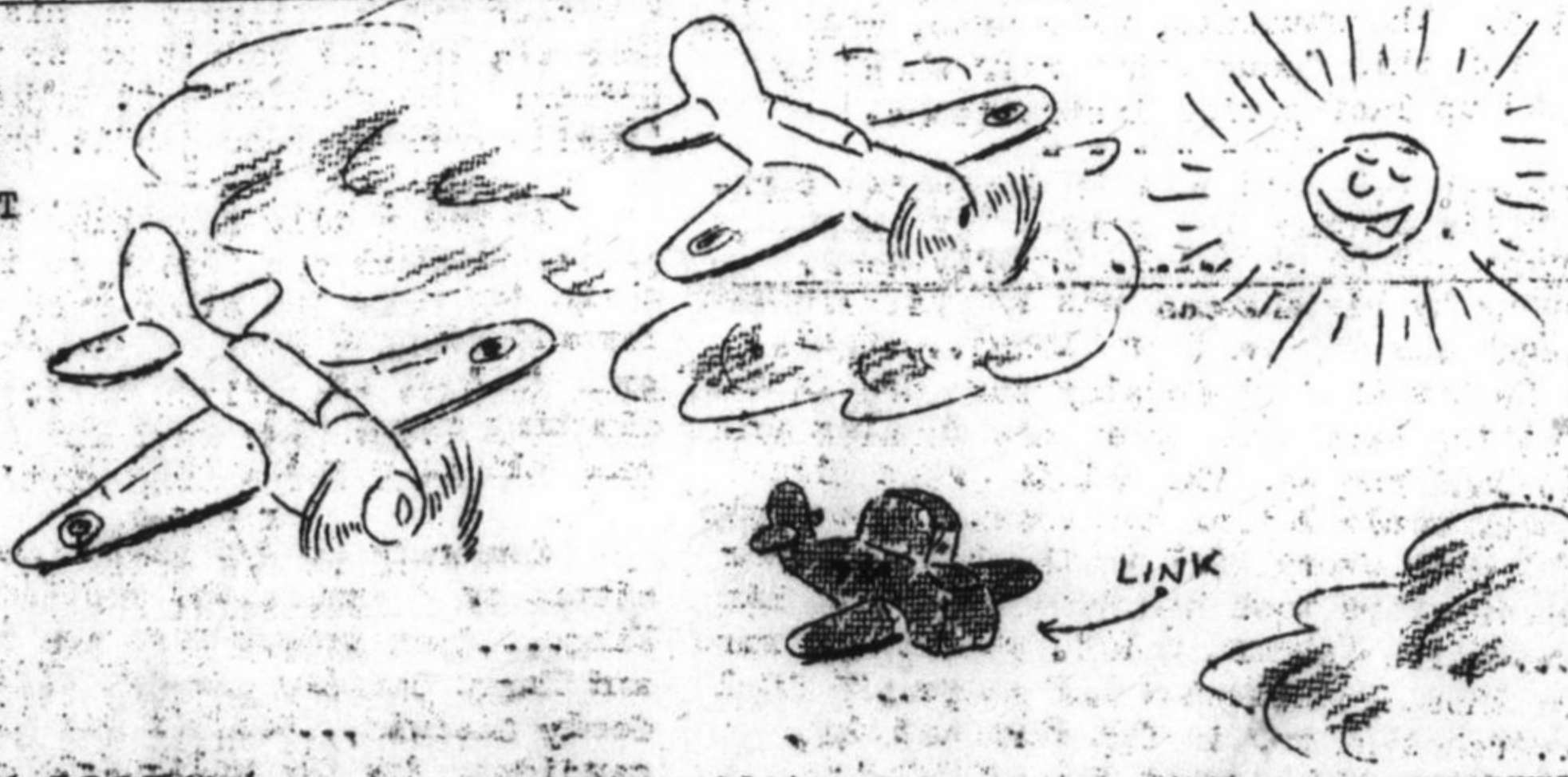
