WIND AND DUST DAMPEN FIRST GAME

WITH HITS HELD WELL IN TOW, NO. 12 SETS BRANDON SNEAKED OUT WITH A 5-3 WIN IN THE OPENING BASEBALL BDSAA FIXTURE ON THE LOCAL DIAMOND WEDNESDAY NIGHT BEFORE A FAIR SIZED CROWD. IT WAS THE FIRST GAME OF THE SEASON FOR OUR AILERONS AND THEY PLAYED SMART BALL.

Jack Chambers was hot on the Aileron mound as he went the full seven innings to strike out no less than thirteen Brandon batters as well as limiting them to four singles. Eight bases on balls proved the weak spot in Chambers hurling. The No. 12 team made the best of the breaks and used the four Souris errors to make good their win.

Brandon were first to score when Chambers walked in a run in the second inning after loading the bases with four-ball counts on three preceding batters. The Ailerons came right back in their half of the second to score a lone run as Muir singled and came home on a Brandon error when Gagnier lobbed one out through short. Ailerons took a 3-1 lead in the last of the fourth as Chambers walked, Aitken singled and Hodgson punched on through for two bases on an error.

The first of the sixth proved the Brandon hot spot when they combined two walks, one hit and one error for three runs.

No. 12 used three men on the mound to make their win.

KENNY KARICATURES

ART HALLMAN, featured singer with Mart Kenny since the formative years of the band on the west coast, is one vocalist who has shown consistant improvement over the years. As the Mart Kenny band grew from its beginning of five "Western Gentlemen" to its present status as Canada's Spotlight Band, Art has steadily improved as a singer.

Now, his appearance at the microphone is the signal for a spontaneous welcome which the radio producers must allow for in the split-second timing required by network broadcasting.

Art Hallman is no one-track artist. His work on sax, piano, clarinet, as the arrangements demand, is another reason for the smooth blend of music produced by the Mart Kenny group.

Art teamed up with Mart in 1932, a year or so after the band was formed. He worked first as a pianist, and was used on the occasional vocal as a "fill-in". But it was not long before his songs became number one attraction of the band -- and every year his voice becomes more popular.
