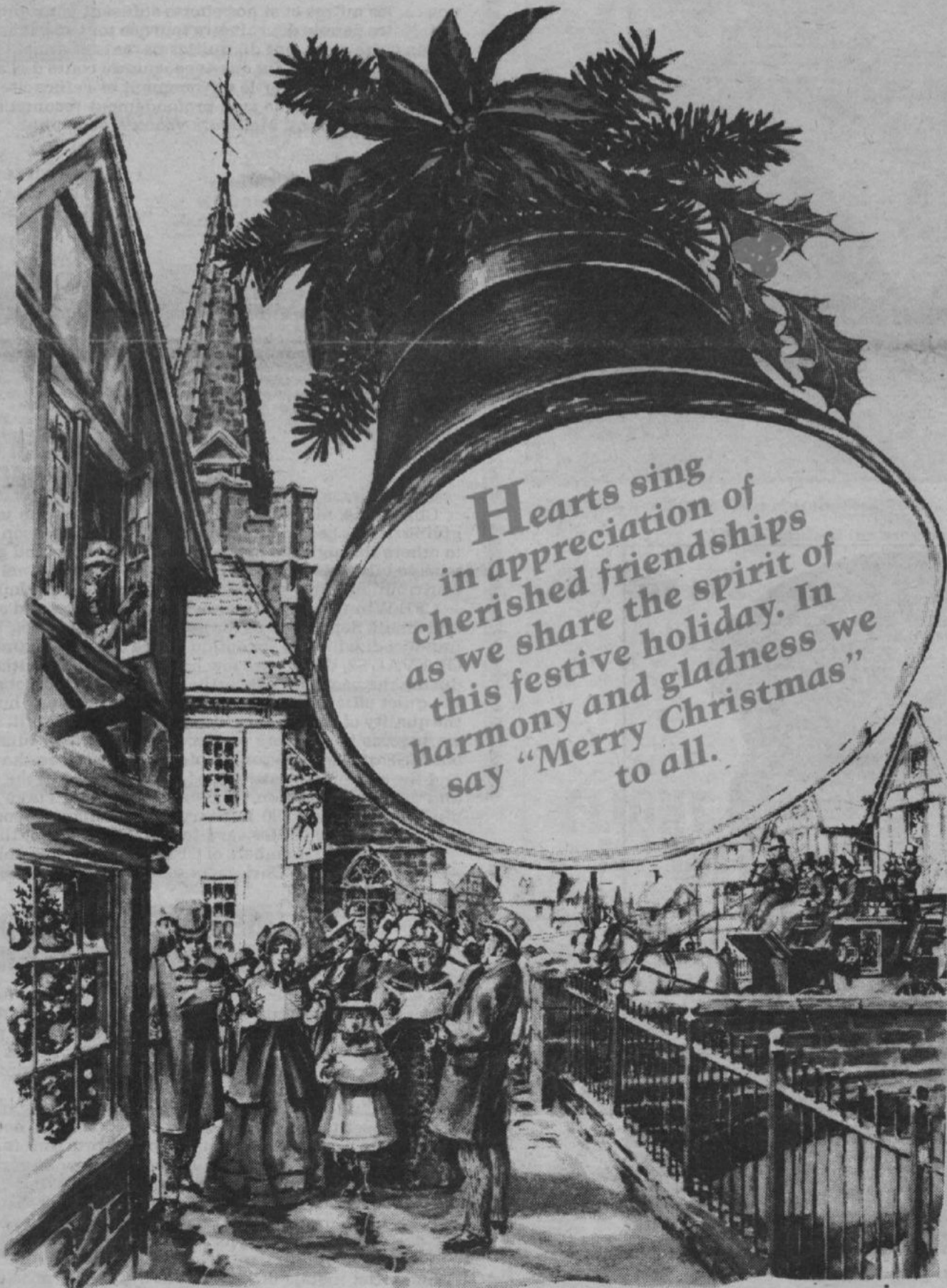

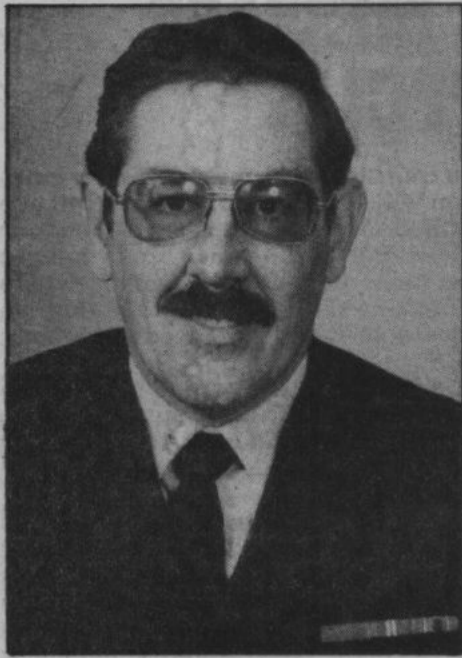

**HOWGOZIT II**

Let me make one thing perfectly clear. HOWGOZIT has nothing to do with AEROSPACE REPORT. My article deals primarily with the main floor people of Mawdesley Hall; the basic Air Navigator instructors and students. The error in the last issue of VOXAIR will not happen again or so I'm told. Now to find out ... HOWGOZIT.

Course 8202 is the last course to graduate under the old syllabus. To allow for a smooth transition from the old to the new syllabus Courses 8203/04 were zero loaded (no course). Thus Course 8205 has the honour of being the first class under the new syllabus. Barring any major breakdowns with the C-130NT or Air Navigation Procedures Trainer (ANPT) Course 8205 should graduate in late March or early April, 1983. 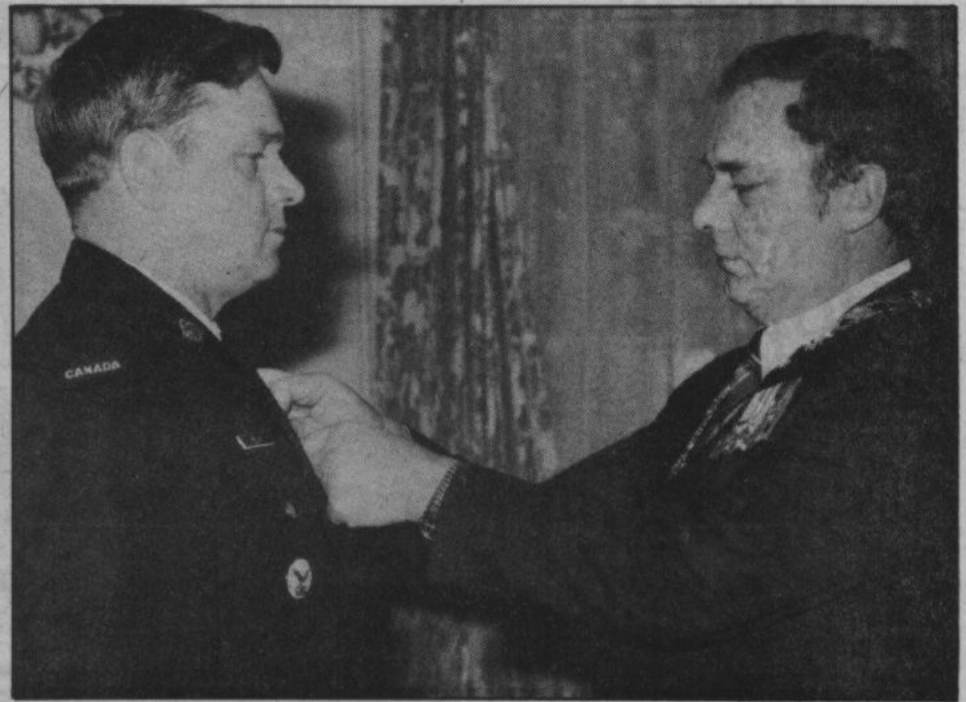
1. If you are a member of the Regular Forces or a full time permanent Public Service employee holding a CFB Winnipeg PLCC card you may be eligible.

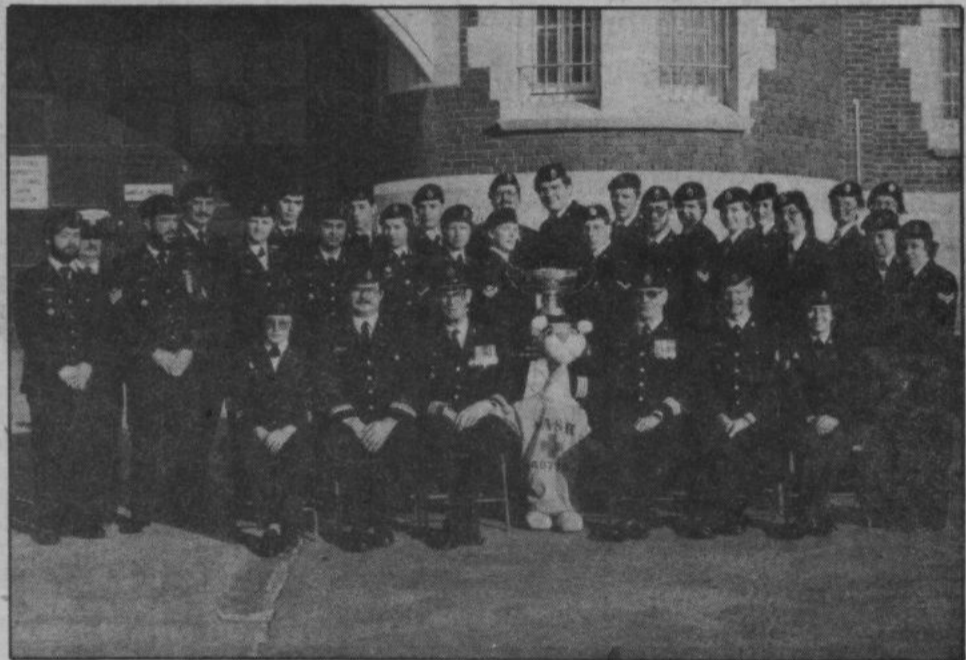

CWO Macdonald, married and father to seven daughters, has been involved in numerous exercises in northern Canada, Norway, Belgium and Germany.



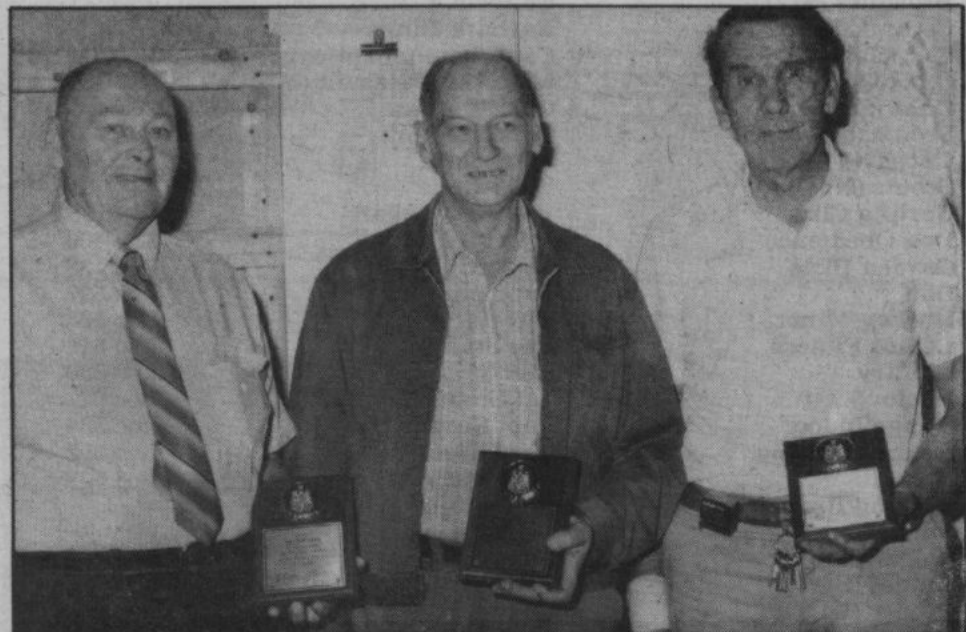

### TRAIN DON'T STRAIN

It is better to do too little than too much especially in the first days of your programme when you'll likely have some sore and stiff muscles.

If you feel fatigued, stop and walk. Learn how to take your pulse. If your heart beats 170 to 180 times a minute, you are jogging too fast "SLOW DOWN". If you are running with friends "Do not compete with them." Joggers are not competitive runners. How fast and how far you jog in a day depends on your level of fitness and goals.

### HOW TO FIND YOUR PULSE

Put two fingers on your upper throat until you find your pulse. "Do Not Press Hard". Count your pulse for 10 seconds and multiply by 6 to get your heartbeats per minute.

### SETTING GOALS

**Long Term** Start a jogging diary and list your long term goals i.e. lose weight, improve your health and fitness, have fun, etc.

Having goals gives you more purpose and incentive to jog.

**Short Term** Set realistic short term goals. For instance you may wish to increase your weekly jogging mileage from 7 to 10½ miles in the first 6 weeks, or you may want to lose a pound of body weight each week for the first ten weeks.

Or you may wish to run a mile under 10, 8, or 6 minutes.

### PROGRAMME PRINCIPLES

**Be Consistent** Get into the habit of jogging. Jog three days a week or more often. Many joggers jog every day. That means they don't have to ask themselves "Should I jog today or not?"

**Build Variety** into your program. Jogging can be boring if you run in the same place, at the same speed and time every workout.

**Be Patient** When you realize that it take months for you to achieve worthwhile goals, you won't get discouraged by slow, day-to-day progress.

## THINGS TO DO AVOID

**A Well-Balanced Diet** Jogging burns plenty of calories. You need 3 nutritious meals a day.

**Get Plenty of Sleep** Jogging wears you down. You need time, rest and regular hours of sleep to be ready for your next jog.

**Avoid Illness, Vicious Dogs, Icy Roads and Other Hazards** If a cold or accident cancels your jogging for a week or so, you will lose some of your conditioning, setting back your goals. Good diet, sleep, rest and common sense will help you stay healthy and safe.

### DAILY JOGGING ROUTINES

**1. Map Out Several Routes** From 1 to 4 or more miles. Each route should start and end at your home or another location where you can have a shower and put on dry clothing. Choose a route to jog at a slow, steady pace. You do not have to time each jog. Keep a comfortable pace.

**2. Out and Back** Using your watch, jog from a starting point for 5, 10 or 15 minutes or more in one direction. Then you return along the same route at the SAME PACE (not faster).

**3. Hill Jogging** An excellent way to build fitness rapidly, but it is strenuous. Start by jogging up a short, gentle slope and walking or jogging down. Repeat 4 to 10 times. Move to longer and steeper hills as your strength and endurance improves.

**4. Fartlek** is a kind of jogging-running that allows you to express yourself as you please. Change your pace often - from a steady jog, to a MILD, SHORT SPRINT, to a walk or slow jog. Do not follow a pattern of place or pace.

**5. Interval Jogging** must be done at a location such as a track, where short distances are measurable (100, 200, 400 metres or 2, 4, 6 telephone poles). There are four elements to this workout.

a. The **DISTANCE** you jog (i.e. 400 metres).

b. The **NUMBER OF TIMES** you jog that distance (i.e. 4 times 400 metres).

c. **PACE** (i.e. 2½ minutes for each 400 metres).

d. **REST TIME** (i.e. 2 minutes between each 400 metres).

By changing each of the four elements, you can plan workouts to match your ability and improve your endurance.

**6. Long, Slow Distance** For variety, double your normal jog distance and decrease your pace. You may be surprised at how far you can go.

**7. Time Trial** (only for those in good or excellent condition).

Try giving yourself a time trial every sixth or eighth week, over a one to three mile distance, to see how you are progressing. This trial must be done at sub-maximum effort and only with your doctor's permission.

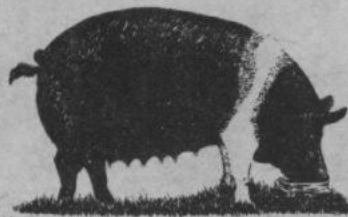

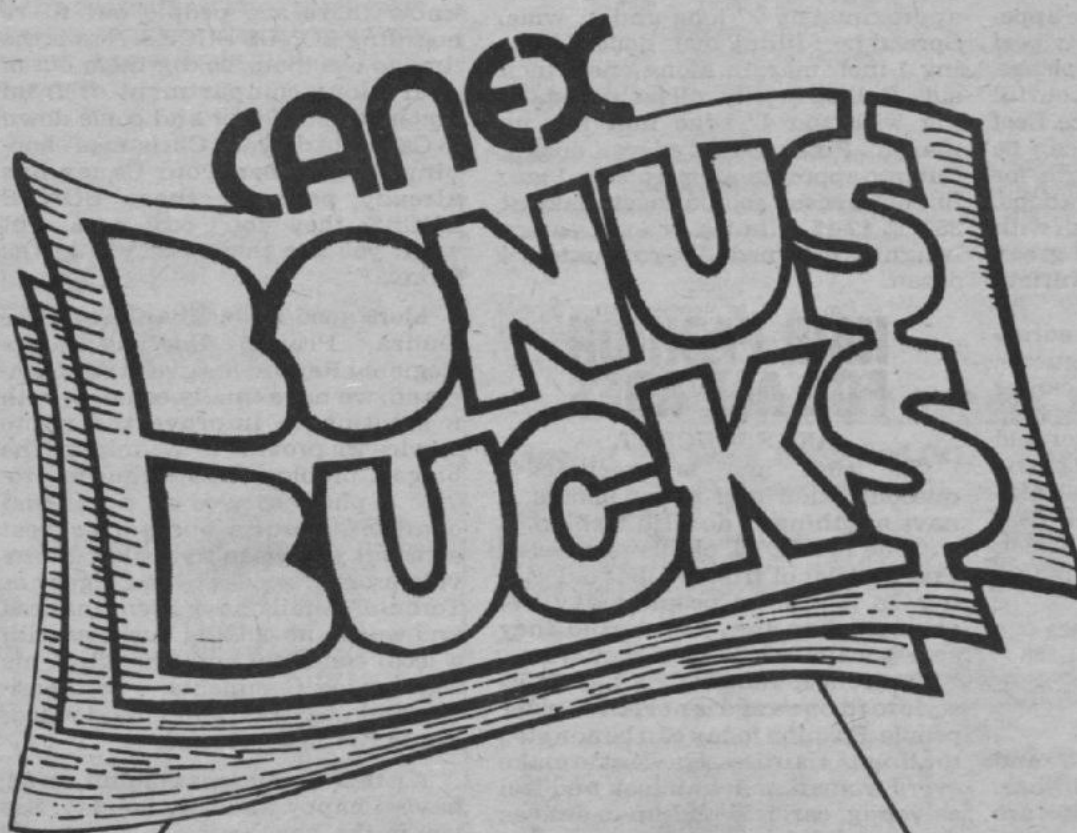

## WATCH THAT TREE

Fire can be a dangerous enemy and this is a dangerous time of year. Christmas trees and decorations are extra fire hazards, so be extra careful.

Your Fire Chief says:

"Stand your tree in water. Cut an inch or so off the base so it will absorb more. Check the water level daily. A dry tree is a double hazard. Tie it securely and keep it away from heat. Check sets of electric lights for worn insulation, broken plugs, loose bulb sockets. Throw away old sets with dried out wiring. Remember fire can start very fast. Turn off all indoor tree and decorative lights before leaving the house or retiring for the night. Do not leave tree lights on for long periods of time". So be extra careful this Christmas season. Make certain it turns out to be a truly happy one for your family and friends. Fire can spoil it so quickly.

### Corned Beef Pinwheels

2-6½ oz. cans flakes of corned beef  
½ cup mushrooms, drained, finely chopped  
2 tbsp. dill pickle, finely chopped  
1 tbsp. prepared or hot mustard  
2 pkgs. crescent dinner rolls or biscuit dough for 1 dozen biscuits

Flake corned beef finely with a fork. Combine corned beef, mushrooms, dill pickle and mustard, mixing until well blended. If using packaged dinner rolls, unroll each package to form 4 rectangles. Pinch diagonal cuts together. If using other dough, roll out to ¼-inch thickness; cut dough into 8 rectangles, each approximately 7" long and 4" wide. Spread beef filling over dough, leaving 1-inch margin along one 4-inch side. Roll up in jelly roll fashion starting with the 4" edge that has no margin. Pinch to seal edge of dough. Cut into approximately 6 pieces. Place flat on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350°F, 12-15 minutes, or until pastry is lightly browned. Approximately 4 dozen.

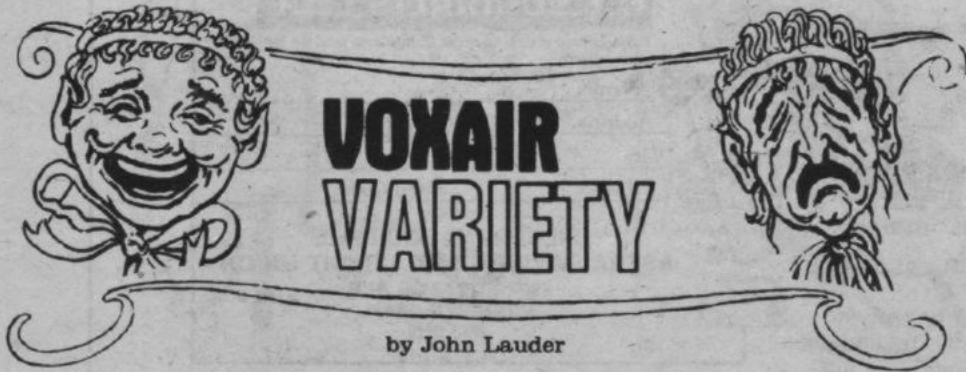
## CHRISTMAS! OH! NOEL!

Does the size of an organization govern its effectiveness? Recently, experts have been telling us that we should have conscription to bring the reserve forces up to a higher strength, but as event in Central America have demonstrated, a conscript army may not be the best.

There was a parallel in the theatrical world here a couple of weeks ago. Two productions were playing, across the street from each other; one with a cast of two, the other with 122 players plus four live horses. While both were entertaining, and incidentally both had much in the way of military overtones, the two man show was just as effective as the "cast of thousands" opera.

Thinking small was *How I Got That Story* on the Manitoba Theatre Centre Warehouse stage. It was highly successful due to several things — fine acting, tight direction, and wonderful sets, costumes and lighting. Robb Paterson as the green reporter on his first foreign assignment in Vietnam, and Alec Willows in 21 different roles, lumped together as "the historic event" were perfectly cast. Willows had to portray everything from privates to CIA men to bar girls, and made each characterization different.

There was fine direction by Don Scardine (who had created the role of the reporter on Broadway) and evokive sets and costumes by William Chesney, with lighting by Larry Isacoff. These came together in a very fine scene where the pair of actors demonstrated the crash of a bomber. Unfortunately the run of this play is now over, but if you get a chance to see it in the future, do not miss it.

\*\*\*

Also gone is the opera *Carmen*, which opened the season with fine music and staging. The story of this one is of a Corporal gone wrong for the love of a gypsy girl, and in trouble with is Captain for this and other goof-offs. (What else is new?). Joy Davidson in the title role, plus John Dodington as the Captain and Frances Ginzer as the nice village girl were excellent in both voice and action, and the chorus was strong throughout.

The use of real live horse in the parade in the fourth act was an added touch, and the scenes when it seemed the entire cast of 120 plus was on stage at the same time were well choreographed and directed. All in all, a cheerful evening.

\*\*\*

The pre-Christmas show at the Manitoba Theatre Centre Main Stage is the 1939 comedy *The Man Who Came to Dinner*. Even for those of us old enough to remember Monty Woolley in the original play and movie can enjoy this revival. Again, we have a larger than normal cast for these days, with 20 actors — some playing up to three minor parts. The fast paced direction of Dan Siretta, another ex from Broadway, and the set by Judith Lee put the play squarely into the 30s, and provide for plenty of action and antics.

The main character is a literary lion and radio star, with a mean disposition and tongue, and is well portrayed by Robert Benson. Richard Hurst as a neo Noel Coward and Lorne Kennedy as Harp Marx, along with Goldie Semple as the quintessential movie queen were loved by the first night audience, and they hammed up the parts nicely. However, the balance of the cast was also good, although there was not as much comic meat in their parts.

The play runs until December 18th.

Kazuhiro Kiozumi, the new Music Director of the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, has arrived in town under a blare of hype. It is hoped this young musician can live up to his publicity, as the Symphony needs a shot in the arm. While he directed the orchestra on December 3rd and 4th, the Symphony will give a number of concerts later in the month with guests. On the 10th and 11th the conductor is Yoel Levi, and the 12th Don Harron will appear, and on the 17th to 19th there will be a Christmas Fantasy with David Grey in charge.

# RENDEZVOUS 83

RENDEZVOUS 83 will be preceded by RITE SIMPLE X, a command post exercise scheduled to take place at Canadian Forces Base Petawawa 22 November to 3 December, 1982. RITE SIMPLE X will prove the scenario, plans and procedures which will be practiced during RENDEZVOUS 83.

Lieutenant-General Charles Belzile, the Commander of Mobile Command, has overall responsibility for both exercises. Each will provide participants with the opportunity to practice the warning procedure, movement and employment of the Canadian Air/Sea Transportable Brigade Group (CAST Brigade Group). It is the army formation which Canada has allocated for commitment to NATO as part of the Alliance's force for the defence of Northern Norway.

The CAST Brigade Group is a composite formation built mainly around the Headquarters Special Service Force from Canadian Forces Base Petawawa. It is commanded by Brigadier-General R.I. Stewart.

During RENDEZVOUS 83, the CAST Brigade Group will include the following units or unit elements:

- 8th Canadian Hussars;
- First Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry;
- Second Battalion, Royal 22e Regiment;
- Second and Third Regiments Royal Canadian Horse Artillery;
- Special Service Force Headquarters and Signal Squadron;
- First and Second Combat Engineer Regiments;
- First and Second Service Battalions;
- First and Second Field Ambulance;
- Second Military Police Platoon; and
- The Cast Composite Helicopter Squadron.

The First Canadian Brigade Group, commanded by Brigadier-General J.L. Sharpe, along with elements of the Canadian Airborne Regiment from CFB Petawawa, is the other formation dedicated to RENDEZVOUS 83. It will provide the enemy force, most of the support organization and umpires for the exercise.

Also participating will be fighter aircraft from Fighter Group of Air Command.

The first "rendezvous" exercise was held at CFB Gagetown, N.B. in 1981. By comparison, RENDEZVOUS 83 will be conducted on a reduced scale. Much of the scheduled training is routine brigade-level activity which would normally have been conducted at other locations across the country but, will now be combined with other training at Wainwright as part of RENDEZVOUS 83.

The exercise director and divisional commander for RENDEZVOUS 83 is Major-General D.R. Baker. In this capacity he will head the major Mobile Command training activity planned for 1983. RENDEZVOUS 83 is the culmination of a two-year training cycle.

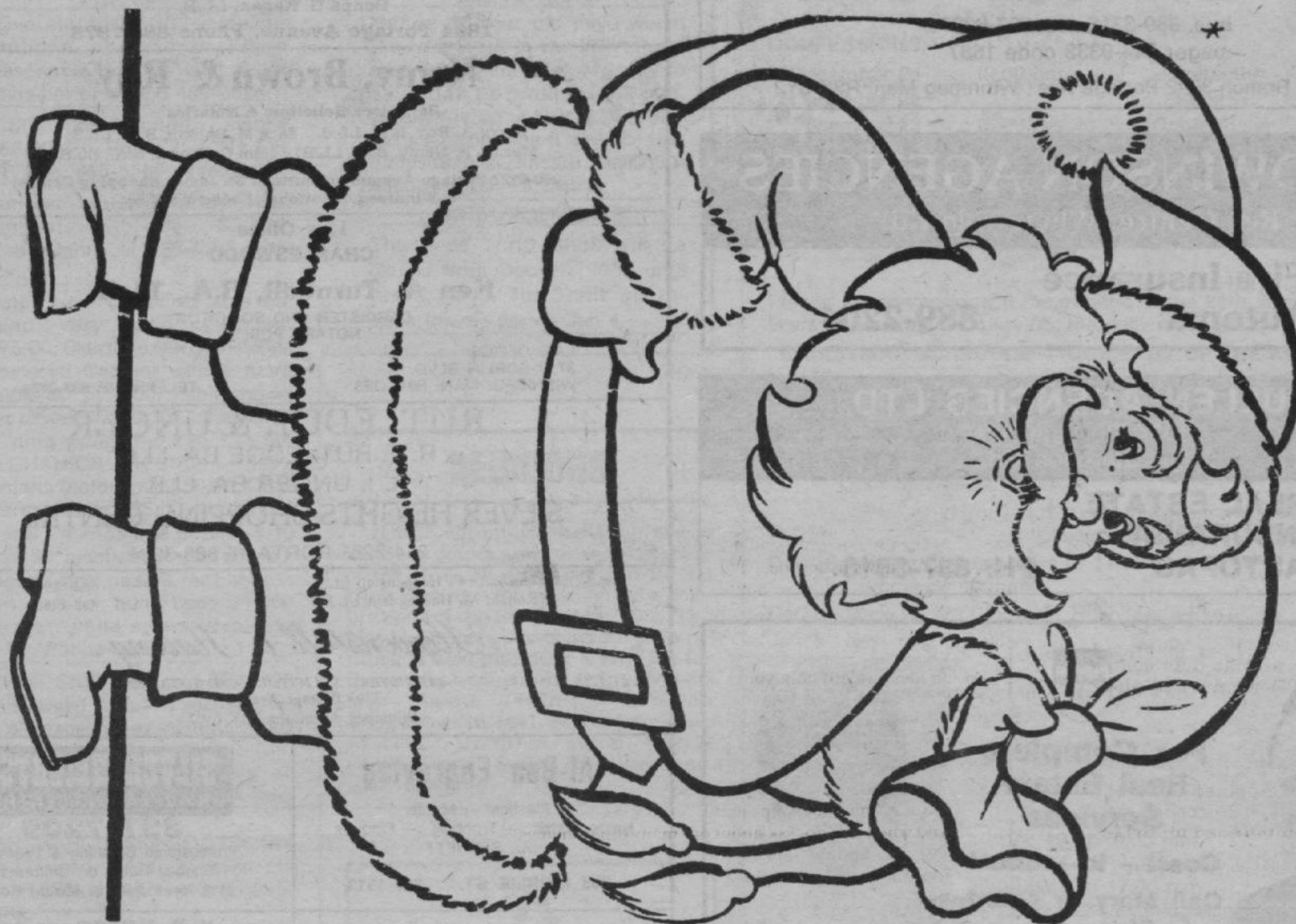
