WINNIPEG — If advance interest across the country counts, a unique record pressed in Toronto in June will be a hotly sought-after item.

It's the Air Command Band's "Pop and Circumstance", cut to mark two historical anniversaries in Canadian aviation. They are the 60th birthday of the RCAF and the 75th anniversary of powered flight in the British Commonwealth, at Baddeck, N.S., both being celebrated this year.

Officials say they are surprised at the number of inquiries so far from wide-spread interests, including air shows across the country and TV and radio outlets.

Because mementos and assorted bric-a-brac of military life rarely are prized to any degree until service careers come to an end, they are delighted with the response to what likely is to become a collector's item.

The limited edition, long-playing disc was produced by digital recording facilities, most modern technique in use today. It was cut in Toronto in late April and early May at McClear Place Recording and Mastering Studios, and pressed by CBS Special Products.

No off-the-shelf buys

But you won't find the new hit at commercial music counters. They will be available directly from the Air Command Band in Winnipeg, through CANEX outlets, units, the RCAF Association, and through personal orders. Records will be available for distribution in mid-June.

The band will also be marketing them at performances such as air shows, exhibitions, concerts, dances and the like until the end of 1984.

Volume discounts are available to bases and stations. Cost will range between \$4.05 and \$9.00, depending on quantities ordered.

Only 5,000 copies are being produced, but demand may dictate the requirement for another pressing.

It's the first record to be produced by the Band. Selections include the RCAF March Past; The RCAF, 1924-64; the RCAF, 1964-84; and the Airmen's Prayer, sung by RCAF Association member, "Sammy" Sayle.

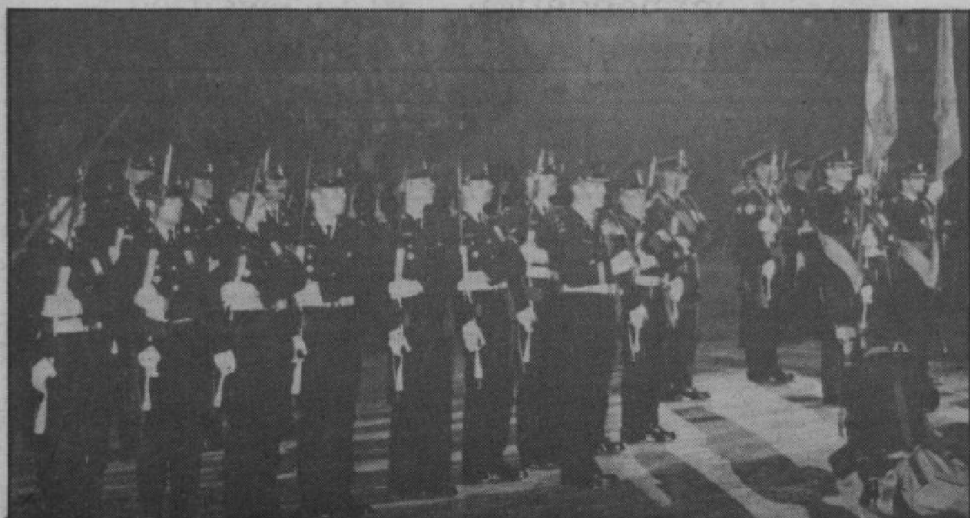
Other pieces are an Anne Murray medley, and three special arrangements by the Air Command Band, comprising "Killer Joe", Beefsteak Charlies" and "Hooked on Swing".

In Hollywood, one might receive an Oscar for acting excellence; in television an Emmy; but on May 25 the actors involved in 2 PPCLI's Farewell to the City of Winnipeg received the appreciation and applause of the viewing public.

They, the stars of the show, are soldiers of one of the most historic regiments in Canada. As members of 2 PPCLI these soldiers traced the history of the battalion through WWI, WWII, Korea, NATO and concluded with the present day battalion on parade.

The military Tattoo traces its origins to the towns and villages of 17th century Holland. It was then the custom each evening to recall British soldiers who were billeted with the townspeople, from the local inns, by marching a drummer through the streets. The drum was a warning to

the local publicans to turn off the tap which in Flemish is "Doe Den Tap Toe". This phrase became contracted by the soldiers to "Tap Toe" and eventually anglicized to "Tattoo". The custom was carried back to England and continued whenever troops were billeted with private citizens. In time the Drummer, was joined by other musicians and with the passage of time the humble "Tattoo" has developed into a military display of magnificent proportions designed to entertain audiences of many thousands.

The 2 PPCLI Tattoo, entitled "The Old Kit Bag" included performances from the Air Command Band, PPCLI Regimental Band, 2 PPCLI Corps of Drums, 3 PPCLI Corps of Drums, Winnipeg City Police Pipe Band, Edmonton City Police Pipe Band, Choir and 275 members of 2 PPCLI.

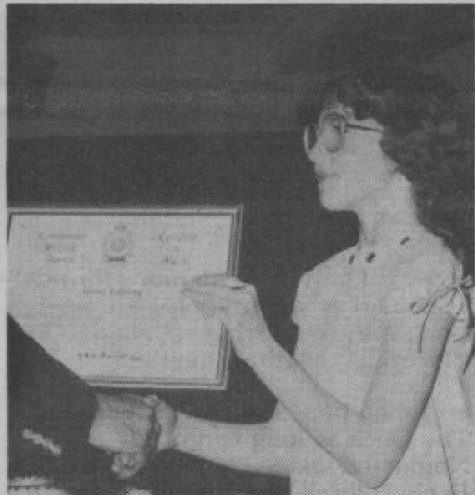

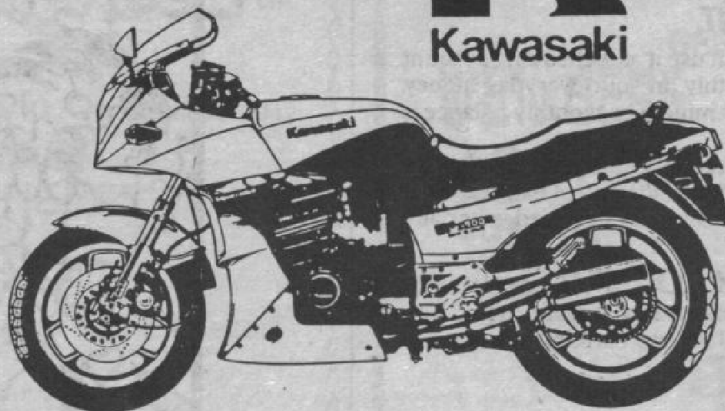

**CREATIVE JOB SEARCH TECHNIQUES
17 AND 18 JUL 84**

1. Experts agree that possibly the most difficult job you will ever have is the job of looking for a job. Upon "retirement" from the Canadian Armed Forces, the prospect of having to undertake a job search can be a scary one indeed. You are not alone in your fears. After all, most members leaving the CF have not applied for a job in over two decades. There are proven techniques available, that can be learned, which will make this undertaking much easier. Also, by acquiring these skills, your self-confidence will increase and anxieties decrease. The skills are known as "Creative Job Search Techniques".

2. A Creative Job Search Techniques Workshop will be conducted for 1-1/2 days on 17 and 18 Jul 84. The location is the Hercules Lounge in Bldg 90 (Recreation Complex), from 0900 to 1600 hrs on 17 Jul 84 and 0900 to 1200 on 18 Jul 84. The workshop will cover such topics as information interviewing, job market information, networking, the job interview and a review on resume writing. Y.T.E.P. PROGRAM GROWING

OTTAWA — Defence Minister Jean-Jacques Blais has announced that the Canadian Forces Youth Training and Employment Program (YTEP) has been enlarged with an additional \$8.5 million that will allow 1,000 youths to receive the training and work experience they need to find a permanent job.

The Department of National Defence is already participating in several government employment initiatives. This increased YTEP funding complements earlier efforts and is made possible through the \$150 million Youth Opportunity Fund announced in the February budget. Starting in late June, 1,000 young

men and women will benefit from an average of six months full time training and service with the Regular Force. In addition to basic military training, emphasis will be on the acquisition of useful skills applicable to the civilian work force. Training will be provided in 24 specialities ranging from vehicle mechanic and cook to medical assistant and finance clerk. The program runs to March 1985.

Although they will not be required to undergo further military training after graduation from the program, participants will be enrolled in the Supplementary Reserves for two years.

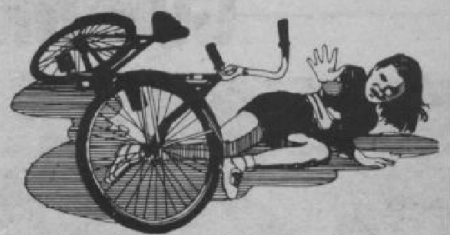

CFB CATHAM TO STAY OPEN

CHATHAM, N.B. — Defence Minister Jean-Jacques Blais has announced new government initiatives that will help secure the future of CFB Chatham and improve the economic prospects of the Miramichi region.

At a news conference here today, Mr. Blais, flanked by Northumberland-Miramichi MP Maurice Dionne, stated that the Canadian Forces low-level air defence training school and a new air defence battery for the Canadian Air/Sea Transportable (CAST) brigade group will be established at CFB Chatham.

The defence minister also confirmed that DND's Directorate of Pay Services (DPS) will be transferred to Chatham. Start-up construction costs for the DPS building and associated expenditures to the infrastructure of the base are estimated to be approximately \$45 million. The restructuring of CFB Chatham will mean increased civilian employment for the Miramichi area. Mr. Blais said "... we can expect to see between 1370 and 1475 jobs in and related to DND activity in the Chatham area by 1988...

These jobs and the activity they represent means that my department's activities here will be pumping a lot of new money into the economy of this region".

Existing military facilities in the Chatham area such as number 3 Field Technical Training Unit (3FTTU), the Tracadie gunnery range and the St-Margaret's satellite identification and tracking unit will remain.

Mr. Blais stated that this announcement was consistent with repeated assurances that the federal government would not walk away from its responsibilities associated with the restructuring of the base. "CFB Chatham is here to stay," he said.

PHOTO HINTS

KEEP IT SIMPLE

The smart photographer knows the secret of getting great holiday pictures: keep it simple. Eliminate everything in the photograph that doesn't reinforce the single idea behind the picture. A shot of a friend, a flower or a scenic doesn't need a cluttered background to be appealing. Move in close, recompose the image or find a different shooting angle that will hide or avoid the clutter.

Use camera controls such as selective focus or a different lens to obscure unsightly elements that detract from the image. Stick to one color scheme rather than shooting a riot of conflict-

ing colors. Avoid confusing patterns; the simpler the design of the lines, shapes and patterns that make up the image, the more effective it will be.



Equally important to obtain fine pictures is to keep your photo equipment simple. A complex camera that you're not comfortable with could quickly take the joy out of holiday picture taking. Try a simple-to-use instant camera with automatic sonar focusing and has built-in automatic flash control. A camera that doesn't have to be fussed with will allow you greater freedom to concentrate on making exciting pictures and enjoying yourself!

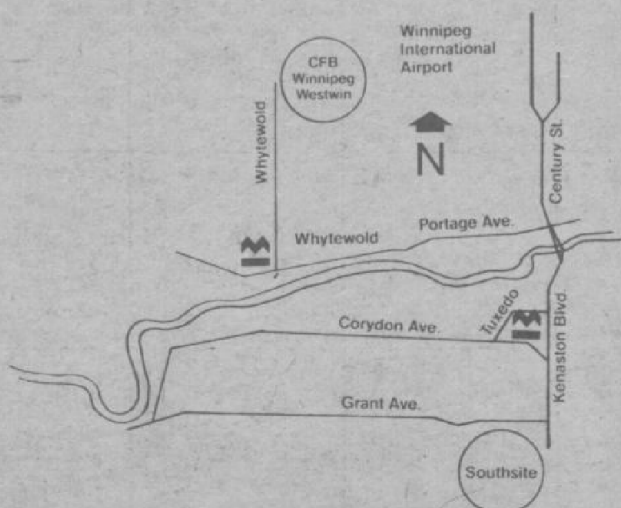
