WINNIPEG — How much you know about the new base telephone system probably reflects the amount of use you make of Alexander Graham Bell's revenge.

For those who daily faced the frustrations of getting access lines to NDHQ, commands, bases and stations, the "call again" feature alone is worth the cost of conversion to the SL1 EPABX. That's telephone language for the state of the art switchboard which replaced the vintage equipment used at Winnipeg since 1954.

Inertia appears to be the only snag since the introduction of the new system according to base telecom staff. Construction on the annex to base headquarters to house the equipment; site surveys of user needs; training seminars for section reps; and the cut-over on March 30 all proceeded smoothly. Smoothly, that is, with the possible exception of an airfield emergency which occurred minutes after some essential lines had been changed and others hadn't.

Inertia isn't new. Rumour has it that it was invented by an AC2 when some wise guy tried to alter the pitch on propellers without replacing them. But it is counterproductive.

Telecom staff say most of the complaints received about the new system amount to user unfamiliarity with the equipment. And, where the system doesn't fit the need there's flexibility. But don't look for a status symbol, they say. Make your case on paper and if you can satisfy yourself that the need is genuine, chances are the B Tel O will buy it, . . . or rent it.

Each standard handset goes for about \$5.00 per month while the fancy models run \$11.00 or more and that cost comes out of the base budget. The standard set gives you features like: call transfer; call park; permanent park; and call again. These are explained in the booklets provided to sections and your section "group leader" can explain them to you.

Air Cadet League Elects New President

Walter A. Mildren, of Winnipeg, Manitoba was today elected National President of the Air Cadet League of Canada, succeeding Mr. J.G. McKeachie of Vancouver, British Columbia. The election was held in conjunction with the 43rd Annual Meeting of the League held at the Richmond Inn, B.C.

Mr. Mildren has been associated with the Air Cadet movement since 1947, when he enrolled as an instructor with 220 Red River Squadron. He has since held a succession of League offices, including Chairman of the Manitoba Provincial Committee; Director of the League's National Board; Member of the National Executive Committee and recently as a National Vice-President.

Mr. G.A. "Sandy" Coffey of Carlyle, Saskatchewan, a director of the Air Cadet League of Canada, was tonight presented with a Canadian Forces Scroll as the League's "Director of the Year" by Major General D. McNaughton, Deputy Commander of Air Command, at the League's Annual Dinner held at the Richmond Inn, British Columbia.

The accompanying citation stated, in part, that Mr. Coffey, a former Air Cadet, became active with the Air Cadet movement in 1964 when he became active on the sponsoring committee of 723 Moose Mountain Squadron.

Since that time, he has been a dedicated worker for Air Cadets, on both the provincial and national levels of the organization. His outstanding contributions to the Air Cadet movement were recognized in 1983 when he was elected as a member of the League's National Executive Committee.

Total	\$52.00

My eight year old found them completely boring. Enough is enough. However, one last parting shot. The Red River Exhibition is supposed to foster family entertainment and a sense of pride in Winnipeg. VOXAIR VARIETY

The Iran-Iraq war has brought once again into prominence the ancient city of Baghdad. Fortunately, although this city is the location for the current Rainbow Stage musical, *Kismet*, the show is laid in happier times, the 14th century. In case you are a newcomer, Rainbow Stage is Canada's oldest and biggest outdoor theatre (it has a roof, but the mosquitoes can get in) and is located in Kildonan Park, way out north on Main Street.

With a cast of 55, who wear some 180 different costumes, sets to show palaces with golden minarets as well as the din and dust of the street bazaars, this is one of the most opulent spectacles ever presented by Rainbow Stage in its 30 years of production.

The history of the show is almost as long as that of the city of Baghdad. First produced as a straight play in 1911, it was later made into a musical, and then three times as a movie, plus one effort as a TV special. Such stars as Ronald Coleman, Marlene Dietrich, Loretta Young, Howard Keel, Vic Damone, Joze Ferrer and Barbara Eden have played the lead roles over the years.

Memorable songs include Baubles, Bangles, and Beads, This is My Beloved, and Stranger in Paradise. The story is that of a begger-poet who twists fate to become the Emir of Baghdad in one miraculous day, and of his adventures which result from this turn of luck.

Not timed with VOXAIR in mind, the play opened on July 3rd (deadline date for this issue) and will close on July 21st — before the next issue comes out. However, you do not need a review from me as these musicals are always well done. Tickets are in the range from \$4.75 to \$8.00, with discounts for children under 14 if accompanied by an adult. They can be obtained at the usual outlets and also at the Park on show nights.

If you want to be real cheap, arrange to be born in 1954 in the period July 5th to 21st. On your 30th birthday you can be admitted absolutely free by showing your birth certificate to the Box Office at the Park.

Incidentally, the next show will be *Fiddler on the Roof*, and tickets for it can be bought now. Dates of this run are August 7 to 25th.

FIRE PREVENTION NEWS

A fire is no fun . . . but practising fire safety really can be. Here are some fire safety rules that the whole family can practise together.

a. Plan two escape routes from every room. It is important. Fire often blocks a door or a window, but you will not lose a minute if you have planned two different ways from each room.

b. Practise home fire drills. Planning and thinking about what you will do in case of an emergency is really not enough. You have to practise escaping, each and every member of the family, and meeting in a pre-planned place outside and away from the house where you can count noses and see that one and all are safe.

c. When cooking outdoors, the following precautions should always be taken:

- Keep flammable liquids away from live coals to avoid explosions and burns; keep children safely away from the barbecue fire.
- Use charcoal electric starter of an approved type or chemicals in cake form to start your charcoal fire; never use gasoline, naphtha or other such flammable materials.
- Never add fire starter after you have started your barbecue; to speed a slow fire rekindle a dying one, tuck dry kindling under charcoals.
- Make sure the barbecue stand is level and steady; keep a water container handy nearby when the charcoal is burning.
- When the cooking is over, soak the coals so to prevent their reignition; never keep damp or wet charcoals in an unventilated area due to the dangers of spontaneous combustion that can result from drying.

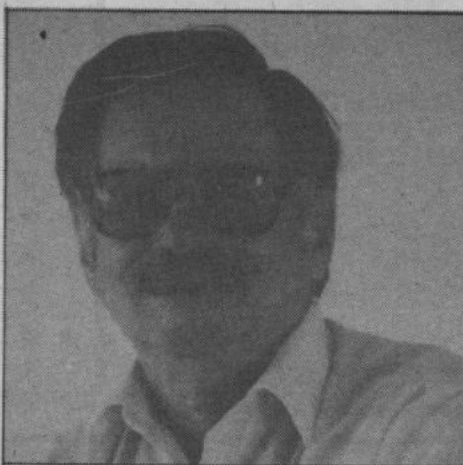
Plaque Returned Home

And, he says, VOLANT RODEO specifically tests the ability of Air Transport Group to operate in a tactical role for extended periods, anywhere in the world.

Gen. Garland says: "Air Transport Group has participated in this event for the past four years, and our personnel have found the competition very demanding.

"The team has been training extremely hard for these arduous events. We look forward to bringing home the gold."

The exercise ends with an awards ceremony June 22.

O & E Says → Farewell To Friends

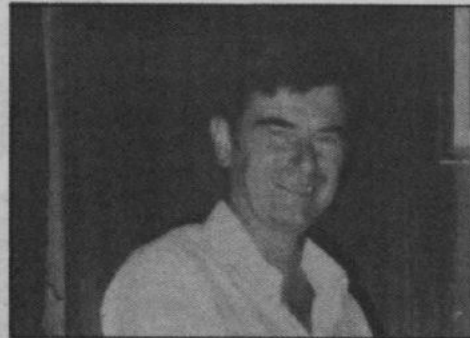

PHOTO HINTS

ADD LIGHT TO YOUR SUBJECT

Existing light on a brilliantly sunny day may cause a photographer's portrait subjects to squint or have dark cavities where their eyes should be. Using a reflector, for example, a piece of white card or newspaper held in front of the subject, will eliminate the problem by reflecting sunlight up into the subject's face.

Another solution is to use a low power flash to provide fill lighting. Some cameras have built-in flash units that automatically compensate for the brightness so that you won't overexpose the subject with flash. "Sun" cameras offer an effective means of automatically modulating the amount of flash to match the existing light for effortless fill flash lighting.

Flash or additional tungsten lights are useful if you want to photograph indoors, especially at night. You'll



need different films to record colors accurately with each type of lighting you use.

If one light is not enough, add a second flash unit attached to an inexpensive slave unit that triggers the flash when the main flash on your camera goes off.

By adding illumination and controlling the quality and direction of light in your pictures, you will attain more artistic and pleasing photographs!

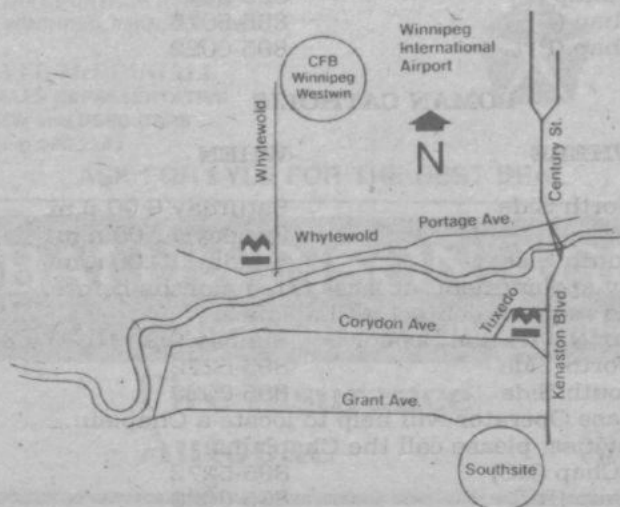
