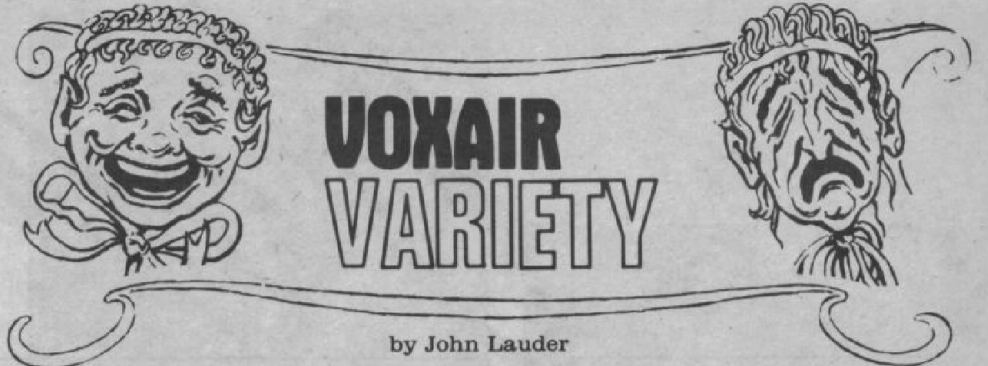

'Night Mother is a rather black and bleak play for this season of jolly and joy. Mr. Scrooge, of Dickens' fame, is normally the worst kind of person we associate with this time of year, and he can be rehabilitated by a few bad dreams. However, this play, now running at the MTC Warehouse Theatre, is a downer all the way. It deals with two losers, a mother and daughter, who discuss life and self-destruction for the full length of the show.

The play won a Pulitzer prize when it recently ran on Broadway. This prize is supposed to be given to those "which shall represent in marked fashion the educational value and power of the stage." Agreed, there is power on the stage in the discussion of deep dark topics, but the educational value for me was mainly that one should not keep guns in the house if your family is suicidal.

Fine acting by the two girls imported from the Maritimes, Nicola Liman as the Daughter, and Joan Orenstein as the Mother, and tight direction from Linda Moore, also from N.S. The play runs until Dec. 15th, and is a worthwhile experience, but do not expect to come out full of gladness and joy. To get this kind of feeling you must go across the street to the Centennial Concert Hall, as noted below.

For the rest of the month the Winnipeg Symphony and Royal Winnipeg Ballet take over the Concert Hall to celebrate the Christmas Season to the full. On Dec. 14th, 15th and 16th the Symphony will offer Handel's **Messiah**, the great oratorio based on the life of Christ. Kazuhiro Koizumi will conduct, with support from the Winnipeg Philharmonic Choir and soloists, Stephanie Bogle, soprano, Martha Graham, alto, Paul Frey, tenor and Bruce Kelly, baritone. Curtain time is 8 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, and 2 p.m. on Sunday.

Then on the following week the popular Christmas music will get a three concert run. This is on Friday, December 21st at 8 p.m. and on Saturday, the 22nd, at 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. Here, conductor Eric Kunzel, with Santa Clause himself as a guest, will lead the orchestra through such favourites as Skater's Waltz, White Christmas, March of the Toys and a series of Sleigh Ride songs. There will be a sing-along of carols to wind things up.

On Boxing Day the Ballet will move into the Hall, and offer performances until the 30th. This will feature the premier of "Facade" and new British ballet, plus "Magnificat" and excerpts from "Sleeping Beauty". Show time is at 2 and 8 p.m. on the 26th and 29th, 8 p.m. on the 27th and 28th, and a 2 p.m. on the 30th.

They are also celebrating the festive season at the Gas Station Theatre on Osborne Street. Bill Evans and Friends will perform contemporary dance this week-end on Friday and Saturday at 8, while on Sunday the Academy of Dance will offer A Christmas Fantasy for two shows, at 2 and 7:30 p.m. Then beginning on December 22nd and running to January 6th (no show on Christmas Day) the Prairie Theatre Exchange will give us a new look at Christmas. This is based on the book by artist William Kurelek, and includes story, music and dance. As show times vary from day to day, it is best to check with newspaper ads, or call 942-7291 for info. Tickets are only \$4.00 each.

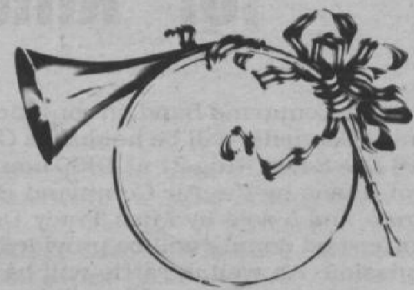

UN MESSAGE DE NOEL DU COMMANDANT, COMMANDEMENT AERIEN

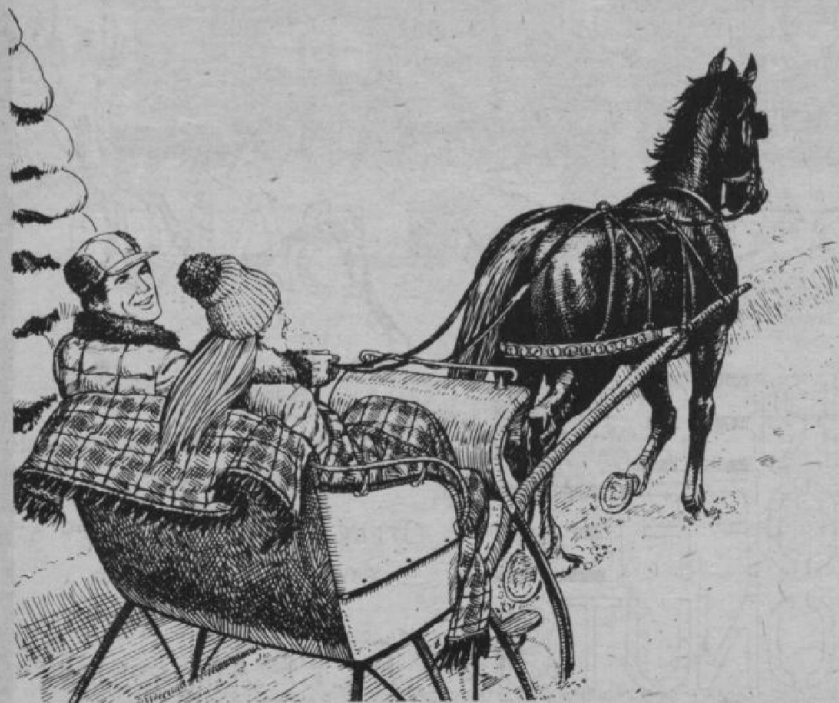

NOTICE CANEX, - AUTHORIZED PATRONS

Only authorized patrons shall be entitled to Exchange privileges. All purchases from an Exchange shall be for the use of the patrons, their dependants as authorized in the following paragraphs, or as a bona fide gift.

Authorized patrons shall be:

- a. members of the Regular Force and their dependants;
- b. members of the RCMP and their dependants;
- c. members of the Reserve Force;
- d. public servants and their dependants, including casual employees and civilian employees under full-time contract to DND, who are resident or employed on a base or other element of DND;
- e. former members of the Canadian Forces in receipt of an annuity under the CFSA, DSPCA or a pension under the Pension Act or War Veterans Allowance Act, and their dependants;
- f. widows and their dependants of Canadian Forces personnel receiving a benefit under the CFSA, DSPCA, the Pension Act or the War Veterans Allowance Act;
- g. former civilian employees of DND in receipt of pension on behalf of their DND service, and their dependants;
- h. dependants of members of the Reserve Force when the member is on full-time service;
- j. foreign military personnel on duty with or visiting the Canadian Forces, and their dependants;
- k. members of the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires, or other security force when residing or employed on a base, and their dependants;
- m. DND school teachers and their dependants;
- n. NPF employees and their dependants;
- p. former NPF employees in receipt of a pension on behalf of their NPF service, and their dependants; and
- r. former members of the Forces who served on active service in the naval, army or air forces raised in Canada during time of war.

Commander Garneau Visits CFB Winnipeg

WESTWIN, Man. — Canada's first Astronaut, Commander Marc Garneau, recently added his name to an already impressive list of VIP visitors to CFB Winnipeg during 1984.

Cdr. Garneau, along with Astronaut Doctor Robert Thirsk (back-up for his October flight) spent a full day at Air Command/CFB Winnipeg telling Canadian Forces personnel about Canada's role in the space program in general and his flight aboard the Space Shuttle DISCOVERY in particular. The visit to CFB Winnipeg was one of several stops on their cross-country tour, sponsored by the National Research Council.

While at CFB Winnipeg, Cdr. Garneau addressed over 550 military personnel and civilian employees. He provided a graphic account of his historic space "voyage", which took place from 5-13 October, and, along with Dr. Thirsk, explained the astronauts' selection process and training program.

At a luncheon hosted by Major General Donald McNaughton, Deputy Commander of Air Command and Colonel Stewart McGowan, Base Commander CFB Winnipeg, Cdr Garneau was named the first "Honorary Member" of Air Command. In return, he presented Air Command with a memento of his flight.

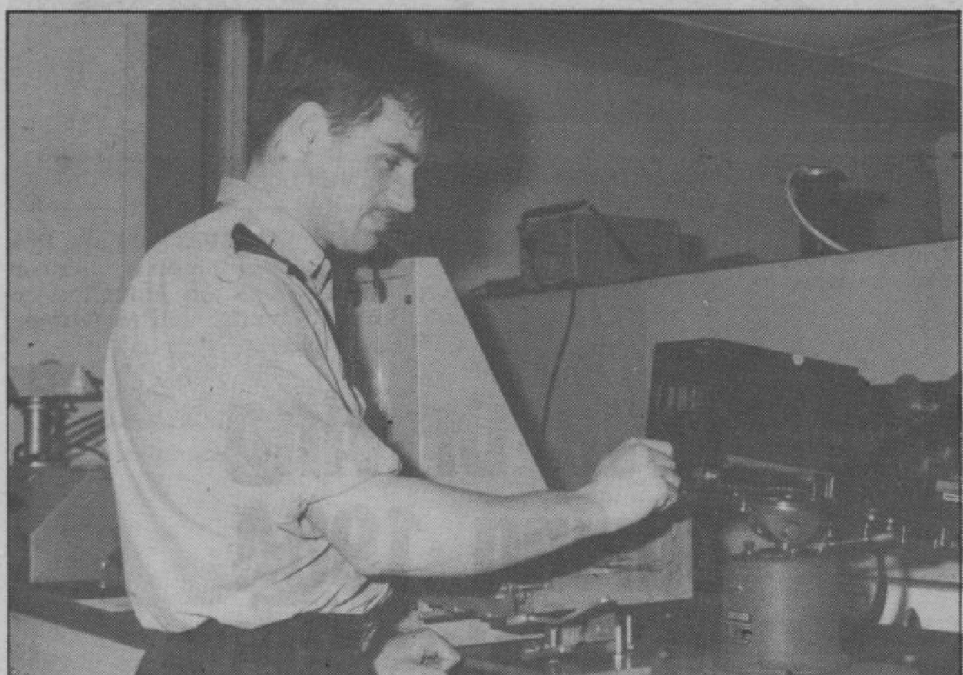
"For Professionalism"
