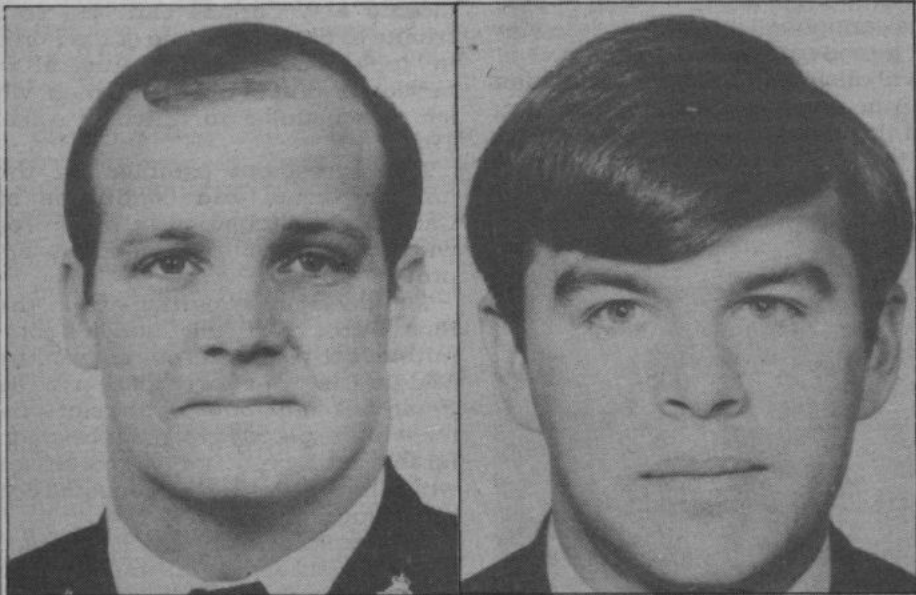

**CAPT. DAVE MAHAFFEY**

429 (T) Sqn mourns the loss of two Squadron members who lost their lives in the tragic crash of the two CC130 aircraft at CFB Edmonton on 29 March 85.

Capt John Thornton was born in Ottawa, Ontario, on 12 May 1955. He joined the CF in Aug 73 and served in Portage la Prairie, Moose Jaw and Winnipeg. He is survived by his wife, Allison, and daughter Sarah.

Capt Dave Mahaffey was born in Montreal, Quebec, on 18 Apr 1958. He joined the CF in Mar 80 and served in Portage la Prairie, Moose Jaw and Winnipeg. He is survived by his wife, Mireille.

The Thornton family has requested that those wishing to do so may make donations to the Zion Church Organ Memorial Fund, Zion United Church, Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, or to a charity of the donor's choice.

The Mahaffey family has established a trust fund for the twins expected later this month. Contributors may make donations at any branch of Canada Permanent Trust to "The Mahaffey Childrens Fund," Account number 2759939S01. The Mahaffey family will be advised of all donations.

Plans are being made for a dedication service for Captains Thornton and Mahaffey sometime during the summer. Information will be available when details have been finalized.

## "Iron Annie" back - with Assist. from 402 Squadron

WINNIPEG — "Iron Annie," this country's famed flying boxcar of half a century ago, re-appeared in all its restored glory last Saturday afternoon, April 13, at the Western Canada Aviation Museum, after a 36-year absence from Canadian skies.

It's a German Junkers-52 single-engine transport, converted from a tri-motor model to commemorate its likeness that roared over Canada's northland as a freighter in the 1930-40 era. It's the only one of its species in the world.

The refurbished "Annie" was built under licence in Madrid, Spain, 33 years ago for the Spanish Air Force. Before it was sold to a museum in Orlando, Florida, it was featured in a Geraldine Chapman movie.

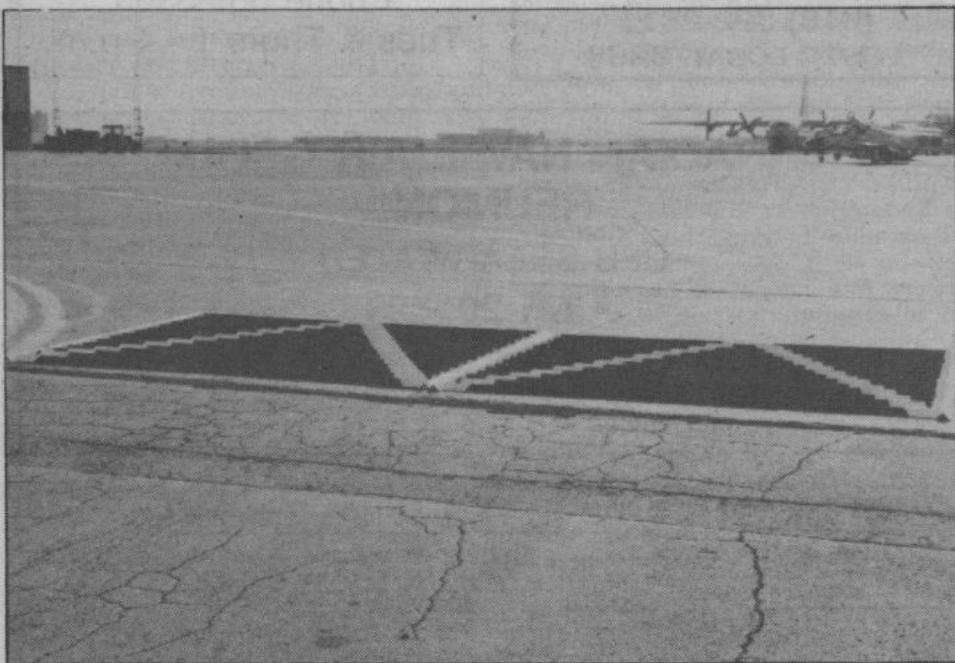
The original, single-engine JU-52, one of only six built, was bought in October, 1931, 53 years ago, by the late James A. Richardson of Winnipeg for service with Canadian Airways Ltd., now Canadian Pacific Airlines. It was the largest single-engine aircraft in Canada. Some say it still is.

Records indicate that one typical cargo destined for northern Canada included four oxen, eight horses, a Diesel-engine shovel, a 20-foot boat and major parts of 11 tractors.

Attending the formal induction into the Western Canada Aviation Museum was George T. Richardson of Winnipeg. His firm, James A. Richardson and Sons, provided a grant of \$200,000. to buy it from its Florida owner, ferry it to Winnipeg in early 1982 and finance the conversion and restoration.

# 402 Squadron at roll-out

On hand for the ceremony were some members of the nine-man crew who flew the CF-ARM Junkers and DC-3 mother ship from Florida to Winnipeg, June 5, 1982. All were members of the 402 Air Reserve Squadron, led by their then commanding officer, Lieutenant-Colonel Malcolm S. Joyce, as pilot, an aviation safety specialist with the federal Ministry of Transport.

Made of corrugated aluminum, it is described as a full canti-lever monoplane for operation on floats, wheels or skis. It has a liquid-cooled engine swinging a four-bladed wooden propeller of 13-1/2 feet diameter. It was the German equivalent of the North American DC-2 and DC-3 aircraft.

The original Canadian-owned Junkers, carrying the registration CF-ARM, was scrapped in 1943 because the Second World War stopped the flow of spare parts. Only the floats of the original CF-ARM remain today. They belong to the Western Canada Aviation Museum and are to be on display.

The Junkers-52 went on, as the three-engine version, to serve as an airliner, freighter, bomber, glider tug and paratroop transport during its lengthy career, which extended to 30 countries. Some sources say it served on opposing sides during the Second World War.

The three-engine version was exported to many parts of the world, but none flew commercially in North America. Only one single-engine Junkers-52 did, CF-ARM. Its replica now is in the collection of the Winnipeg Museum.

"Iron Annie's" impressive dimensions and other features list the weight as 7-1/2 tons; a wing span of 96 feet, nine inches; length of 60 feet and a height of 20 feet, eight inches. Its cruise speed is 120 m.p.h., range is 932 miles, and it's powered by an 830 h.p. Rolls Royce Buzzard engine.

# Yo-ho-ho and a — Tot of rum

HALIFAX — When the daily issue of rum was abolished March 31, 1972, a naval tradition which had lasted some three hundred years ended. From the days of wooden ships and iron men the daily "tot," a ration of rum, was issued to officers and men alike. The daily tot was first introduced into the Royal Navy in 1655 as a substitute for beer or wine.

This tradition began out of need. Fresh water carried in casks on early ships soon became brackish and unpalatable and in the 15th century beer and wine were used as substitutes. The normal ration was a gallon per man per day. Sir Martin Frobisher (1535-1594), of North-West passage fame, was known to have said, "We will sail as long as the beer lasts."

### Two pints per man per day

Shortages of stowage space, a problem even in modern warships, led to the introduction of rum in the 17th century. The usual daily ration of rum was a pint for a man and a half-pint for a boy seaman, issued twice a day, at lunch and at supper. In 1824, when tea became common in the British navy, the supper ration was discontinued.

From 1655 throughout the 19th century, shipboard life was difficult and the daily issue of rum probably made life more bearable. However, the demands of the old navy differed widely from those of today's navy. For example, the mental alertness needed to load a cannonball into a muzzle loader was far less than that required to operate a modern weapons system.

The issuance of rum on a daily basis was abolished in the Royal Canadian Navy in 1972. The daily issue was discontinued as a new system involving bar facilities aboard ships was established throughout the fleet. Men were simply far more efficient without the daily tot. In a highly technical navy no risk of error, which might be attributable to rum, could be allowed.

# Canada Going Back To The Sinai

Prime Minister Brian Mulroney announced April 11 that, in response to requests from the Governments of Egypt and Israel, and subject to the successful negotiation of an agreement which adequately meets essential Canadian interests, the Government has decided in principle that Canada will participate in the Multinational Force and Observers (MFO) based in the Sinai Peninsula.

The Departments concerned are exploring how Canada can best contribute to the functioning of the Force in replacement of the Australian helicopter unit of about 100 men, which is scheduled to retire in April, 1986.

The agreement establishing the nature, terms and conditions of Canada's participation in the Force will be submitted to Cabinet for its approval.

The decision to participate in the Sinai Force reaffirms Canada's commitment to peace and stability in the Middle East. Our participation in the Force will contribute to the reinforcement of the peace agreement between Israel and Egypt, the two countries which have specifically requested our contribution.

We firmly believe that this peace treaty, based as it is on the principle enshrined in Security Council Resolution 242, envisaging Israel's withdrawal from territories occupied in 1967 in exchange for peace, stands as testimony to what can be accomplished in that region when the political will exists on both sides.

It is Canada's hope that recent developments in the region will lead to direct negotiation among other parties so that the treaty between Egypt and Israel will be followed by progress toward comprehensive peace in the area.

# Scan Corner Look Forward to Your Retirement

Looking forward to retirement? A surprising number of service-people have mixed feelings about this question. Change of any kind is unsettling, but retirement from the Forces involves both uncertainty and a good deal of anxiety.

Perhaps you recognize the symptoms. Thoughts about retirement are postponed to the very last moment. Talk with friends about retirement is avoided and in some cases spouses and families are excluded from your retirement thoughts. Anxiety builds up and too often retirement becomes a fearful event rather than a new and exciting challenge.

Common sense tells us that this is the wrong approach. Obviously, along with the administrative preparation required for retirement after a number of service years, the problem of anxiety must be faced.

The best tonic for the emotional let-down of retirement is early planning and preparation. Early planning involves setting work goals, thinking of training and experience in civilian, rather than military terms, settling the question of location, considering the employment market and finally, adding up all the pluses and minuses. Once the problems are out of the way the job campaign can start with real interests and vigor.

Here is a recent example: An accounts-trained senior NCO stationed at a large base was close to retirement. He investigated the employment market in the nearest town very carefully. The Canada Employment Centre told him about a new industry moving into the town and arranged an interview. The job, however, was not available for six months, but he was tentatively selected. Finally, he followed the advice of his firm and enrolled in a night school course to up-date his knowledge of civilian accounting procedures.

This senior NCO was looking forward to his retirement.

## What Experts Recommend For Fitness

Good health is a feeling of total well being — that means physically, psychologically and emotionally.

Nutrition plays an important part in good health because it affects your skin, teeth, eyes, hair and overall appearance, as well as your personality, behaviour, working potential and general outlook on life.

How can you have a fit food style? by following Canada's Food Guide!

### What is Canada's Food Guide?

Canada's Food Guide is designed as a pattern of eating, not a rigid set of rules. By following it, you can obtain enough of the more than 50 nutrients needed by your body every day for optimum health. The guide stipulates the minimum number and size of servings to be selected daily from each of the four food groups. They are:

- (1) two servings of milk and milk products;
- (2) three to five servings of breads and cereals;
- (3) two servings of meat, fish, poultry and alternates; and
- (4) four to five servings of fruits and vegetables (include at least two vegetables).

Why is Canada's food guide divided into four food groups?

The foods in each food group supply certain key nutrients. The kinds and amounts of key nutrients that each group supplies form an interlocking pattern of good nutrition. The food groups are not interchangeable, because the nutrients that each group provides are different (eg, you get vitamin C from fruits and vegetables, but not from meat). Therefore, you cannot omit a food group or exchange it for another

group and obtain enough of all of the essential nutrients.

**Why is it important to have a variety of foods?**

It is important to choose a variety of foods within each group to ensure that you meet your body's needs for all of the essential nutrients. Although the foods in each of the four categories are grouped together because they contain the same key nutrients, each food within the group contains different amounts of these nutrients. Therefore, variety is important to ensure your vitamin and mineral needs are met.

**Is Canada's Food Guide a Weight Loss Diet?**

Yes, it can be. The basic guide supplies 1,000 to 1,400 calories per day, which will result in a gradual weight loss in most people. Choose the lower calorie foods from each group to lose weight (eg, skim or 2 per cent milk instead of ice cream). All reducing diets must follow this pattern if they are to be considered safe for prolonged periods of use. Increasing your physical activity will also help you to lose weight.

To gain weight, you can obtain extra energy (calories) by increasing the numbers and size of servings from the four food groups and/or adding other foods.

**Why should we select and prepare foods with limited amounts of fat, sugar, and salt?**

The guide recommends that you select and prepare foods with limited amounts of fat, salt and sugar to reduce the risk of such health problems as heart disease, dental cavities, diabetes melitus, obesity and high blood pressure.

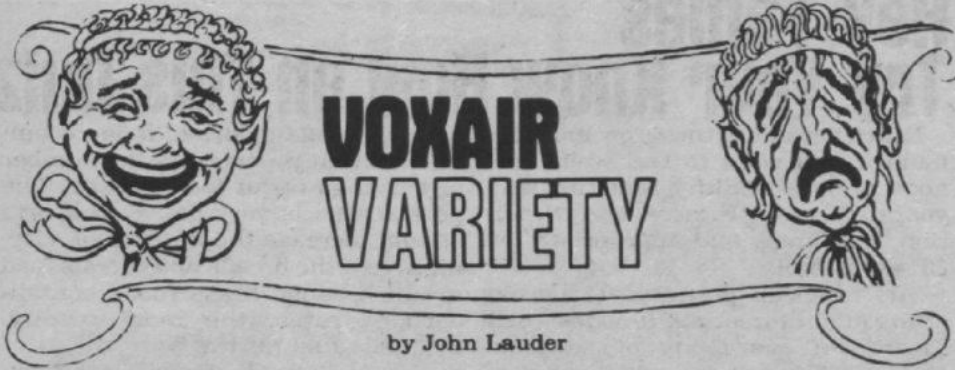

#### ANSWERS:

1. T — The sensible diet for everyone, regardless of their activity level, includes a variety of foods from each of the four food groups:

Two servings of milk and milk products, two servings of meat, fish, poultry, and alternatives, three to five servings of breads and cereals, and four to five servings of fruits and vegetables (include at least two vegetables).

To increase calories, it is recommended that you increase the number of servings of all food groups. The person who is very active in sports should increase the number of servings from the breads and cereals food group because these foods contain carbohydrates, the most readily-available fuel for the body.

2. F — Because most Canadians already eat at least twice the amount of protein they need, it is not necessary to increase protein intake. It is true that muscle strength and muscle endurance are not increased simply by eating high protein foods. As a matter of fact, additional calories from protein will be converted and stored in the body as fat.

3. F — if you are following Canada's Food Guide, vitamin and mineral supplements will not improve your athletic performance. Canada's Food Guide provides the more than 50 nutrients essential for good health.

4. T — Although studies have not proven conclusively the right and wrong foods to eat before participating in sports, your performance will probably be better if you have a meal containing larger amounts of carbohydrate foods (cereals, breads, pasta), only a moderate amount of protein and a small amount of fat. Foods that contain protein or fat take longer to digest.

5. F — Foods that are very high in sugar, such as candy bars, sugar, honey and soft drinks, can cause intestinal discomfort and early exhaustion when eaten before an athletic activity.
