Winnipeg-based CWO earns CDS commendation for Yukon project

Chief Warrant Officer Jacquélais Levesque, a CFB Winnipeg mobile support equipment operator, is one of 14 members of the Canadian Forces to be commended by the Chief of the Defence Staff, General G.C.E. Thériault, "for actions beyond the call of duty."

He was commended for volunteering his services as worksite manager, from August 1983 until July 1984, for the construction of a cadet camp at Wolf Creek near Whitehorse, Yukon.

He was responsible for hiring, supervising and directing 75 inexperienced civilian employees; ordering materials and equipment to renovate one large existing building; and constructing 16 log-cabin style barracks and various other buildings.

Despite the many problems that arose due to the isolation of the location, the inexperience of the workforce, the sub-zero temperatures and dwindling daylight, CWO Levesque ensured the successful completion of the camp.

En dépit des nombreuses difficultés qu'ont posé l'isolement géographique, le manque d'expérience des travailleurs, le grand froid et le raccourcissement des jours, l'adjudant-chef Levesque a su faire en sorte que les travaux soient menés à bien.

Greenwood reunion set for 20th anniversary of VPI

On the weekend of 13-15 June 1986, a unique event in the history of Maritime Patrol aviation will take place at CFB Greenwood, N.S. On this occasion, VP International will celebrate the 20th anniversary of the founding of the P2000 Club at 407 Squadron, Comox, B.C. in May, 1966.

VP International traces its origin to the P-2000 Club. The objective of VP International is to "maintain an organization of airmen to foster goodwill and fellowship among land-based Maritime Patrol flyers through the promotion of Maritime Patrol aviation and understanding of its impact on military aviation."

Membership is open to all aircrew of the free world who have flown over 2000 hours in long range, land-based Maritime Patrol aircraft (i.e. Lancaster, Neptune, Argus, Aurora, Canco, Shackleton, Nimrod, P-3 Orion, etc). Membership has grown over the years and the 3,000th member was recently enrolled.

There are active Wings at various units in Canada, United States, Australia, Great Britain, New Zealand, Norway and the Netherlands, as well as members from the French, West German, Japanese, Portuguese and Spanish navies. Planning for this reunion has been in the making since September, 1985 and we expect approximately 600 guests.

The schedule of events is as follows: Fri, 13 Jun — Registration, mixed Meet and Greet in the evening with food and refreshments; Sat, 14 Jun — Brunch golf, aircraft static display, bus tours, sit-down dinner (hip of beef) with music followed by a dance; Sun, 15 Jun — Champagne brunch followed by farewells to departing members. Cost for the Reunion is \$50.00 per couple or \$25.00 per person. This will include all meals, some refreshments and accommodation for those members who elect to stay on Base or private accommodations. Motel accommodation is limited and will be your responsibility.

A registration package was mailed to most members. Unfortunately, we are missing the present address of some members but, in publishing this article, we hope to reach these members. In addition, we invite all present and retired military members, who qualify to join VPI, to contact us for a membership registration (\$10.00 life membership).

Local rockers gear up for marathon session

For the past seven years, members of the Catholic Women's League of Our Lady of the Airways Chapel have gathered in the Chapel Annex with rocking chairs to rock for five hours.

The "Rockers" have taken pledges from the community as to the number of hours they will last in their chairs. Proceeds of the afternoon's activity are donated to a local charity.

The first Rock-a-thon was held in 1979. More than \$500.00 was raised, and with the help of CE and Base Supply, the money was used to refurbish a room at the Base Hospital to provide a non-hospital environment for long-term inpatients.

In 1980 the Addiction Rehabilitation Centre (Prairie Region) received \$519.00 for equipment for the use of those undergoing treatment.

The next four years had proceeds of more than \$1000.00 each year going to:

- Crippled Children and Adults for seatbelts installed in their transport buses.
- Kirkfield Park School, to buy equipment and provide camping experiences for handicapped students.

— St. Amant Center, to be used toward the purchase of an electric wheelchair.

— Osborne House, a shelter for abused women and their children, to buy dining room furniture.

Recipients of this year's endeavor were the Manitoba School for the Deaf and the Kiwanis Centre of the Deaf.

The Manitoba School for the Deaf is concerned mainly with the educational needs of deaf students from preschool to 21 years, following a revised curriculum to suit the special needs of their students.

The Kiwanis Centre of the Deaf deals with deaf adults 18 years and over. The Centre has a residence and is a gathering place for the deaf community for social functions, as well as church services.

These two organizations shared the \$1,013.05 raised this year. Irene Zdrill, a teacher at the Manitoba School for the Deaf, and Ross Stewart, a Kiwanian and Treasurer on the Board of Directors of the Kiwanis Centre of the Deaf, were present at Our Lady of the Airways Chapel to receive cheques from Georgina Mills, president of our Lady of the Airways CWL Council.

Tactical field training

Western army hits the trail for Alberta's Camp Wainwright

More than 5,500 soldiers, 1,500 vehicles and 12 helicopters descended upon Camp Wainwright, April 23-29 from normal duty stations in Esquimalt, Chilliwack, Edmonton, Calgary, Shilo and Winnipeg.

The month-long Wainwright Concentration (WAINCON 86) is a series of field-living and tactical training exercises, culminating in a five-day brigade level exercise.

WAINCON is part of the yearly training cycle of Canada's westernmost army formation, 1 Canadian Brigade Group. According to its commander, Brigadier-General Clive Milner, WAINCON allows all units of the brigade to train together and practise

special techniques and skills of field soldiering in large formations. Brigade and unit staff officers also prove their abilities in supplying, administering and moving large bodies of men and equipment.

Aside from the fact that this year's WAINCON will be the largest ever, one special feature will be the participation of more than 1,400 American and British armoured and infantry troopers from Fort Benning, Ga., Fort Richardson, Alaska and Yorkshire, England.

WAINCON 86 training begins on May 1, and ends May 30, when most units begin returning to home stations.

Service-Air travel

The price is right, but you have to obey the rules

Air Movements Section of CFB Winnipeg takes this opportunity to provide information on Service Air travel. It has become evident that many service personnel and their dependants are somewhat misinformed regarding Service Air travel regulations.

It seems appropriate at this time to reiterate some of the basic rules:

- All passengers must report for check-in not later than one hour prior to the flight departure; that means for the regular departure times of the Boeing going through AMS Winnipeg. Eastbound, you check-in between 1445 and 1525 hours, and Westbound you report for check-in between 1525 and 1605 hours. It is the responsibility of every passenger to contact the AMS if they expect to be later than the normal reporting time. For all personnel travelling Service Air — if you report after the cut-off time, you may not have your seat.
- Passports are required by Service

members and their dependants when travelling overseas on leave.

- A position on the priority five or opportunity list does not guarantee a seat to the individual concerned.
- Jeans, jean jackets, improper shirt, sweaters or any sports attire are not acceptable on Service Air.
- Service members and their families travelling on leave must be prepared to travel via commercial means, because Service Air travel is not guaranteed. Members who send their spouses and children unaccompanied must ensure that their dependants have sufficient funds to cope with flight delays or cancellations.
- Always check on your flight ahead of time for possible changes. The AMS-Winnipeg phone number is 895-5623. After hours, AMS Winnipeg has a recording service providing daily information on the scheduled and unscheduled flights. Phone is 895-5622.

— Finally, all Military Passenger Terminals in Canada will undergo renovations to incorporate a new security system. Once the system is in place, passengers will be required to pass through the metal detector prior to entering the terminal, as well as have their baggage X-rayed.

All of us in the passenger section of the AMS-Winnipeg wish you happy, trouble-free travelling, and encourage you to contact us any time from 0800-1100 hours daily for clarification of any regulations or any other general information you might require.

La Section des Mouvements aériens de la BFC Winnipeg (SMA) profite de l'occasion pour donner des informations aux les passagers voyageant à bord des vols militaires. Il est devenu évident que beaucoup de militaires et leurs dépendants sont mal informés sur les vols militaires.

Il semble approprié de réfléchir sur certaines règles de base:

- Les voyageurs en devoir doivent absolument se présenter au comptoir de réception des passagers au plus tard une heure avant l'heure du départ du vol. Ce qui veut dire que pour les vols 713 et 715, vous devez vous rapporter entre 14h 45 et 15h 25 pour le départ qui est à 16h 25. Pour le vol 712, vous vous rapportez entre 15h 25 et 16h 05, car l'heure du départ est à 17h 05. C'est la responsabilité de tous les passagers d'appeler la SMA si croyez que vous serez en retard our la réception des passagers. Les préposes de la section se feront un plaisir d'annoter la liste de votre retard et retiendront votre siège. Si vous voyagez en devoir et que vous vous rapportez après l'heure de récep-

tion, vous pouvez perdre votre siège et en subir les conséquences.

- Contrairement à la croyance populaire, les passeports sont requis pour les militaires et leurs dépendants lorsqu'ils voyagent à bord des vols outre-mer pour un congé.
 - Une position en priorité cinq ou la liste d'opportunités ne garantit pas un siège à l'individu concerné; ceci n'est qu'une demande.
 - Les jeans, veste jeans, ou tout autre vêtement délabré, ainsi que les vêtements de sports sont formellement défendus à bord des vols militaires.
 - Les militaires et leurs familles doivent être prêts à voyager par les lignes aériennes commerciales lorsque les vols militaires ne sont pas garantis. Les épouses et enfants non-accompagnés par le militaire concerné se doivent d'avoir les fonds suffisants pour les éventualités de délais ou cancellations.
 - Vérifiez pour les heurs de votre vol à l'avance; pour toute autre information, le numéro à composer est 895-5623. Après les heures ouvrables, un service de répondeur est à votre disposition pour les informations sur les vols de la journée au poste 5622.
 - Tous les aéroports militaires au Canada feront l'objet de futures rénovations. Elles consisteront à l'aménagement d'un détecteur de métal et d'une machine à rayons-X. Une fois le système installé, les passagers seront requis de passer par le détecteur de métal avant d'entrer aux rampes d'accès des barrières d'embarquement. tous les bagages et ceux accompagnant le passager abord de l'avion devront passer à la machine aux rayons-X.
- Tout le personnel de la SMA vous souhaite un bon voyage.

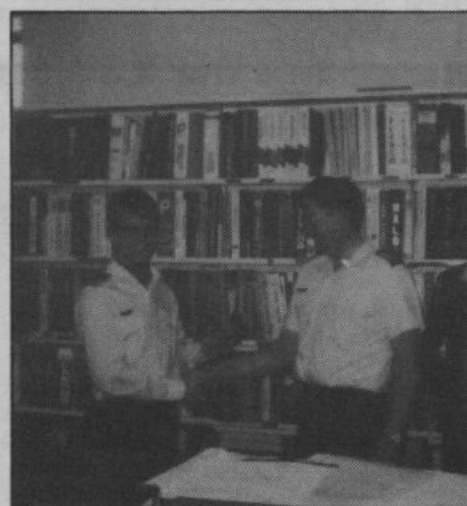

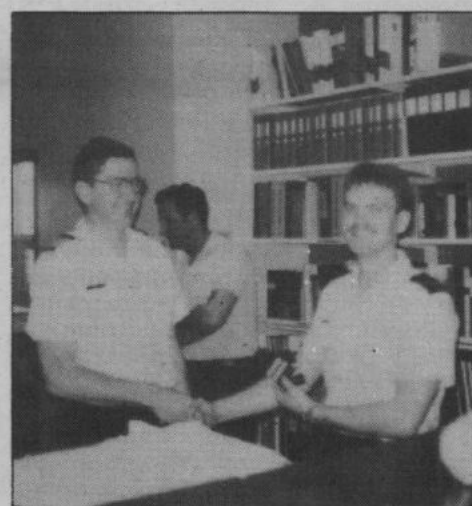

Base computer's gotcha

Smile — you're on BASIS

It's been a long time since our last article, but we at MIS 3 have been very busy putting the finishing touches on BASIS (Base and Station Information System).

BASIS is a base/station level personnel information system designed as the first step towards Automated Data Processing in Base/Station Orderly Rooms.

BASIS will form the foundation of a comprehensive data processing system, which will be expandable by modules, as they are developed. This system will prove to be a great asset not only to the Base/Station Orderly Rooms but to other orderly rooms on base/station as well.

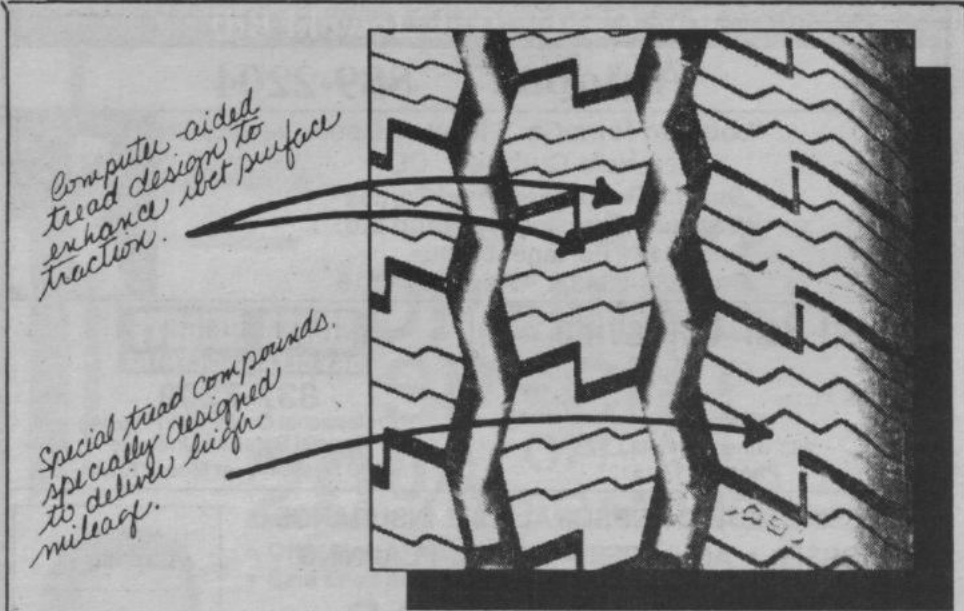
To give you an idea of how useful BASIS will be, a Base Commander will instantly be able to get a printout of all

personnel with a specific MOC or employed in a certain section.

Another way in which the system may be put to use is to aid the MIR. MIR personnel might normally take three days to go through the entire nominal role to get a list of personnel who's birthday falls within a certain month. BASIS can do the job in 15 minutes.

Because of the CFB Winnipeg's proximity to AIRCOM HQ, it has been chosen as the prototype for BASIS. Soon all bases/stations across Canada and Europe will have the option of installing BASIS on their computers.

BASIS has just been installed in the Base Orderly Room and will soon be pumping out reports for the month of May. So the next time you see your name printed out by a computer, smile — you're on BASIS.

Camping

Some hints that save lives

When camping out, special care with flammable liquids and open flames should be exercised at all times. Your Fire Chief recommends that:

- your tent should be of flame-retardant fabric; a paraffin-coated cotton tent can burn up in a few minutes with someone trapped inside;
- your tent should have two exits, or a window sufficiently large to serve as a second exit. Also keep a sharp cutting tool in the tent to cut out an

exit in the walls in case fire obstructs the only exit;

- never use candles or matches in or near your tent; use flashlights only;
- when using electric heaters in your tent, keep them away from walls, pillows and camping chairs;
- a fire extinguisher and a portable smoke alarm detector should be a must in every camper's equipment; they could prove to be lifesavers by providing you those precious extra moments that allow an escape and survival.

FGH marks 75th anniversary

WINNIPEG — Seventy-five members of The Fort Garry Horse, a Canadian Forces Reserve unit based at Winnipeg's McGregor Armoury, celebrated the regiment's 74th anniversary with a special parade at the armoury April 15.

The parade was attended by a former lieutenant governor of Manitoba, Honourable W.J. McKeag, the unit's honorary colonel, and the current lieutenant governor, Hon. Pearl McGonigal in attendance.

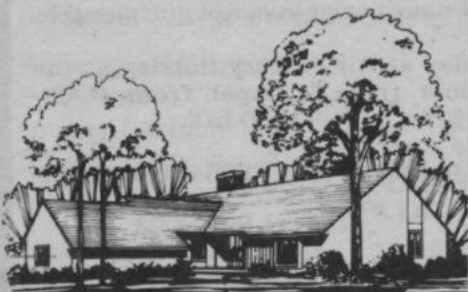

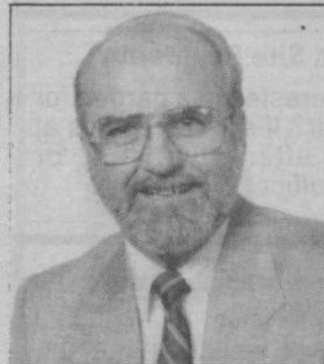
