NO PAIN NO GAIN

"Anyone who came here thinking the obstacle course would be the only challenge had another thing coming," said Cpl Darren Murphy of 18 Wing Edmonton. "The rifle competition was deadly!"

Murphy, out of breath and his combats soaked from sweat and the mornings rain, had just finished representing his Wing in the individual obstacle course event on the final day of Thunderbird Challenge 1994. The Thunderbird Challenge, held at 17 Wing Winnipeg from 22-25 August 1994, brings

the top Military Police from Air Command bases together in fierce but friendly competition.

The Thunderbird Challenge is a multi-event competition, measuring physical fitness, teamwork, and shooting skills. It involves a team obstacle course event, a combat rifle competition, a handgun competition, and an individual obstacle course event. Each of the wings sent a four man team to compete for top cop honours.

The rifle competition involved teams moving from firing point to firing point in full combat gear. At each point targets are exposed at varied locations, distances and for limited lengths of time.

The rifle competition may have been exhausting, but the obstacle course was no picnic either. "It was tough and very demanding," said Murphy, who was the top cop in this individual event. "The weather was a factor too. Everything was really wet. I slipped on one of the obstacles and had a really tough time getting back up."

Murphy's team from 18 Wing also won the team

Obstacle Course event, edging out 17 Wing Winnipeg.

"Teamwork was essential," said Murphy. "This competition showed how important working as a team is, to being successful."

The competition was established to help prepare Canada's military police for deployment to the world's trouble spots, where they would provide airfield security and policing for Canadian Forces aircraft and crews.

It also provides the opportunity to pick the top cops of the Air Force. From this competition a team will be selected to represent Canada's Air Force at the Peacekeeper

Challenge in late September at Kirtland Air Force Base, Albuquerque, New Mexico. Air Command will send a security team to New Mexico to test their skills against teams from the United States Air Force, the Royal Air Force and the Royal Australian Air Force. This gives something extra for the Thunderbird participants to strive for.

"Peacekeeper was an outstanding experience," said Capt Cletus Cheng of 4 Wing Cold Lake, and a member of last years Air Command team. "It is an excellent proving ground. Last year we came 8th out of 16, proving that we have the capability and flexibility to

take on new challenges and be employed in nontraditional roles."

As for the Thunderbird Challenge, "this is an excellent test for an MP in the air environment," says Cheng, who finished second overall in the individual category. "The competition is tremendous. To see these guys giving their all, giving their last gasp of energy, brings a lump to my throat."

Comraderie was a big part of

Call a Peacekeeper

If you have ever wanted to talk to one of our valiant Canadian peacekeepers or one of our service personnel on NATO duty in Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Croatia, Bosnia, Rwanda, or wherever they may be, now is your chance...

The Canadian Forces Network in conjunction with Radio Canada International has set up a 1-800 number for the families and friends of our Canadian peacekeepers. The number is 1-800-216-3443. Messages will be broadcast daily on "Report to Peacekeepers," heard daily on shortwave radio and satellite.

You can call this number anytime a day, seven days a week, and can leave a message of up to three minutes. There is also no limit on the number of times that you can call the service to leave a personalized message for your special friend, or simply to encourage all of our peacekeepers in general.

I am certain that our soldiers, sailors and airmen serving overseas would be

very happy to know that people are thinking of them. It does not matter whether you want to tell them that the baby has finally arrived, that you miss them, or simply that you are proud of them...

The only condition that the personnel at the Canadian Forces Network have placed on the service is that you be specific - if you simply say that your message is from Gail, five or six different people might assume that it is for them. Callers should identify the name of the person that the message is intended for, including their unit name and where the unit is stationed, and who the message is from.

the competition. Teams pulled together and cheered on their mates. At the finish line of the obstacle course, each competitor was met by his team, congratulated on their effort, and often physically helped until some of their strength had returned.

"When you reach the final corner you need to hear the screaming and noise to help bring you home. My body had left me and I had nothing left, but all the noise gave me enough to finish," said Murphy.

"The teams made sure they had fun to go with all the hard work," said Sgt Kim Marshall, the 17 Wing SAMP Thunderbird coordinator.

The team from 12 Wing Shearwater dressed in kilts and brought their own piper, while 19 Wing Comox rented a limo to drop them off at the St. Charles Range, the site of the competition. Just one day after the Rolling Stones Winnipeg concert, the team was heard to thank "Mick" for the ride.

The St. Charles Range, located just west of Winnipeg, required some major work before the competition, including the construction of the obstacle course. The course was constructed to the same specifications as the course at Albuquerque.

"All 21 sites were finished completely on August 17, with

just a few days to spare," said Marshall. He oversaw construction from the MP perspective and was very pleased with the finished work.

"The end result is that we will now be the permanent home of the Thunderbird Challenge," said Marshall. "Who knows, maybe we'll see MPs from all three elements competing here sometime."

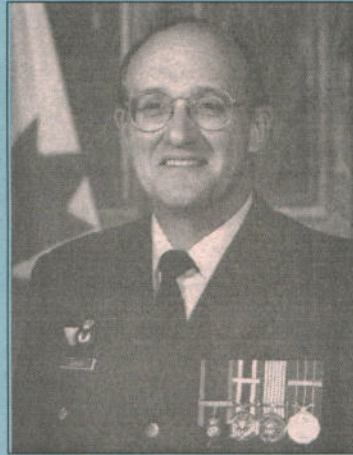
The visiting teams were impressed with the effort by 17 Wing. "The people, facilities and rooms were excellent," said Edmonton's Murphy. "We're used to Wainwright, so this is like Club Med."

Cheng agreed, adding that "the support from Sgt Marshall and Capt (Mike) Taylor was top-notch."

"A lot of lessons were learned this year," said Marshall. "This was our first opportunity to hold an event at this level and we will make improvements where they are needed for next year's competition. This is history, we start planning for 1995 tomorrow."

The gruelling work isn't over for all the MPs who came to Winnipeg. Many were looking forward to more hard training. "I hope to be on the Peacekeeper team this year," Murphy said, knowing that many of his fellow MPs share the same goal.

A busy posting season has seen 17 Wing get a new Wing Commander, new COs and Commandants for most of the units, and a new Wing Chief Warrant Officer. CWO Ray Elphick replaces CWO Bob Scott, who is retiring from the CF after 34 years of service.

CWO Elphick comes to 17 Wing from 18 Wing Detachment Penhold, where he was the School Chief Warrant Officer for the Junior Leader School, and the Detachment Chief Warrant Officer.

Originally from Cranbrook,

B.C., he joined the RCAF in 1964 and completed the ATC Assistants Course at RCAF Station Borden. His career has included postings to 1 Wing in Marville, France, 1 Wing in Lahr, Germany, and 19 Wing Comox.

After promotion to Sergeant, CWO Elphick completed a year of French language training in Ottawa before being posted to 3 Wing Bagotville. He also instructed at the Canadian Forces School of Air Traffic Control in Cornwall, Ont., and as a MWO was the first Non-Commissioned tower controller to qualify at 8 Wing Trenton.

In 1988 he was Promoted to

CWO and posted to Winnipeg to work at Air Command Headquarters as a Staff Officer with Air Traffic Control Standards and Evaluations. Following three years in Winnipeg he headed west to Penhold.

As well, in May of 1993, CWO Elphick was inducted into the Order of Military Merit, receiving the MMM.

CWO Elphick assumed the duties of Wing Chief at 17 Wing in July. He and his wife Suzanne have two daughters, Corrine, attending Lakeland College in Vermillion, Alta., and Kim attending the University of Winnipeg.

Personnel Profile - CFSAS

Mr. Don Sparks

Mr. Don Sparks is the CFSAS Training Coordinator for the Aerospace Systems Course (ASC). A graduate of ASC 22 in 1970, Don began teaching his fifteenth course this year when ASC 47 commenced 22 Aug 1994. His duties include daily course scheduling for the ASC, planning and coordinating ASC tours to aerospace industries, and instructing calculus and physics. Mr Sparks' overseas ASC tours have included trips to industries in the United States, an unprecedented tour in the Czech Republic in 1992, and industry visits to France, Great Britain, Germany, and the Netherlands. FOCUS ON TRAINING SYSTEM:

CHANGES TO TRAINING SYSTEM ANNOUNCED

On July 29, the Vice Chief of the Defence Staff announced two significant changes which will impact on the Canadian Forces Training System. The first dealt with the move of the CFTS Headquarters from Canadian Forces Base Trenton to Canadian Forces Base Borden. The move, which is in keeping with the Canadian Forces requirement to consolidate services and save resources, will co-locate the Headquarters with eleven of its schools and units at Canadian Forces Base Borden.

The move of the Headquarters will result in the blending of the Base staff at Borden and the Headquarters staff. The fall of 1995 is the completion date for the relocation. Questions regarding Base personnel, such as how many military and civilian personnel will be affected in Trenton and Borden, have not been answered but are currently under study. These changes will result in a more effective organization that is focused on recruiting, training, education and professional development and the support of those activities.

The eleven Training System schools and units located at CFB Borden are: Canadian Forces Dental Services School, Canadian Forces School of Intelligence and Security, Canadian Forces School of Physical Education and Recreation, Canadian Forces

Nuclear, Biological and Chemical School, Canadian Forces Academy of Leadership and Languages, Canadian Forces Medical Services School, Canadian Forces School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering, Canadian Forces Fire Academy, Canadian Forces Chaplain School and Centre, Canadian Forces School of Administration and Logistics, and the Canadian Forces Training Development Centre.

The second announcement was that Canadian Forces Base Kingston is to be transferred to the command of Land Force Command by 1 April 1995. The transfer, which will not include the Canadian Forces School of Communications and Electronics, may take place before that date subject to a timetable to be jointly developed by CFTS and LFC HQ Staffs.

Canadian Forces Training System is responsible for the selection, recruitment and designated individual training of Department of National Defence personnel. Canadian Forces Training System supports the operational capability of the Canadian Forces by preparing military and civilian personnel for leadership, technical, administrative and managerial challenges that they will face in their current and future areas of employment.

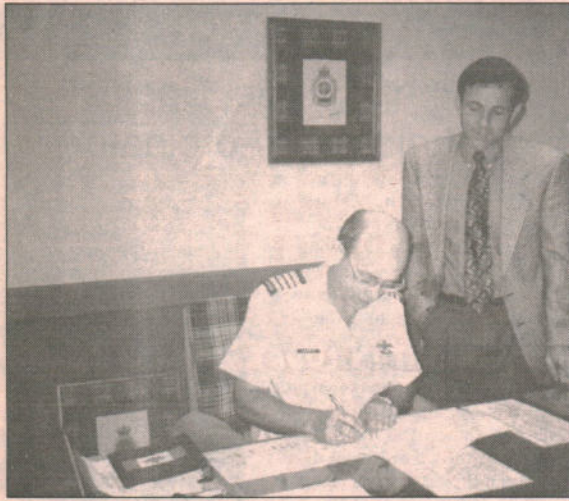

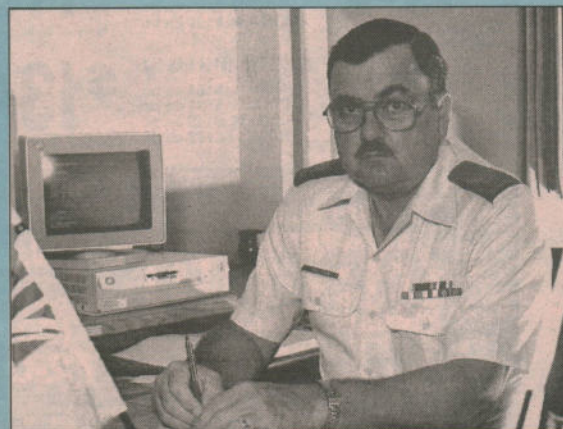

SECURITY AND MILITARY POLICE SQUADRON - 17 WING OFFER HUNTING TIPS

Planning a hunting trip this fall? If so, the Security and Military Police Squadron wish to remind you that no hunting trip is a success if it isn't safe.

Here's a safety checklist:

- Treat every gun as if it is/was loaded and exercise muzzle control of the firearm by knowing where the gun is pointed at all times.
- Be positive of your target, and beyond, before shooting. Never shoot at a sound. See your target clearly, first.
- Never point a gun at anything you don't intend to kill. Do not use your scope to "check out" other hunters.
- Ensure your firearm is clean and free of debris or dirt. Never fire a gun which has a plugged barrel.
- Unload all guns when you return to your camp.
- Never carry a loaded gun in a vehicle.
- Never take a loaded gun indoors.
- Unload the firearm before climbing fences, jumping ditches or walking through dense bush.
- Never fire at rocks or water as a ricocheting bullet can travel a long distance.
- Wear highly visible clothing and not camouflage outfits.
- **Drinking and hunting don't mix.** A hangover is a deadly form of impairment.

Hunting can be a safe sport if you recognize and avoid the potential dangers. Hunters, in pursuit of game, can become lost in the bush. Carry a compass and know how to use it. The Police recommend that if a hunter discovers that he/she is lost, he/she should "hug a tree" and wait for searchers to find him/her.

Before leaving on a hunting trip, ensure you tell someone where you are going and your approximate expected time of return. Many searches have been carried out for suspected lost hunters who said they were going to one place but went to another.

Hunters who boat to their hunting area have the double responsibility of remembering the rules of boating. An overloaded boat is likely to capsize, throwing its heavily dressed occupants into freezing water. A life jacket is a must for anyone going in a boat.

All hunters should carry a basic first aid/survival kit with them when going into a wooded area and know the fundamentals of first-aid.

AIR COMMAND EXCELLENCE SYSTEM

Cost Centre Management Project

"AIR FORCE INITIATIVE LEADS THE WAY FOR THE DEPARTMENT"

The approach we are taking in Air Command to meet the Defence 2000 Business Planning initiative is to move towards Operating Budgets, and adopt a business planning process for assigning tasks and allocating and managing resources within a new accountability regime. The Cost Centre Management (CCM) project is developing tools that will allow managers to measure resource consumption against the tasks in their business plans. CCM is at the foundation of the business planning process and being able to achieve the gains available through the operating budget concept. In effect, CCM will provide the information that will allow Air Command to change the way we do business at our units. Basically CCM will make costs visible and help leaders manage the resources for which they are responsible.

The project began over a year ago with the initial objective of determining how, and to what extent Air Command could adopt a user pays/cost centre programme. Work at 7 Wing Ottawa proved the feasibility of the CCM concept by developing a Business Model and then a prototype Resource Management Information Interface (RMII) for a single unit. This allowed the development to begin on the procedures, information systems, organization and training required to implement such a programme. The second phase of the project has seen the development of a Business Model based on activities/functions for all branches and squadrons at the Wing level. Phase 3 will develop prototype RMI interfaces for a whole

Wing as well as the exportation of the Business Models and RMIIs to the rest of the Wings in Air Command. Phases 4 and 5 will see further development of high level models for Wings, groups and AIRCOM.

The announced closure of 7 Wing resulted in 17 Wing becoming the lead Wing in the command for the CCM project, and tested the exportation process of the Business Models. The initial work on Business Models is scheduled for 15 and 19 Wings, and ATGHQ in May and June. Work on the Wing RMII prototype is under way at 17 Wing. Plans are now being made for the migration of CCM throughout Air Command by the summer of 1995.

After reviewing Air Command's CCM project initiative and progress, Land Force Command (LFC) and Maritime Command (MARCOM) decided to adopt the same approach as the basis for their business plan development. Both LFC and MARCOM have taken the first steps to have CCM migrated to their bases. This action will ensure all commands have a standardized basis for their respective Business Models and RMIIs. Coordination is also ongoing with NDHQ staffs to ensure compatibility with other information management systems like CFSS, FIS, and DSPIS systems. The CCM project will address the RMII needs of the new Defence 2000 operating budget concept and provide the essential link to the business planning process for the department.

Expect to hear more on this exciting innovation as your Wing gets CCM.

CFALL Helps Celebrate Polish Forces Day

On Friday, August 12 at the Waterloo Officer's Mess at Canadian Forces Base Borden, a crowd of approximately 75 gathered to celebrate Polish Forces Day. With the help of the staff at CFB Borden and the Canadian Forces Academy of Leadership and Language, (CFALL) 18 Polish foreign nationals, from the rank of Lieutenant to Brigadier-General, welcomed the Base Commander, Col Morin, the Commandant of CFALL Maj Melancon, the Polish Consul-General Andrzej Brzozowski and the President of the Polish Combatants' Association of Canada, Marian Fijal. Also present were members of the local Polish communities and the local media.

In his speech, event organizer BGen Slominski welcomed all the guests to the celebration. BGen Slominski expressed his thanks for the support of Col Morin and the staff at CFALL in putting the day together - the first time the occasion has been celebrated at CFB Borden. Col Morin expressed his thanks to the Polish community for teaching the people of Borden about Polish Forces Day. He also expressed his desire that the valuable language programs at CFALL would continue long into the future.

Polish Forces Day, which is equivalent to Canada's Armed Forces Day, is celebrated by the Polish military worldwide. It commemorates the contributions of Polish soldiers and civilians during both World Wars. A photographic display entitled "For Your Freedom and Ours" was set up by the Polish Combatants' Association of Canada for guests to see the many military contributions of Poland during the Second World War.

The 18 Polish officers in attendance are part of a class of 56 students currently attending the Canadian Forces Academy of Leadership and Language. Since 1993 the Academy has been teaching officers from Eastern Block countries English, as part of the Canadian Forces English Course.

For five months, they live at CFB Borden and practice their English in both the classroom and the local area. Canada is the site of this specialized training for foreign nationals as part of the Military Training Assistance Program and our NATO commitment to help former Warsaw Pact countries adjust to democracy. Currently there are students from Poland, Hungary, Czech Republic, Slovak Republic, Ukraine and Romania studying English at CFALL. This language program is

scheduled to accept one hundred students per year for the next five years.

When asked about his education at CFALL, BGen Slominski said: "It's hard; we work very hard every day but the teachers, Commander and officers all make us feel at home. The base is very nice and has good conditions to allow us to learn English and for us to spend our free time." The officers have enjoyed invitations from many local Polish groups, and have travelled to Ottawa, Montreal and London. As well as their English instruction, the students have learned a great deal about Canadian military practices and ceremonies as well as civilian customs.

BGen Slominski expressed his sincere thanks "... for allowing us to come to Canada; to meet Canadians and see your beautiful country. Thank you for making us feel at home and thanks to the teachers for teaching us English."

Judging from the fluency of BGen Slominski's speech, Training System's CFALL is doing an excellent job in teaching English to these Eastern Block officers. BGen Slominski summed up the tone of the evening, in perfect English, by saying: "Thank you for your friendship."

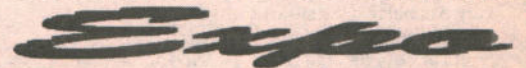

Canadian Spotlight: April Wine - Frigate (FRE/Sony)

***1/2 Rock solid. There's nothing new here from Myles Goodwyn & Co. - same tight production, power ballads & straight-up rockers except for the fact that it's so good. I haven't been a fan for quite awhile but Frigate has brought me back to the fold. If you're a fan, you'll love it, if not, it's well worth a listen.

Rebecka Tomqvist - A Night Like This (EMI) *1/2** Swedish jazz & blues. If you haven't passed out by the time her late night, sultry voice has got half-way thru this album, go see a doctor. A slow jazz/blues c.d. which has gone platinum in her native Sweden & has soothed many a frayed Swedish nerve. Now it's your turn for a Swedish, musical massage - mmm.

Harry Connick Jr. - She (Sony) ** Oh, Harry. We know that you're a musical talent who wants to grow, but couldn't you have stuck with your Sinatra-ish influences for a while longer? There's no doubt that funk-laced She showcases your New Orleans roots & you make a good show of it, but you're denying your fans, including my girlfriend who loves you, but hates She.

Milla - The Divine Comedy (SBK/EMI) *** Magical & otherworldly. Kate Bush + Eastern European folk = Milla. An 18 year old model & USSR emigre has created an atmospheric, folk/pop blend featuring traditional

instruments (harmonium, mandolin), arresting lyrics of heartbreak, alienation & hope and the magic of producer Rupert Hind to have it all make poetic sense. Gentle; poignant; dramatic; Milla has created something truly new & evocative.

Gipsy Kings - Greatest Hits (Columbia/Sony) *1/2** Passionate & potent. Out of Arles, France came the Reyes brothers & the Baliardo cousins to lay down flamenco-fandangos roots, nurtured with Arabic, Latin American & rock sounds to create 4 GK hit albums. Can't lose with features like "Djobi, Djoba", "Bamboleo", "La Quiero" & the reggae-ish "Escucha Me".

Canadian Spotlight: Jann Arden - Living Under June (A&M) **** A national treasure. Follow-up to Time For Mercy, Jann continues to explore her musical horizons in which she captures the small moments of life. Her effortless voice & self-effacing humour (We're doing songs about despair, heartbreak and loneliness - we'll move on to guilt later...) shine throughout and are testament to her promising future. Jackson Browne duets on "Unloved".

Branford Marsalis - Buckshot LeFonque (Sony) **** Jazz-rap-hiphop-rock fusion. Saxophonist Marsalis is the leading edge in contemporary jazz. However, he breaks with jazz tradition in this eclectic aural experiment, transcending diverse musical

styles by combining them, producing an original work which can only be labelled as pure, wonderful & inspiring.

BBM - Around The Next Dream (Virgin/EMI) **** The demigods of power blues. Take a trip back to wah-wah guitarland: BBM stands for Baker, Bruce & Moore as in Ginger, Jack (rhythm section of the legendary Cream) and Gary (Thin Lizzy) who, in their debut c.d. have produced a powerful right-cross, blues punch. Hits of Cream throughout, this is great stuff, with a few blues ballads to quiet the storm. Puts Clapton's past 2 decades of output to shame.

Canadian Spotlight: Lee Aaron - Emotional Rain (A&M) *** She's baaaack. Leather-throat Lee returns after a 3 year hiatus & has matured lyrically, focussing on world consciousness & individual responsibilities: trouble is, I thought rock was about being irresponsible - but who listens to lyrics anyhow. Nonetheless, Lee proves she can still rock harder than a lot of guys.

Various Artists - Forrest Gump Soundtrack (Sony) *1/2** 32 American classics including: Presley's "Hound Dog", CCR's "Fortunate Son", The Doors "Break On Through", Dylan's "Rainy Day Women", Skynrd's "Sweet Home Alabama", Beach Boy's "Sloop John B.", etc.

On your House Hunting Trip

Part One of Two

At this time of year, many military members are busy planning a House Hunting Trip (HHT) to their new posting location. The more organized you are on your HHT, the less stressful you will find it, and the greater your chances of success. This is the first of two articles providing lists of items that you should have with you on your HHT. If you are going to rent a home in your new location, you will need the following items:

1. Sufficient funds for a security deposit. The amount required will vary from province to province, so you should check with your ERS consultant to see what the amount will be in your destination. You may have to provide your security deposit in the form of a certified cheque or money order, so make arrangements with your bank in advance to ensure that this won't be a problem in your new

location.

2. Your cheque book, in case the landlord wants you to write a series of post dated cheques for the rent.
3. You may wish to obtain a letter from your bank, indicating that your account with them is in good standing (not providing your account balance).
4. The name, address and phone number of your current landlord, so that you can provide a reference if required. If you have been in your current home for less than one year, you should obtain the name, address and phone number of your previous landlord as well.
5. Proof of your earnings in the form of a pay guide, pay stub or tax return.
6. A copy of the information booklet on the Landlord/Tenant Act for your destination province.
7. A copy of a standard blank rental agreement, if available.
8. A map of your destination city.
9. A list of your housing

requirements.

10. A contact name in your new location, if possible.
11. Your furniture measurements and a tape measure.
12. A good understanding of your entitlements.
13. The On the Move for Renters book, which you will obtain from your local ERS consultant.

You may not require all of the above items, but if you have them with you on your HHT, you can easily provide them.

All members going on a HHT, whether it is for the purpose of renting or buying, are reminded that they must book an appointment and attend a consultation with an ERS representative prior to going. ERS's phone number is (204)833-2155. Next week, we'll list all the things you need to take with you on an HHT to purchase a home.

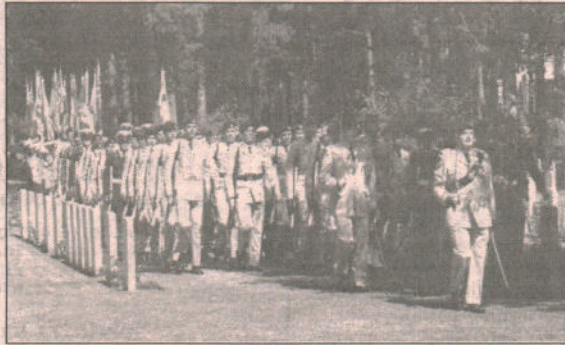

A WORD FROM THE CHAPLAIN

DO YOU WANT TO CHANGE?

Dr. M. Kinder says, "Instead of life's journey being an exhilarating adventure into the unknown, for many of us it is a compulsive and tiring trek, an exhausting journey where the next stop for replenishment never seems to arrive." Perhaps you are a person who believes you need a change in your life and wish to see a change in this world we live in where we are overwhelmed by its tragedy and terror.

I believe our beliefs and perceptions are mostly illusions that only make you unhappy. Our assumption that life is a series of self-improvements, the sum total of which is equated with happiness is a self-doomed obsession. We have created exaggerated expectations about life's promises and the ease with which they are realized.


We do not know who we are and feel only what we are told to feel and see only what we are told to see. We equate intense emotions and sensations with being alive, while at the same time we negate self-acceptance and the need for peace of mind. In our age of addiction we wish to deaden the pain rather than face the problem. We feel empty, disconnected from ourselves, others and our community. In the process of trying to look better, proves ourselves, be healthier, make more money, be the best person, have the perfect marriage, have the perfect children, we are burning ourselves out. The faster we go in pursuit, the more signals we begin to ignore.

I have good news for you, you can change, you can discover your real self and your life can have meaning and purpose. Change happens when you surrender to its possibility. You will have to mourn the loss of beliefs and perceptions that have colored your view of reality and distorted it. You can take a leap of faith that will allow you

to initiate the process of change. You will then discover that openness and receptivity necessary to find a plateau of self-acceptance.

Happiness is within us, waiting to be found. We have become more concerned with lifestyles rather than life. We have focused on "becoming" rather than "being." You have tried to be the 'Perfect Self', you wrestle with the 'Imperfect Self' and now you can reacquire yourself with your 'Forgotten Self'. A person, a person of integrity and compassion, a long time ago said something like this, "... the person who wishes to find their life must first lose it.

I plan to begin a 4 week course in the fall that will consist of presentations and discussion on "our human journey in perspective." It will not be "religious" nor restricted to Chapel goers. It will be an opportunity to share with others in an open and accepting atmosphere some of the perspectives I use in counselling that focus on our identity and our struggles. I see us as companions on life's

Canadian Forces Network: RADIO FOR OUR TROOPS OVERSEAS

"Good morning Visoko! This is Radio Canada International with the Report to Peacekeepers."

In order to keep our forces serving overseas with either NATO or with United Nations peacekeeping missions in touch with life in Canada, the Director General Personnel Services (DGPS) has teamed up with Radio Canada International to provide them with Canadian news and music.

In areas where a direct satellite downlink is available, such as to our troops on NATO duty in Germany, Belgium and the Netherlands, Radio Canada International provides programming twenty-four hours a day. This direct satellite service is being expanded to include our peacekeepers in the Golan Heights, the former Yugoslavia and Somalia.

For our soldiers, sailors and airmen on duty in the Middle East, Africa and Asia, the Canadian Forces Network sends out an hour long broadcast every Monday to Friday by shortwave radio. The broadcast comes on each weekday evening from 0100 to 0130 hours in English and then from 0130-0200 EDT (morning shot time in Europe) in French.

The Canadian Forces Network is just one of the programs offered by Radio Canada International. The difference is that the CFN puts its emphasis on covering news and entertainment items related to the Canadian Forces.

The Canadian Forces Network has entitled their English language program the "Report to Peacekeepers." Its French counterpart, meanwhile, is known as the "Magazine des Casque bleus."

The program is also broadcast on shortwave each evening for Canada's Maritime Command personnel on duty in the Caribbean enforcing the naval blockade around Haiti.

In addition to reporting military related news, the CFN also plays taped messages

from friends and family members back in Canada. Almost as important as the messages from home is the fact that "Report to Peacekeepers" features such indispensable aspects of Canadian culture as live play-by-play coverage of the NHL and Major League Baseball. It also airs some of the best of CBC and SRC network radio.
