SAREX for MISSING CHILDREN

Search & Rescue Exercise (SAREX) Ride for missing children and victims of violence, supported by the Canadian Centre for Missing Children

The idea for "SAREX FOR MISSING CHILDREN" was put forward in Sept 94 during the 50th anniversary of "SEARCH & RESCUE (SAR) in Canada". The challenge - a cross Canada bike ride, was accepted by the SAR Tech trade with the following goals in mind:

A. Promotion of the SAR Tech trade and the Canadian Forces within the civilian community by raising funds for Victims of Violence Canadian Centre for Missing Children
B. Promotion of fitness within the SAR Tech trade and to increase morale and pride among SAR Techs by being the first military team to accomplish such a feat.

SAREX for Missing Children is scheduled to begin in Comox, BC on the 19th May 96 and terminate in St. John's Nfld. on the 6th July 96. The expedition will cover more than 8000 KM and the team is expected to complete approximately 200 km per day. In support of this exercise Discount car and truck rentals of Coldbrook NS whose logo is "We want your business and we'll come right to your door to get it" has tentatively donated the use of a nine pax van, Norco Products Ltd. has agreed to help equip the riders with cycling gear, also their spare parts and the Canadian Forces will cover all other costs.

Names selected so far: 442 SQN Comox MCpl Tony Isaacs, 435 SQN Winnipeg MCpl Derak Curtis, 413 SQN Greenwood Sgt Mike Maltais and from 103 Rescue Unit MCpl Glen Gray.

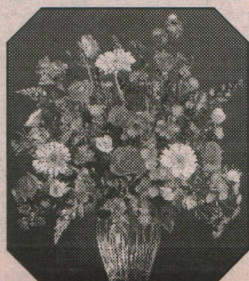

2PPCLI: TOW CONCENTRATION

If you're ever wondering when we'll have a significant weather change; just wait until the troops head out to the field. As II VP Anti-Armour Platoon pulled into Shilo on the 21st of March with our Tow Under Armour (TUA) vehicles, Range Control was getting ready to turn their big weather dial from "Warm & Fair" to "Blizzard" (More to Follow).

As soon as we touched down on the range, Cpls Ford and O'Neill took over as to where the stores tent, living quarters, etc would be set up. Things went well and by the day's end we had stripped off the parkas and toques and were sloshing around in the mud. It looked like we were in for some nice weather for the next three days.

Enthusiastically, the troops were up at first light the next day setting up figure 11 targets for the co-axially mounted C-6 shoot and of course; the tank targets for our ten TOW missiles. Captain Townes and Warrant Officer Bonin had us moving figure 11 targets "left, no right, no, back a little bit; yeah, right there" for the better part of the morning. By the day's end, everything was set to go. All of the targets were quite visible and just to make sure, at least a dozen bags of charcoal and three drip pan "Barbecues" were placed on standby to heat them up for our thermal sights.

Concurrent activity included tracking one of our TUAs with another by means of the A.P.G.S. system.

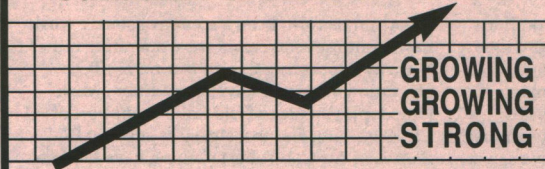
Basically, this combines a simulator and the equipment of the Americans "MILES System", to produce an effect about as real as one can get to tracking and hitting your target without firing a missile.

As the morning light of day three lit the horizon, we discovered a nice little twist had been added to our shoot. At least six inches of snow had fallen overnight and fog had dropped the visibility to only a few hundred meters. Our tank targets were twenty five hundred meters away. This is where the charcoal comes in. The targets were heated up with the makeshift barbecues and suddenly they appeared bright and clear in our thermal sights.

Everything was now a "GO" and the ten first-time shooters waited, nervous, but eager for "permission to go live" from Range Control. Finally, one by one, the missiles were loaded and launched towards their targets. Ten new "TOW Gods" were born, but the fun didn't stop there. Now it was time to Rock n' Roll with our co-axial C-6's. Everyone in the platoon got to participate in this event, and soon many a figure 11 target fell prey to the awesome fire power.

The final day ended with a hasty but thorough tear-down and cleanup of the range in order to get home and start our Block Leave. For the ten soldiers who had fired their first missile it was four days that they would never forget!

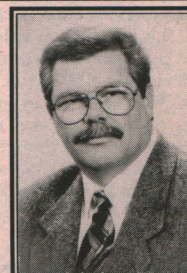

Chinthe Bits

It is the end of April and 435 Squadron finds itself having survived its first Winnipeg winter. Most of the squadron members have now settled into their new home and are looking forward to finding what MB has to offer us transplanted Albertans this spring and summer.

This April finds the squadron as busy as ever. Several crews have been deployed on a many different and far ranging operations. For instance, the first BOXTOP Operation of the year is now in progress. BOXTOP is carried out to provide fuel and supplies to the most northerly settlement in the world - CFS Alert. Chinthes are well represented with aircrews, servicing techs, and operations staff all staging through the American base at Thule, Greenland. When complete this 24 hour a day operation will have completed over 120 flights over a 2 week period.

In addition to air transport, the squadron remains busy in its search and rescue and air to air refueling roles. 435 continues to hold its 24 hour a day, 7 day a week readiness to respond to a SAR launch. Last month the squadron participated in the international Arctic SAREX (Search and Rescue Exercise) held in Cold Lake, Alberta. This SAREX was unique because it involved crews and aircraft from not only the United States but also Russia. It must have been quite a sight to see Russian aircraft and crews operating on the Cold Lake ramp to next to CF-18s! An impossible thought not all that long ago! Next month the SAR crews will be participating in another SAREX, based in Calgary.

squadron has also been a source of steady work. Last month several crews were operating out of Norway supporting CF-18s during NATO's Operation Strong Resolve. In addition, week long deployments to Cold Lake in support of CF-18 training and to Calgary to support FAC (Forward Air Controller) training have kept the AAR line of tasking fully occupied. Next month, the squadron will be conducting an AAR training course to train additional crews in this role.

Since the squadron's move, there have been several additions to personnel. Capt Paul Strachan has returned to the Pilot Section after a short diversion on Dash 8s with 402 Squadron. Also returning to the squadron recently after their 10 week Aircraft Commander course in Trenton were Captains Glen Oerzen, Scott Cameron and Mark Thomasguard. In addition, Lt Corey Smith has returned following completion of his First Officer training. Currently on their OTU are Lts Collin Keiver and Mike Mroz who will be returning as qualified First Officers this summer.

The Navigator Section welcomed Lt Sylvain Collard in January. Lt Anoy Cornell recently completed his OTU in Trenton and is now a qualified Nav. The Loadmasters added MCpl George Lake to their ranks in January and the Flight Engineers welcomed back Sgt Dan Hemond 19 April following his back surgery.

In conclusion, 435 Squadron continues to adjust to its new home in Winnipeg. The members will continue to represent Winnipeg not only across Canada but also across the globe. This spring finds the squadron as busy as it ever has been during its 51 year history.

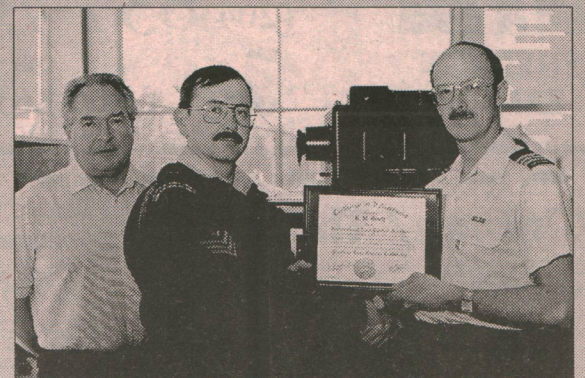

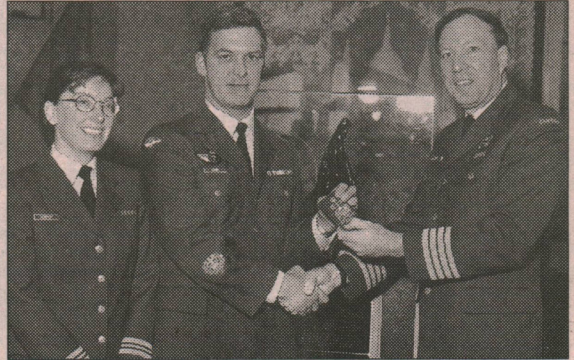

17 WING'S SQUASH TEAM WINS INTERCLUB TITLE

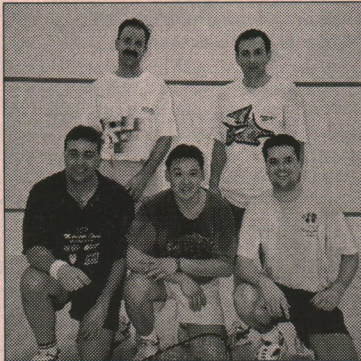

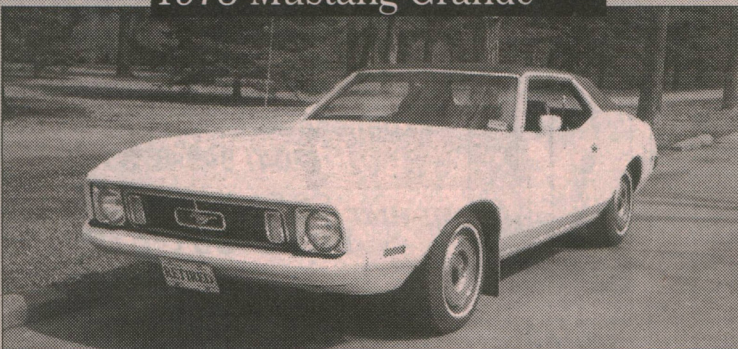
