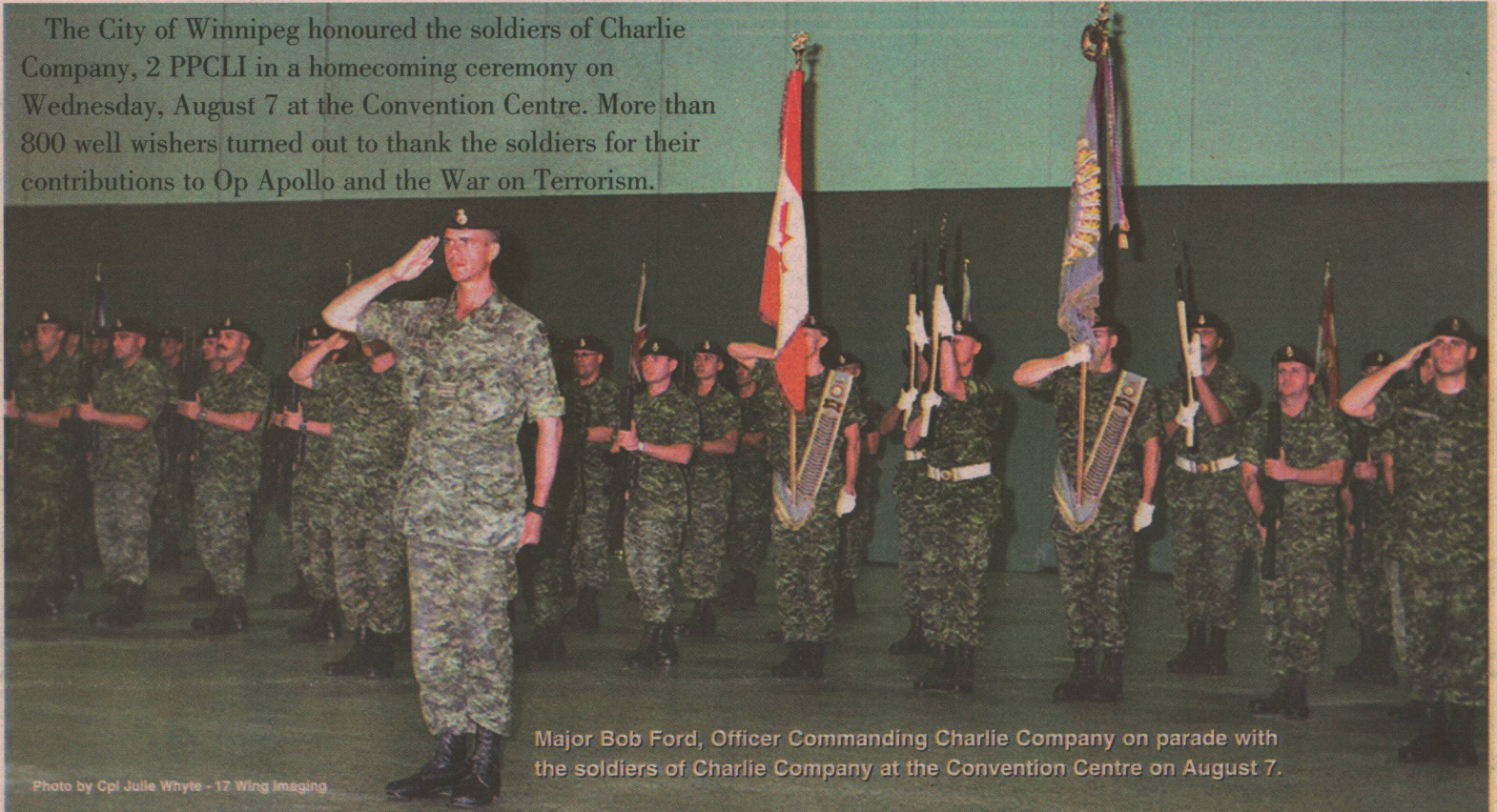

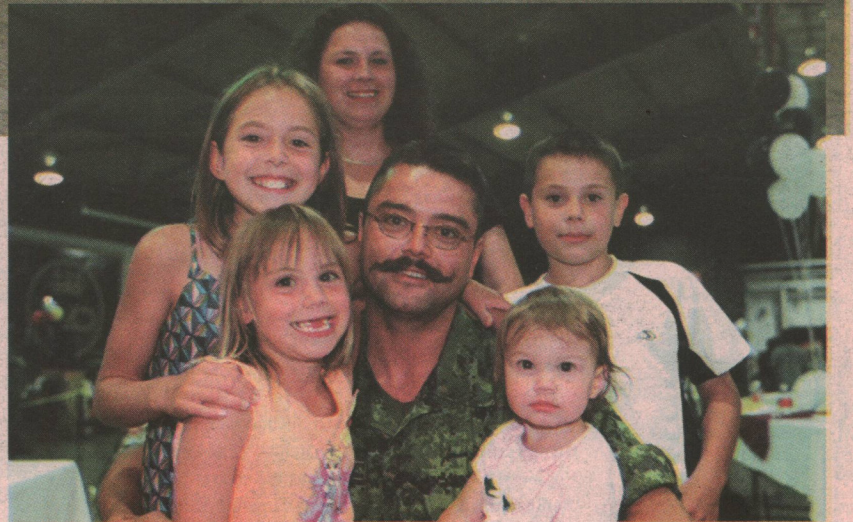

New Deputy Commander of the Canadian NORAD Region

WINNIPEG— American command pilot Brig-Gen Andrew S. Dichter assumed the role of Deputy Commander of the Canadian North American Aerospace Defence Command Region (CANR) on May 29.

As the senior United States Air Force (USAF) officer in Canada, he will occupy a key role as the principal advisor to the commander on all Canadian NORAD Region matters. Brig-Gen Dichter recognizes that both Canadians and Americans have a renewed respect for NORAD in the aftermath of the Sept. 11 tragedy. "NORAD's importance in safeguarding North America's security has taken on new importance and I am very happy to be an integral part of the command," he said.

Born and raised in Millville, New Jersey, Brig-Gen Dichter's fascination with flying led him to join the USAF Academy at age 17. He quickly rose through the ranks, graduating from the USAF Weapons School (F-16 Division), where he was one of the first 100 pilots to fly the F-16. He has commanded at the flight, squadron, group and wing levels.

Brig-Gen Dichter says that although he has thoroughly enjoyed every one of his assignments, one of his most memorable postings was as Vice-Commander of the 49th Fighter Wing at Holloman Air Force Base. "It was one of those rare situations where everything clicked," he said. "The 49th Fighter Wing is also home to the Stealth Fighter, and while I was there, we deployed them in the air war over Serbia. That was an extremely rewarding experience and a very prestigious unit to be associated with."

The new deputy commander comes to Winnipeg via Hawaii, where he was Inspector General, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces at Hickam Air Force Base. There, he was in charge of the complaints and investigations unit, where he acted as an ombudsman for the Pacific Air Forces and oversaw compliance and operational readiness investigations.

Brig-Gen Dichter says he is pleased to be posted to Winnipeg. "I have had very positive experiences working with Canadians in the past and I am looking forward to continuing this relationship," he said.

"On the personal side, my family and I are looking forward to seeing the sights of Winnipeg and Manitoba, and getting to know and appreciate Canadian culture. Also, we are very happy to be located close to our extended family in North Dakota and Minnesota."

Brig-Gen Dichter replaces Brig-Gen Mike DeCuir, who has been appointed Commander, Cheyenne Mountain Operations Center, at NORAD Headquarters in Colorado Springs.

Winnipeg is home to the dual headquarters for 1 Canadian Air Division (ICAD) and the Canadian NORAD Region. The headquarter serves as the central point of command and control for Canada's operational air force and oversees the monitoring of Canada's airspace in support of our commitments to NORAD.

NORAD is a bi-national United States and Canadian organization charged with the missions of aerospace warning and aerospace control for North America. NORAD utilizes a network of ground-based radars and fighter aircraft to detect, intercept and if necessary, engage any "air-breathing" threat to the continent. NORAD also assists in the detection and monitoring of aircraft suspected of illegal drug trafficking.

Since Sept. 11, NORAD has adapted its traditional outward-looking focus to ensure new threats to the interior of the continent are detected and countered. NORAD provides a potent military-response capability to help civil authorities counter domestic airspace threats.

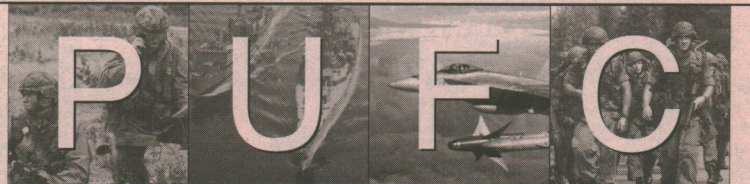
Link Nurse: Keeping the connection

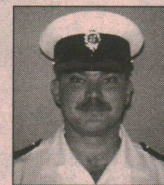

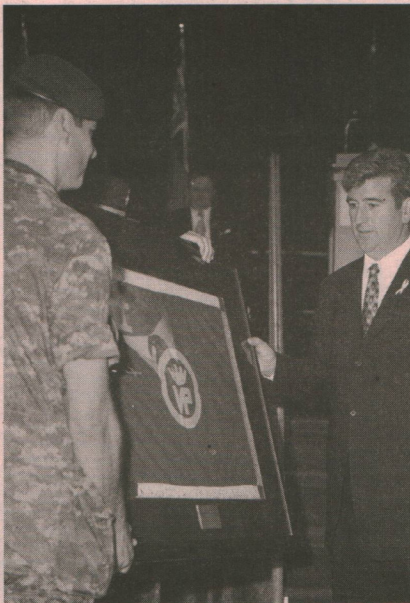
Welcome Home 2PPCLI

Balloons, banners and Canadian flags of all sizes provided the backdrop for the thunderous applause and cries of joy that greeted the soldiers of "C" Company, 2 PPCLI when they marched into the drill hall at Kap'young Barracks on July 30-home from Afghanistan. The main body of members from Winnipeg deployed for Op APOLLO on March 7 to join the 3 PPCLI Battle Group providing 149 soldiers in total, almost 50 percent of the mission's combat power. In total, 180 Manitoba-based soldiers flew into 1 Air Movements Squadron at 17 Wing Winnipeg after a few days of de-compressing in Guam. As they deplaned and waited to clear customs, the Prime Minister and the Minister of National Defence personally thank them on behalf of the Canadian people for their contributions to the War on Terrorism. The 40 soldiers from 1 RCHA quickly boarded buses for the two-hour ride to CFB Shilo and their families. The Prime Minister also addressed the families waiting at Kap'young Drill Hall, talking of the valuable contributions their loved ones had made, and how without the support of the families, this mission would not have been possible. The soldiers took two days of

well-deserved leave before beginning a week-long work re-integration plan which included medical, social and administrative elements. The city of Winnipeg held a "Welcome Home" ceremony on August 7. More than 850 well-wishers paid tribute to the soldiers and witnessed the return of

the Battalion members, Winnipeg's contribution to the Campaign Against Terrorism is not over by any means. 17 Wing Winnipeg still has approximately 65 personnel from various military occupations abroad with Operation Apollo Roto 1. The majority of these members are in the

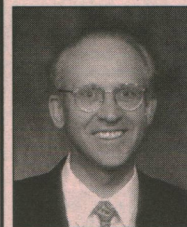
Arabian Gulf region, providing logistic support to the remaining Canadian Forces in the area. Canada still has the National Support Unit (NSU); the Long Range Patrol Detachment (LRP Det), flying two CP-140 Aurora Maritime Patrol aircraft; three CC-130 Hercules transport aircraft; three warships that operate in the Arabian Gulf and Arabian Sea regions; and small specialized

ground forces elements in Afghanistan. Additionally the CF provides military staff members to a Task Force headquarters co-located with the U.S. Central Command in Tampa, Fla. The NSU is responsible for delivering centralized administrative and logistics support services to Canadian Forces units deployed in Southwest Asia on Operation Apollo. 17 Wing's current group of deployed Operation Apollo personnel are scheduled to be back home by mid-February, 2003.6/11/1

The pennant had flown at City Hall since the soldier's departed for the operation and served as a constant reminder to passers-by of the Canadian contributions in Afghanistan. The soldiers of "C" Coy are now on their extended leave and will return to battalion life on October 1 while other members of their unit begin pre-deployment training for their departure to Bosnia on Roto 12 in March 2003. 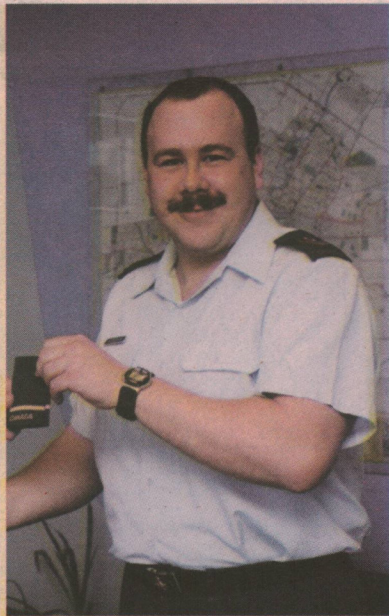

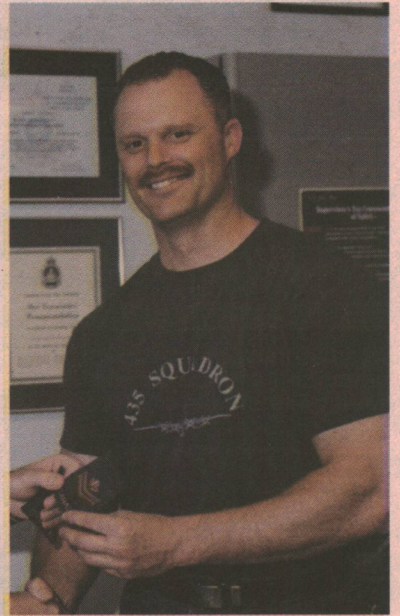

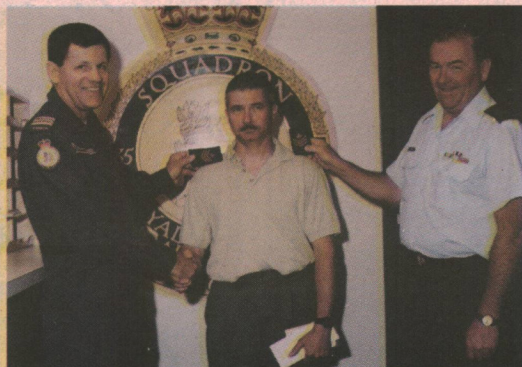

The purpose of this article is to announce the 2002 shelter charge adjustments for married quarters (MQ's) effective 1 November 2002.

The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) have completed the annual appraisal of the national portfolio of married quarters.

With the approval of Armed Forces Council, the Canadian Forces Housing Agency (CFHA) implemented Treasury Board shelter charge phasing limits on 1 September 2001 and these limits will continue to apply to current occupants for shelter charge adjustments effective 1 November 2002.

The limits, contained in the Treasury Board Living Accommodation Charges Directive, paragraph 1.13, permit increases to a maximum of \$75.00 per month for current CF family occupants with a gross family income of less than \$35,000.00 per year, or a maximum of \$100.00 per month for those whose

gross family income is \$35,000.00 per year or more.

CF families taking occupancy of a unit before 1 November 2002 will pay either the Base Shelter Value (market value) of the unit, or \$50.00 more per month than the rent paid by the previous occupants of that unit, whichever is less. Effective 1 November 2002, all new occupants, regardless of family status, will pay the Base Shelter of the unit upon occupancy.

Similar to what happens with private market rents, MQ shelter charges are reviewed and adjusted annually. To accommodate the annual posting cycle, MQ shelter charges are adjusted on 1 November, with occupants receiving three months notice of any changes.

In July 2002, CFHA Housing managers will advise each current occupant, in writing of his/her shelter charges effective 1 November 2002.

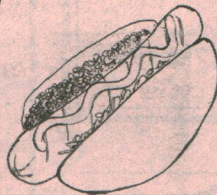

New Training Facility at 17 Wing

If you have been driving north past the Military Police building en route to building 52 you may have noticed an open field with some color coded stakes sticking out of the ground. While there is not much to look at right now by this time next year you will be able to utilize one of the newest and most advanced training facilities in DND.

In April 01 the DM and CDS recognized that the LCCN (Learning Career Centre Network) sponsored by DGLPD (Director General Learning and Professional Development) and the DDLS (Defence Distributed Learning System) sponsored by ADM(HR-Mil) had many

potential synergies. In turn they directed that the two projects be harmonized to "ensure the best possible product, most efficient use of resources and avoid duplication of effort".

These two projects were combined to become the Defence Learning Network (DLN). Simply put the DLN is project that will provide a network of learning and career centres across Canada connected by an electronic backbone.

As part of the DLN project 17 Wing Winnipeg was chosen as a "hub" to participate in a proof of concept that will be used to ultimately determine the overall form and function for the DLN. The selection of 17 Wing to participate in

the DLN proof of concept prompted a review of a local initiative to construct a training centre. This review identified many areas of overlap between the two projects and many potential advantages to creating a facility to meet the needs of the entire defence team. Consequently, the infrastructure requirements for the local and national projects were blended to provide the best fit for the defence team at 17 Wing and to fall in line with harmonization rationale of the CDS and DM.

Since the initial consultation meetings in May 2001 staff from 17 Wing in conjunction with staff from Civilian Human Resource Service Centre (Prairies), 1 Canadian Air Division (1 CAD), Chief of the Air Staff (CAS) and the DGLPD have successfully combined forces to design and fund a state of the art training facility known as the Training, Education, and Conference Centre (TECC). This new facility will consolidate and expand upon the existing general purpose training facilities from across the Wing and combine them into a cohesive centre.

Construction of the TECC is scheduled to start in September and be completed by May 2003. This new facility will provide classrooms, distance learning facilities, computer labs,

video conferencing, syndicate rooms, student lounge and a 160 person lecture theatre. The overall structure will be a 2 story building and will be approximately 2400 m2. In addition to providing state of the art training facilities the TECC will be the new home of the Learning and Career Centre, Language Training Centre, Personnel Selection Office, and Wing Ground Training. Currently the interim Learning Career Centre is located in building 61 and is providing services to 17 Wing as part of the DLN proof of concept. An official opening celebration is scheduled for the 1st Oct 2002 and more information on the project will be provided in upcoming issues of the Vox Air.

Overall the philosophy behind the DLN supports the idea that "increasing the knowledge and developing the skills of DND employees benefits both the employees and the employer and must be seen as an investment towards a sustainable workforce." While there are many ways to achieve this overall goal, new facilities such as the TECC are the most visible symbols of the ongoing commitment of the Department of National Defence in "promoting a culture of continuous life-long learning for all members of the Defence Team."

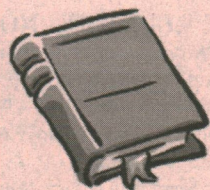

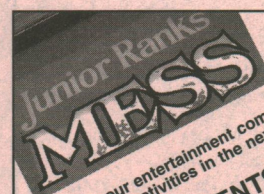

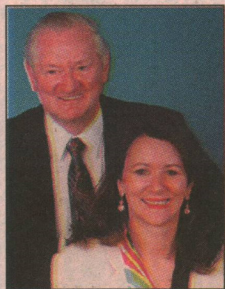
