Bring Your Kids to Work Day at 435 Sqn

For three teenagers, the morning of November fifth came early. Awoken by their fathers, the three—Kristofer Kaehler, Kassandra Webster, and Kyle Marriott—were on their way to 435 Sqn to carry out a Flight Engineer (FE) pre-flight on the SAR stand by CC-130 Hercules. The FE's of 435 Sqn normally have an 0600 start time for the pre-flight, so one leaves it to the imagination at which time these teenagers arose.

Closely monitored by their fathers—MWO Mike Kaehler (435 FE Lead),

Sgt Wayne Webster (435 Standards FE), and Sgt Brad Marriott (435 Line FE Under Training)—the three teens carried out the FE pre-flight. The Kaehlers and the Marriotts took care of the cockpit area, while the Websters inspected external, cargo, and top portions of the aircraft.

Not long after the FE pre-flight was underway, Sgt George Lake and his daughter Samantha arrived to complete the Load-master (LM) pre-flight. Like the FE kids, Samantha got her hands dirty doing the LM checks under the close

watch of her dad.

By 0815, both the FE and LM pre-flights were complete and it was time to head upstairs to inform the pilots of the status of the aircraft. Here, the FE and LM kids met Capt Kevin Big Canoe, First Officer (FO) for the day, and his daughter Sara. By this time, Sara would have gone over the weather, flight planning, and any other items required for the day with her dad. The Aircraft Commander (AC) was Capt Terry Foley, whom the kids would meet later.

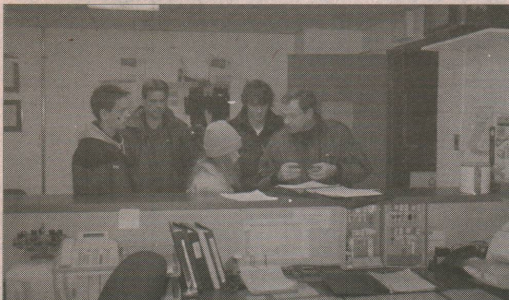

After receiving the daily morning brief, the acting Commanding Officer (CO) welcomed the kids to 435 Sqn and told them to enjoy the day.

By this time, more parents had shown up with their teenagers: Aviation Tech-

nician (AVN) Cpl Dawn Meier with her daughter Alex, and Navigator (NAV) Capt Al Haviland with his niece Laura Barton. The kids were divided into two groups in preparation for briefings by each member of the CC-130 Hercules crew.

Briefings on pilot, navigator, and LM duties were given by Capt Big Canoe, Capt Haviland, and Sgt Lake respectively. To get a maintainer's look at the CC-130, the kids received an overall brief of the aircraft from MCpl Stelman, Cpl Stertz, and Cpl Meier.

After lunch, it was time for a visit to the Search and Rescue (SAR) technician's shop for a brief and a rock climbing exercise on the hangar floor. Cpl Ernie Whelan carried out the brief in the SAR shop and, after a general job description, brought out a bush suit, parachute, SARPELS and helmet.

In the meantime, some of the kids were already doing some rock climbing under

the guidance of MCpl Levesque and MCpl Guay. Laura Barton picked a good day to overcome her fear of heights—she managed to make it to the top after a hard struggle.

After visiting the SAR-techs, the teens were treated to a flight in the mighty CC-130 Hercules. At roughly 1600, after the required safety brief, the crew prepared for start only to have Mother Nature interfere with a quick snowfall. Once the aircraft was de-iced, the crew quickly completed the start.

The Herc took off smoothly, and everyone was allowed to wander the aircraft under the guidance of Sgt Lake and Sgt Marriot. The AC invited the kids to take turns occupy-

ing the co-pilots seat for 5-7 minutes throughout the flight to Brandon. With half of the kids getting to fly, we arrived at Brandon. After completing the required checks and three touch-and-goes, the remainder of the kids got to fly on the way home.

Back in Winnipeg, it was one touch-and-go with a fly-over of the city to a landing. Some of the kids had really good co-ordination while flying, so watch out Sqn pilots—we might have found some replacements for you!

Capt Foley taxied the CC-130 back to the ramp and, after thanking him and his crew, the kids and their parents called it a day well past 1830.

Overall, Bring Your Kid to Work Day was a resounding success. The kids enjoyed the hands-on aspect of the day, especially the actual flying of the Hercules. Also, I think it made some of the kids realize the hours that their parent can put in during the day. On the way home, my son said, "Now I know why sometimes you come home tired and don't want to do anything, or go anywhere. Not to mention if you had a bad day you can be cranky as well."

I wish, once again, to thank all those who gave their time for briefings, demonstrations, etc. You are all named in this article. If I have forgotten anyone, my apologies.

Flight Philately

FIRST FLIGHT - WRIGHT BROTHERS - 1903

Many stamp collectors collect by topic and theme, aiming to collect stamps, covers and related items on one topic.

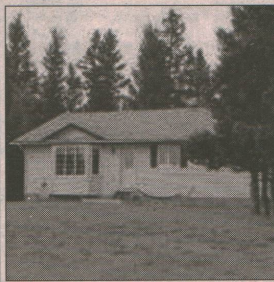
A topic that has been popular through the years is airplanes and flight. Many collectors save covers with special postmarks that commemorate such events as first flights and aviation anniversaries.

The past year offered two significant events that saw the issue of related stamps.

Concorde first carried passengers in 1976; twenty Concordes were built, with fourteen flying commercially. Concorde flights were profitable, but with the aircraft approaching thirty years of age a large investment programme would have been necessary to



update many of the systems on board the aircraft. As a result, the decision was made to take Concorde out of service, with the last commercial flights in October 2003. The aircraft are retiring to museums, and a number of countries have issued stamps to honour this airplane. One hundred years ago last month, the Wright brothers made the first controlled, powered, sustained flight in a heavier-than-air flying machine. The US Post Office, along with many others, issued a stamp to mark the anniversary.

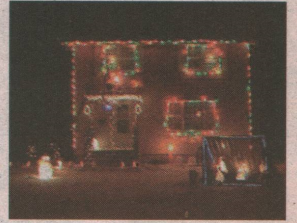

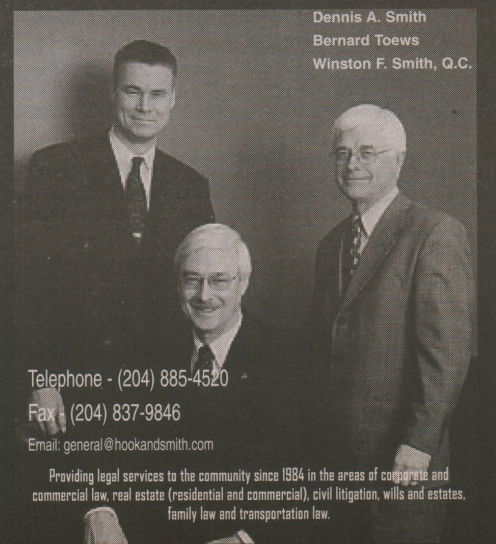

Chapel Gives Early Christmas Gift to MFRC Childcare Centre

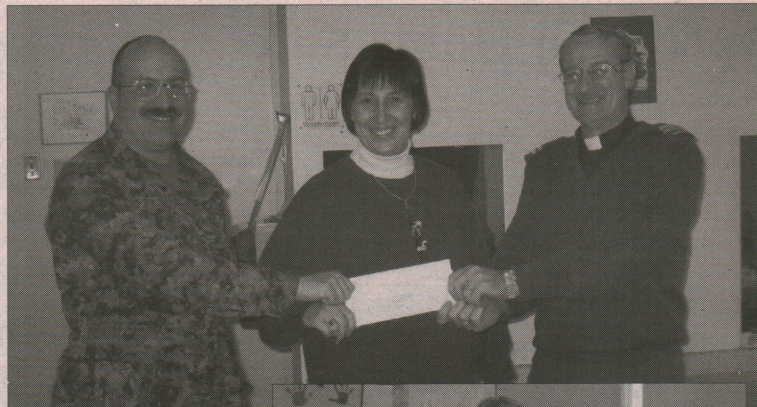

Over 70 happy children will be even happier this year thanks to a \$500 donation given to the Military Family Resource Centre (MFRC) Childcare Centre. The donation was presented to Lois Johnson, Director of the Childcare Centre, by 17 Wing's Chapel of the Good Shepherd Protestant congregation on December 16.

Johnson says the money will go towards installing Plexiglas over certain battered walls in the Centre. "It not only will protect certain areas, but it's also sort of a play source—the children will be able to paint the Plexiglas and put pictures on it without destroying the walls."

According to Johnson, Plexiglas walls are becoming popular in daycares around Winnipeg because they are fun to decorate and easy to clean. "At first I thought it was going to be hard to decide what to spend the money on," she admits, "but I like this idea because it benefits the whole Centre and every age of children. This is actually more than just a toy, it's going to keep our building looking really tidy and neat as well as being used as play material for the children."

Chapel Committee, says that the MFRC Childcare Centre was a natural recipient for Chapel funds. "We have to disperse most of the funds we take in every year, either to wider missions or local missions, and we wanted to do something that was for the local community that immediately surrounds the Chapel."

"There are a lot of military members that have their children in our day care here and there are a lot of folks that live in the area that aren't military but have kids here," he explains. "We thought it was a good way to benefit our local community."

According to Capt Muralt, the holidays are an especially busy time for the Wing Chapel, and the donation to



the Childcare Centre is one of many distributed to organizations around Winnipeg and the world.

"We're very fortunate that unlike most civilian churches or chapels, we don't have to pay for the heat, the lights, the Chaplain or things like this," he says. "We start thinking about what we're going to do at the end of the year in October, and we start examining how we're going to disperse the funds that we have. The end of the year also coincides with Christmas and there's a lot of need

in the community around Christmas."

Johnson says she is thrilled with the support the Childcare Centre has received from the Chapel and the Wing not only at Christmas but also throughout the year. "I can't express how happy I am that the Centre has always received huge base support and huge support from the MFRC. We've been open since January 2000 and we've done nothing but grow and become better and better."

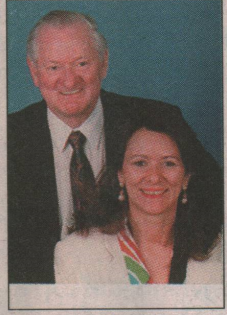
