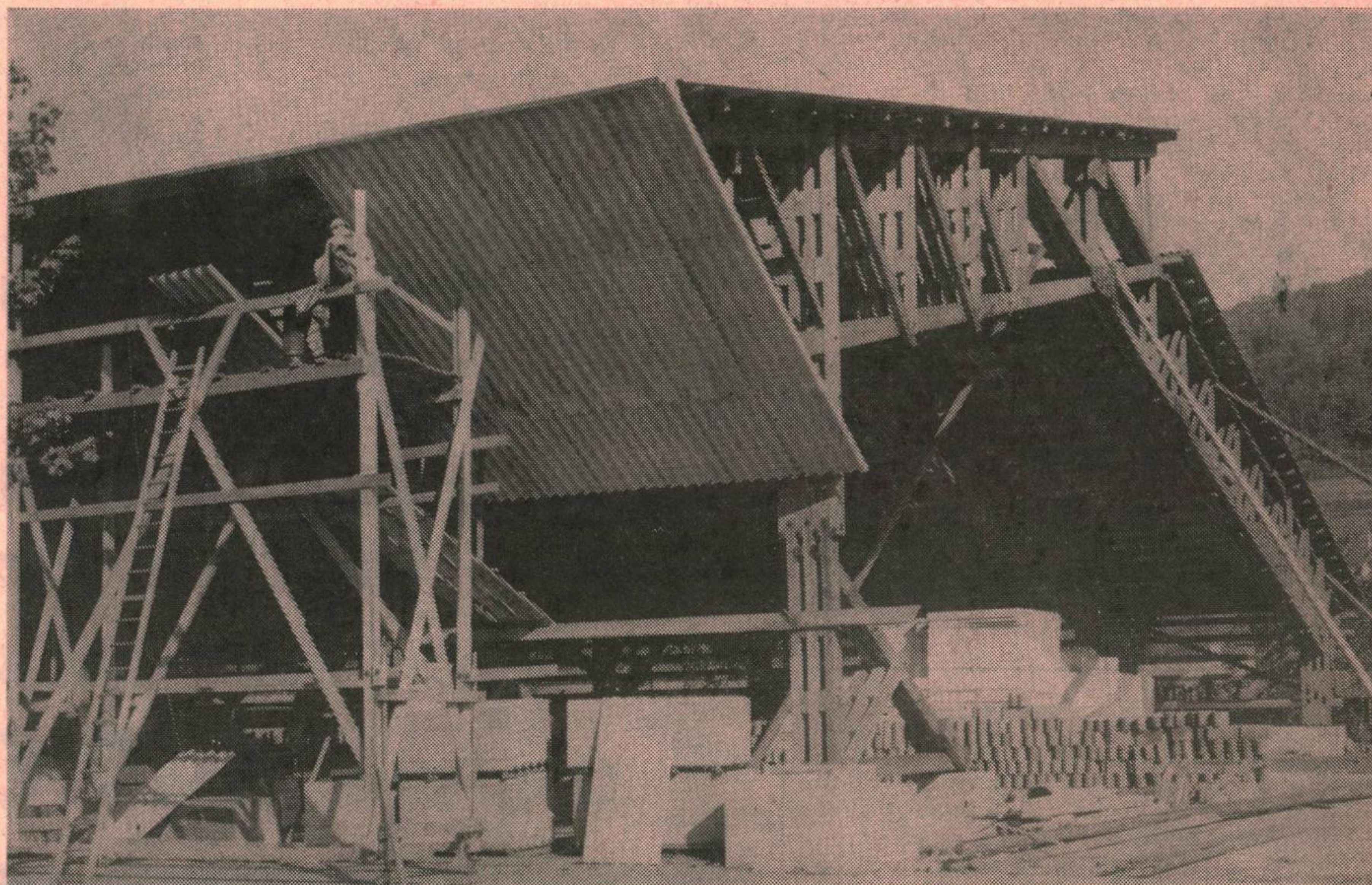

BAYREUTH FESTIVAL 1969

The Richard Wagner Festival 1969 in Bayreuth will be held again from July 25 to August 28 and is to open with a production of "The Flying Dutchman", to be repeated on August 5, 8, 19, 23 and 27. "Parsifal" will be performed four times (July 26, August 6, 21 and 26). "Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg" seven times (July 27, August 4, 7, 9, 20, 24 and 28) and "Tristan and Isolde" three times (July 28, August 11 and 25). The two performances of the entire "Ring des Nibelungen" are scheduled for July 29 and 30 and August 1 and 3 as well as for August 13, 14, 16 and 18.

In Switzerland Buses Climb Mountains

Each year increasing numbers of visitors to Switzerland reach the top of its highest mountains on Swiss alpine postal motor coaches. These yellow buses carry passengers and mail on roads that literally snake around, through and over the Alps.

Many of the countless thousands of travelers who have looked down at the scenic Swiss valley from one of these coaches perched 1,000 feet up on the shoulder of a winding road have wondered about the special skills and abilities of the drivers. Tourists have seen them negotiate lofty heights, tortuous twisting roads and squeeze between a car on one side and a caravan of dog carts on the other. In addition to these demanding feats the drivers use a public address system to keep their passengers informed of landmarks and attractions passed on the trip.

The vigorous training and study required for a man to qualify to drive a Swiss postal motor coach is almost as strenuous as that given to an airline pilot. The prospective driver must serve a four-year apprenticeship as a mechanic and at least one accident-free year

Flyers Top Shape Tells on Arrows

HOCKEY SNIPINGS: Bud Kelley's Flyers showed why they are leading the three-team Air Division Hockey League in their superior conditioning and scoring power, particularly in the second period when they rammed home five straight goals to erase a 3-0 deficit... Both goalies played without protective face masks but the other players all wore helmets. Both teams were inclined to throw body checks and it was telling on both sides... Forward Ray Lampron of the Arrows was hurt twice during the game. The first time was at the eight minute mark of the second period when he got a small cut on the cheek. He hurt his leg in the period and was forced to leave the game... Dean Lucier, playing left wing

on the Flyers first line is a member of the United States Air Force based Ramstein... Noel Wolgar, Don McKenzie and George Sudletsky looked after official scoring, timing and PA... Opening ceremonies were conducted by Rudy Berger who did an excellent job in German and English... Col Christie, CO of 1 Wing, cut the red ribbon at center ice to officially open the Arrowhead Arena while Lahr's Lord Mayor, Dr. Brucker, officially dropped the first puck in other opening game ceremonies. The Lahr Pipe Band was also in attendance and provided pre-game music to the more than 1,000 onlookers... Rink officials were hampered between periods in the absence of hot water for flooding purposes. It was a case of back to the old system of manual scrapers and the two-wheeled water barrel which meant a much longer intermission than usual. This was particularly noticeable up in the CFN radiobooth as the "Hot Stovers" strove to carry on interesting conversation to those listening to the game at home throughout the network. Ron Schilders did a commendable job as "Voice of the Arrows" for his first endeavour this season, assisted by "color man" John Lenehan... "Hats off" to Arrows' Public Relations Director Harry Ellis and Publicity Alex Ewing for a fine eight-page program which was handed out gratis. The well wishes by Major General Lane, Col Christie and Lord Mayor Dr. Bruecker were all very appropriate and, in particular, that of the latter, in which he stated, "We are proud that the 1 Wing team will in future bear the name Lahr Arrows as this shows us again that the Canadians posted here feel truly associated with our population..." Arena officials had an unsuccessful time in trying to keep the eager "standees" from leaning over the boards during the game, and conceivably being hit by a wayward stick or player... The *Lahrer Zeitung* and *Lahr, Anzeiger* reporters were also in attendance as well as members of the German radio and TV... German fans were provided with a copy of the rules in German and this is something that PR Harry Ellis is going to further in future copies of programs for Arrows' home games... The LIHL will open its schedule the day after New Years on Thursday evening, 2 January 1969 with all six teams in action. Games are to be played each Monday and Thursday nights... At the time this was being written (Tuesday), minor hockey was to commence tomorrow (Saturday), but this will depend on whether the facilities will be in sufficient condition to allow for full or part-time operation of the Arena... Another exhibition contest, this time a European team, has been mentioned as the next attraction on the rink against the Lahr Arrows. More word on this will undoubtedly come via Don Wickstrom's "Recreation Report" over Radio CFN... A Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to you all.

Christmas Recipes...

SANTA CLAUS SALAD

1 pkg. lemon-flavored gelatin, 2 c. minus 2 Tbsp. boiling water, 6 or 7 canned pear halves drained, Raisins, Pimiento, Lettuce, Cream cheese, Milk.

Dissolve gelatin in the boiling water. Pour half of the dissolved gelatin into 7x11 inch pan. Chill until firm. Arrange pear halves cut side down, on firm gelatin. Pour in remaining gelatin, leaving rounded surface of pear uncovered. Make a face on each pear, using plump raisins and bits of pimiento. Cut triangle of red pimiento and place above pear for a hat. (Features and hat will adhere better if dipped first in a little of the gelatin mixture). Chill overnight. Cut into squares one pear "face" per serving and place on lettuce. Soften cream cheese with milk whip until fluffy. Put cheese into a pastry tube. Starting at top of "head" at one side of Santa's hat, pipe the cheese to make white hair and whiskers. Serve salads at once. Recipe makes 6 or 7 servings.

ALMOND CHRISTMAS COOKIES

1 c. butter or margarine, 2 c. all-purpose flour, 1 tsp. vanilla, 1/4 c. confection sugar, 1 c. ground almonds, 18 maraschino cherries.

Cream butter with sugar. Add the rest of ingredients, except the cherries. Mix well with the hands. Take a heaping tsp. of dough and form into balls. Press in half of cherry and roll again into balls. Bake in slow oven 325 degrees for 35 mins. While still hot, roll in confection sugar. Color if desired.

CHRISTMAS SALADS

CRANBERRY * ORANGE SALAD

1 c. cranberries, 1 orange, 1/2 c. sugar, 1-3-oz. pkg. lemon or lime jelly powder.

Add 1 1/2 c. hot water to jelly powder. Stir well and cool till consistency of strained honey. Wash and dry cranberries. Put orange and cranberries through food chopper, fine disc. Mix in 1/2 c. sugar. Stir into jelly and chill till firm. Wonderful with Ham, Chicken, or roast.

PUDDING-SAUCE — Mix together 1 c. sugar and 1/2 c. cream. Heat but do not boil to dissolve the sugar. When ready to serve beat in 1/2 c. melted butter with a rotary beater and add 1 tsp. vanilla. Serve hot.

VEGETABLE SALAD

1 pkg. lime or lemon jello, 2 c. boiling water, 2 Tbsp. vinegar, 1 tsp salt, 1 c. chopped celery, 1 c. shredded cabbage, 1/2 c. grated carrot, 1 green pepper chopped.

Dissolve jello in boiling water. Add vinegar and salt. Place in refrigerator until mixture thickens, then fold in celery, cabbage, carrot and green pepper. Turn into mold and refrigerate until ready to serve. Unmold on crisp lettuce.

SHORTBREAD COOKIES

1/4 c. margarine, 1-4 oz. pkg. Cream Cheese, 1/4 c. sugar, 1 1/2 c. all-purpose flour, Candied cherries, cut in half, Sifted icing sugar, paper cake cups.

Mix margarine and cheese well until smooth and creamy. Add remaining ingredients, except cherries and icing sugar. Drop in little balls on greased sheets, bake at 325 F. for 15-20 mins. till done. Place in paper cup. Put 1/2 cherry on top and sprinkle with icing sugar.

STEAMED CRANBERRY PUDDING

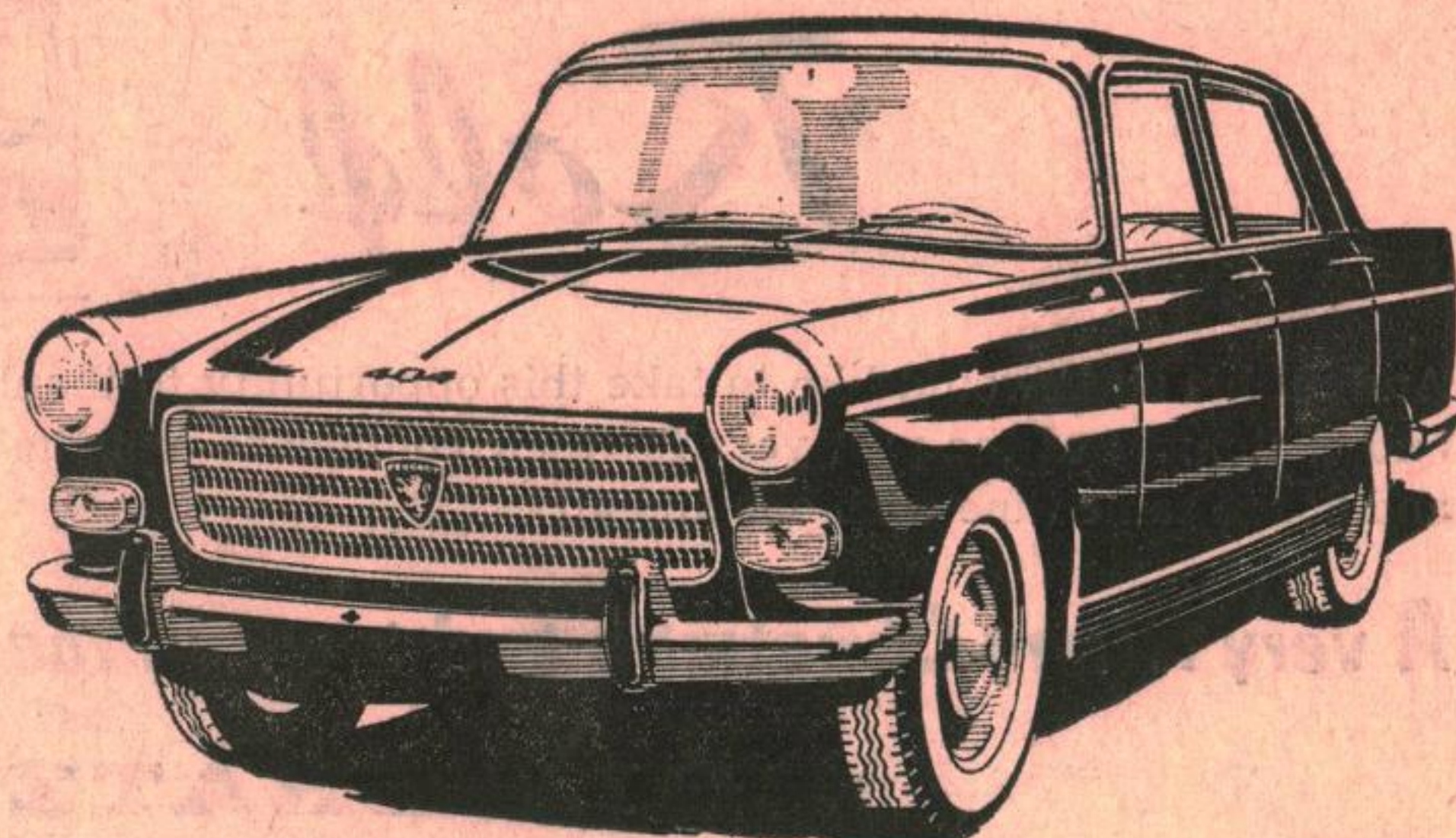
1 1/2 c. sifted all-purpose flour, 1 tsp. baking powder, 1/4 tsp. salt, 1/2 c. molasses, 1/2 c. warm water, 2 Tbsp. shortening (melted), 2 tsp. soda, 2/3 c. whole cranberry sauce drained.

Sift together flour, baking powder, and salt. Mix molasses warm water, melted shortening and soda and add to flour mixture. Fold in cranberry sauce. Pour into a greased 1 qt. mold and tie waxed paper loosely over the top. Steam 2 hours. Unmold on serving platter. Serve hot with pudding sauce. — 8 servings.

MOLDED WALDORF SALAD

1 pk. lime or apple jelly powder, 1 c. boiling water, 1/2 c. cold water, 1 1/2 c. diced apples, 1/4 c. diced celery, 1/4 c. chopped pecans, 1 c. miniature marshmallows, 1/4 c. mayonnaise, 1/4 c. whipping cream.

Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Add cold water and chill until slightly thickened. Combine apples, celery, pecans, marshmallows and mayonnaise. When jello mixture is of egg white consistency fold in apple mixture and then fold into whipped cream, turn into a four cup mold and chill until firm.

A Christmas Hint...

CANDLE WAX

Scrape off as much wax as possible with a dull knife. Soak stain in cleaning fluid. Launder. To remove candle drips from furniture, harden the wax by holding an ice cube on it. Carefully scrape with fingernail or rubber bowl scraper. Rub briskly with soft cloth.

And Just In Case...

BURNT PANS

If you're ever bothered by burn marks or burnt material inside of your pots and pans, try this remedy. Pour baking soda on the burnt, part fill the bottom of the utensil with water, bring to a boil and then allow to simmer with the lid on. This remedy is also good for removing scum and marks from the inside of thermos bottles. Fill the bottle with boiling water and add baking soda immediately. Then empty the thermos. Another home remedy to remove burnt grease etc. from the inside of pans, is to dampen the pan, then pour DUTCH CLEANSER (or any other commercial cleaner) over the burnt area. Allow to stand for at least three to four hours, and then clean. One reader suggested the following remedy for removing burnt material from the bottom of pots and pans. A very fine sand paper rubbed on the burn will remove it, without scratching your pots, she claimed.

BURNT GREASE: To remove burnt grease from under pots and pans and electric frying pans:

1. Electric frying pans are particularly difficult to clean, because of the many ridges, nooks and crannies underneath. But, here is a solution submitted by a reader apply a paste of vinegar and AJAX (or other household cleaning agent) to the stain. Allow the mixture to stand for a few hours, then scour with steel wool.

2. To rid any type of pot or pan (other than porcelain) of that film of grease that accumulates on the bottom, then gets baked on a reader suggested the following method. "SOS" pads or oven cleaner and lots of elbow grease. For copper bottom pots, use a copper cleaner. For porcelain pots, good results are reported with household bleach, applied inside and out.

3. If the pot is made of cast iron or steel, try this method. Crumple up a good amount of newspapers in your incinerator garbage can. Place the pot on top of the newspapers, and set fire to the paper. This will burn off the accumulated grease. Do not use this method on aluminium or chrome pots for obvious reasons.

Handy Hint For 1 January...

LIPSTICK STAINS

Here's another stain which is extremely difficult to remove because of its complex makeup. Many readers depend upon commercial stain removers such as LUSTRE SHEEN, PIN-SOL, STANLEY HOME CLEANER.

However, one homemaker had tried with a great deal of success, a product called LIP-O-REM, which she also claimed was effective in removing fingernail polish. Other suggestions include rubbing with a slice of white bread, or soften with vaseline or lard before sponging with a cleaning fluid.

According to a stain removal booklet I have in my possession, the following procedure is recommended to remove cosmetic, eye shadow, lipstick, liquid make-up, mascara, pancake make-up, powder, or rouge. For washable articles apply undiluted liquid detergent to the stain. Or dampen the stain and rub in soap or synthetic detergent until a thick suds is formed. Work in until outline of the stain is gone before rinsing. Repeat the procedure if necessary. It may help to dry the fabric between treatments as well. For non-washable articles sponge with a grease solvent as long as any colour is removed. If the stain is not removed, use the method given above for washable articles.

And Don't Forget...

FIRE PREVENTION

Decorative Lighting — Light sets or individual lights shall be approved by either CSA, UL, UL of Canada or other recognized testing and approval authority.

A. Each year, before using, check lighting sets for frayed wires, loose connections and broken sockets.

B. Wiring for such decorative purposes shall not be coaxed under rugs, or suspended or otherwise supported in contact with metal.

C. Wiring should be supported by friction tape, strong cord or approved insulated staples or clips.

Candles —

A. Do not use wax candles on the tree or in the vicinity of the tree where there is any change for an open flame to contact the tree or any combustibles located in the vicinity of the tree.

B. At social events or parties where paper streamers or other similar combustibles will form part of the decor or will be used or thrown, candles shall not be used. This is not intended to preclude the use of candles at mess dinners or other formal dinner parties.
