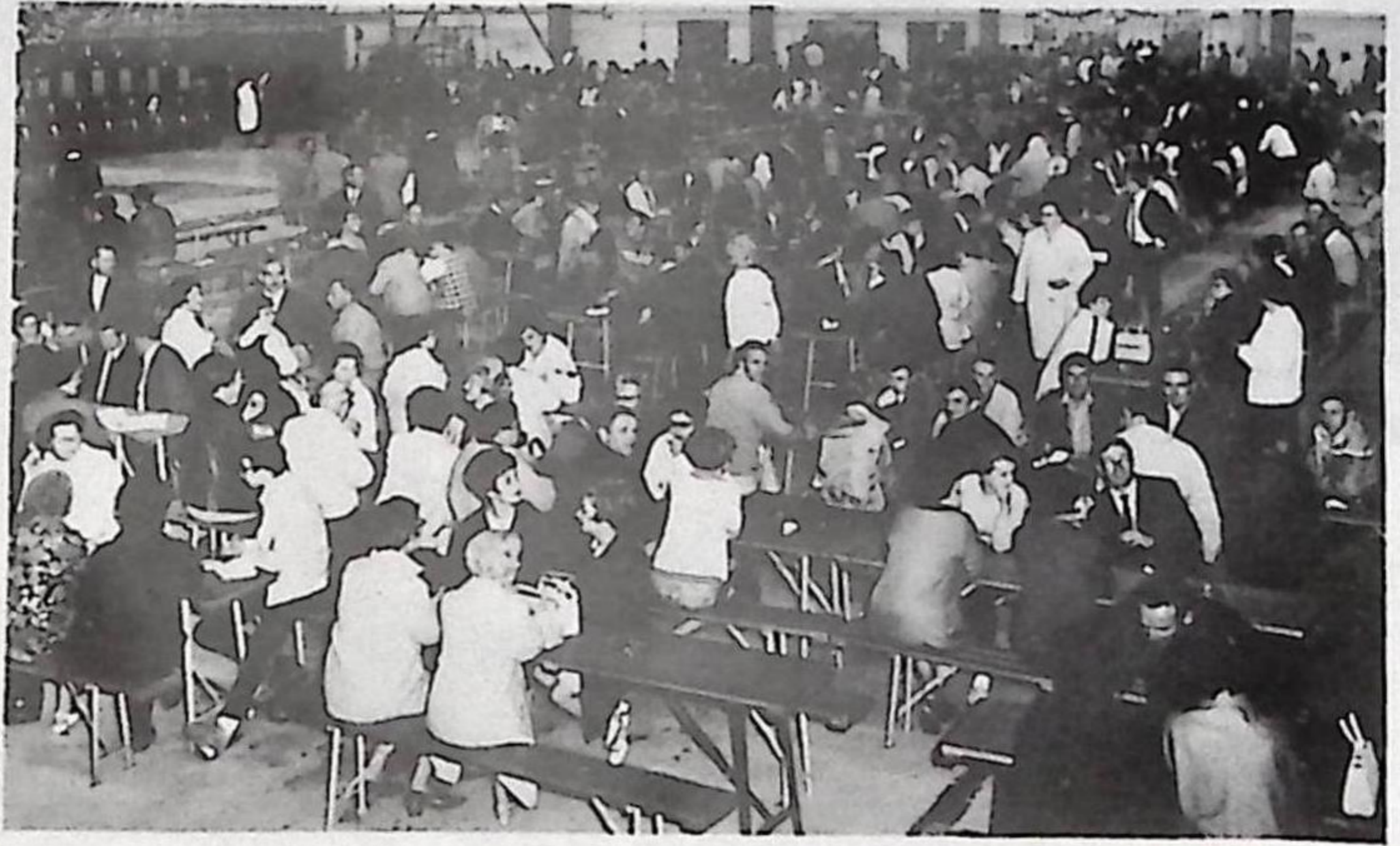

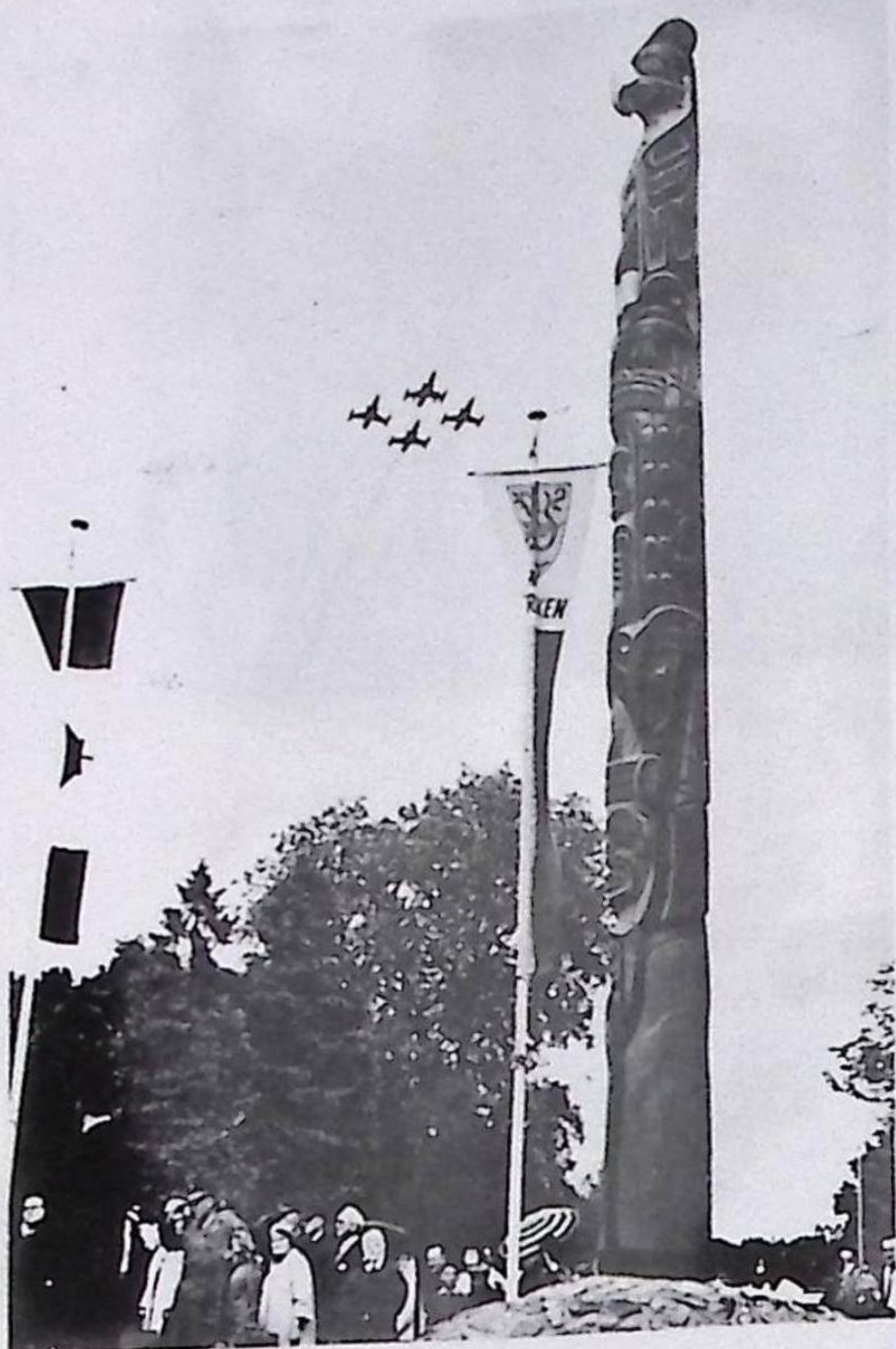

EDITORIAL

THE FIRST EDITION OF ANY PAPER IS AN EVENT TO BE LOOKED FORWARD TO AS AN OCCASION.

This being our first edition of "FLUGPLATZ", we feel that it is expedient to point out the importance of maintaining good relations with the German populace. The actions of a few irresponsibles can and have jeopardized the good name and reputation we Canadians enjoyed in the Zweibrücken locale.

Whether we warranted the respect of the German people by virtue of our integrity as a class, or whether we were merely accorded it as a change from the Occupation Forces, this writer does not profess to know. We had it; now we're losing it.

The preservation of the goodwill of our German hosts depends solely on the behaviour of each Canadian here. Our conduct downtown and on the station is subject to close scrutiny at all times. Breaches of military etiquette are noted and used as a topic of conversation.

Lack of self-discipline evidenced by loud-mouthed profanity can also help to lower respect for Canadians as a whole. Profanity is recognizable in any language.

Alcohol is probably the chief undermining agency that works against our efforts to promote harmony. Words uttered and actions committed while "under the influence" can cause grave damage to the good faith that exists between the two nationalities.

Contrary to popular conception, liquor does not give a man the licence to do things that he would refrain from doing while sober. It is his deeds that go on record with the civil population, not his state of mental non-awareness at the

GENERAL ELECTION

ON AUGUST 10 THE PEOPLE OF CANADA WILL ELECT A NEW GOVERNMENT.

Voting by Canadian Forces electors will take place on each of the six days from Monday, 3 August, to Saturday, 8 August 1953, inclusive.

The Canadian Forces Voting Regulations state that, to be qualified for a vote, a member of the Canadian Forces must have reached the age of 21, and have completed a Statement of Ordinary Residence.

The location of polling booths on this unit, together with the hours fixed for voting, will be published in Daily Routine Orders during the whole of the voting period.

CANADIAN ARMED FORCES RADIO SCRIPT NEWS BY THE CANADIAN PRESS.

MOSPORT, ONT--BRUCE MCLAREN OF NEW ZEALAND, HAS WON THE FIRST LEG OF THE CANADIAN-AMERICAN CHALLENGE CUP SERIES IN MOSPORT, ONT. HIS TEAM-MATE AND FELLOW-COUNTRYMAN, DENNIS HULME, FINISHED SECOND TO MAKE IT ONE-TWO FOR MCLAREN IN THE 200-MILE RACE. JOHN SURTEES OF ENGLAND, ALSO DRIVING A MCLAREN CAR, PLACED THIRD. A CROWD OF MORE THAN 44,200 WATCHED THE RACE, OPENER OF THE ELEVEN EVENT CAN-AM SERIES FOR ONE MILLION DOLLARS IN PRIZE AND ACCESSORY MONEY. HULME AND MCLAREN LED THE RACE FOR ALL BUT THREE OF THE 80 LAPS AROUND THE 2.5-MILE MOSPORT ROAD TRACK. CALIFORNIAN, DAN GURNEY PRESSED HARD IN EARLY LAPS BUT DROPPED OUT ON THE 49TH LAP WITH SUSPENSION TROUBLE.

THE 25-THOUSAND TON FREIGHTER TADOUSSAC IS RIDING SERENELY AT THE FOOT OF ITS RAMP AT COLLINGWOOD AS OFFICIALS PREPARE TO INVESTIGATE ITS PREMATURE LAUNCHING JUNE 30. AN ONTARIO LABOR DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAYS IT WILL TAKE A WEEK TO CLEAR AWAY DEBRIS FROM THE ACCIDENT AS A PRELIMINARY INTO THE RESPONSIBILITY AND NO FEDERAL OFFICIALS ARE PARTICIPATING. THE ACCIDENT TOOK THE LIVES OF TWO MEN AND INJURED 40 OTHERS. OFFICIALS OF COLLINGWOOD SHIPYARDS, A DIVISION OF CANADIAN SHIPBUILDING AND ENGINEERING LIMITED, TODAY SEALED OFF THE YARD FOR THE INVESTIGATION. THEY SAID THE COMPANY IS SATISFIED THAT ADEQUATE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS WERE TAKEN. THE ACCIDENT OCCURRED AS 200 MEN WERE DRIVING THE LAST WEDGES TO SHORE UP THE VESSEL 15 MINUTES BEFORE ITS SCHEDULED LAUNCHING. MOST ESCAPED INJURY BY SCRAMBLING OUT OF THE WAY AS THE 730-FOOT VESSEL SLID SIDEWAYS. THE BODY OF 47-YEAR-OLD ALVIN WAGER OF CRREMORE WAS FOUND TODAY AND THAT OF 48-YEAR-OLD DOUGLAS MAY LAST NIGHT. NINE MEN WERE ADMITTED TO HOSPITAL, THREE WITH SERIOUS INJURIES. THIRTY-ONE WERE RELEASED AFTER TREATMENT. COLLINGWOOD COUNCIL OFFICIALS HAVE EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SHIPYARD'S FUTURE. IT EMPLOYS 800 OF THE TOWN'S 85 HUNDRED RESIDENTS. THE TADOUSSAC WAS THE YARD'S ONLY UNFINISHED CONTRACT. COLLINGWOOD IS ON NOTTAWASAGO BAY, 72 MILES NORTH-WEST OF TORONTO.

OTTAWA--A GOVERNMENT BILL TO INCREASE PRICE COMPETITION FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS WAS APPROVED WITHOUT AMENDMENT BEHIND CLOSED DOORS BY THE SENATE COMMERCE COMMITTEE MAY 27. SENATOR SALTER HAYDEN, LIBERAL MEMBER FOR ONTARIO AND COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN, SAID AFTER THE CLOSED MEETING THAT THE BILL HAD RECEIVED APPROVAL SUBJECT TO READING INTO COMMITTEE MINUTES CERTAIN ASSURANCES FROM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENTS FOOD AND DRUG DIRECTORATE. THE BILL, WHICH HAS BEEN PASSED IN THE COMMONS AND NOW NEEDS ONLY SENATE THIRD READING AND ROYAL ASSENT, WOULD ENABLE THE GOVERNMENT TO GRANT LICENCES TO PERMIT MANUFACTURE OF PATENTED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS BY COMPANIES WHICH DO NOT HAVE THE PATENT. THE GOVERNMENT WOULD ALSO HAVE THE POWER TO ALLOW COMPANIES TO IMPORT COMPETITIVE TRADE-MARK DRUGS. THE BILL IS DESIGNED TO PERMIT GREATER COMPETITION AND THUS BRING ABOUT LOWER PRICES FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. SEVERAL SENATORS SPOKE AGAINST THE BILL IN EARLIER MEETINGS ON THE GROUNDS THAT IT DID NOT CONTAIN SUFFICIENT SAFEGUARDS AGAINST THE PRODUCTION OR IMPORTING OF SUBSTANDARD IMITATIONS OF THE ORIGINAL PATENT.

THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT MOVED MAY 28 TO INSTALL A MAJOR FEDERAL PRESENCE IN HULL, LONG OTTAWA'S POOR QUEBEC RELATIVE, IN THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION. REGIONAL EXPANSION MINISTER MARCHAND ANNOUNCED THE GOVERNMENT WILL RE-DEVELOP HULL'S CORE AT A COST OF MORE THAN 100 MILLION DOLLARS--AND POSSIBLY 200 MILLION DOLLARS--IN THE NEXT 25 YEARS. MR. MARCHAND ANNOUNCED 25 PER CENT OF NEW FEDERAL ACCOMMODATION CONSTRUCTION WILL GO TO THE PREDOMINANTLY FRENCH SPEAKING CITY OF 60 THOUSAND. HE SAID PUBLIC BUILDINGS WILL GO UP ON 15 ACRES OF EXPROPRIATED DOWNTOWN LAND AND THAT WORK ON THE FIRST BUILDING, HEADQUARTERS OF THE MANPOWER AND IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT, WILL BEGIN AS SOON AS FEASIBLE. THE HEADQUARTERS BUILDINGS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISHERIES AND FORESTRY AND CONSUMER AND CORPORATE AFFAIRS WILL FOLLOW. ALL THREE WILL BE UP IN FIVE YEARS AND EVENTUALLY 36 THOUSAND FEDERAL CIVIL SERVANTS WILL WORK IN HULL, WHERE ABOUT HALF THE FEDERAL WORK FORCE IN OTTAWA BUILDINGS NOW LIVES. CONSERVATIVE LEADER ROBERT STANFIELD WELCOMED THE GOVERNMENT MOVE. HE SAID HE SUPPORTS THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE NATIONAL CAPITAL AS A SYMBOL OF CANADA WITH HULL AS AN INTEGRAL PART.

CANADA WILL BREAK OFF RELATIONS WITH THE NATIONALIST CHINESE GOVERNMENT ON FORMOSA IF THIS COUNTRY RECOGNIZES COMMUNIST CHINA. THIS STATEMENT CAME MAY 28 FROM EXTERNAL AFFAIRS MINISTER SHARP IN EPLY TO OPPOSITION QUESTIONING IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS. HE SAID WE CAN'T RECOGNIZE BOTH FORMOSA AND PEKING AT THE SAME TIME AND CANADA'S POLICY IS ONE-CHINA POLICY. HE WAS ASKED IF NATIONALIST CHINA HAS INFORMED CANADA THAT IT WILL BREAK OFF RELATIONS WITH OTTAWA IF CANADA RECOGNIZES PEKING. MR. SHARP REPLIED THAT THE NATIONALISTS HAVE INDICATED THEY DISAGREE WITH CANADA'S NEGOTIATIONS WITH PEKING--BUT HAVE NOT GONE BEYOND THAT. ASKED IF CANADA ALSO WILL SUPPORT CHINA'S ENTRY INTO THE UNITED NATIONS, MR. SHARP SAID THAT WOULD BE THE CONSISTENT THING TO DO.

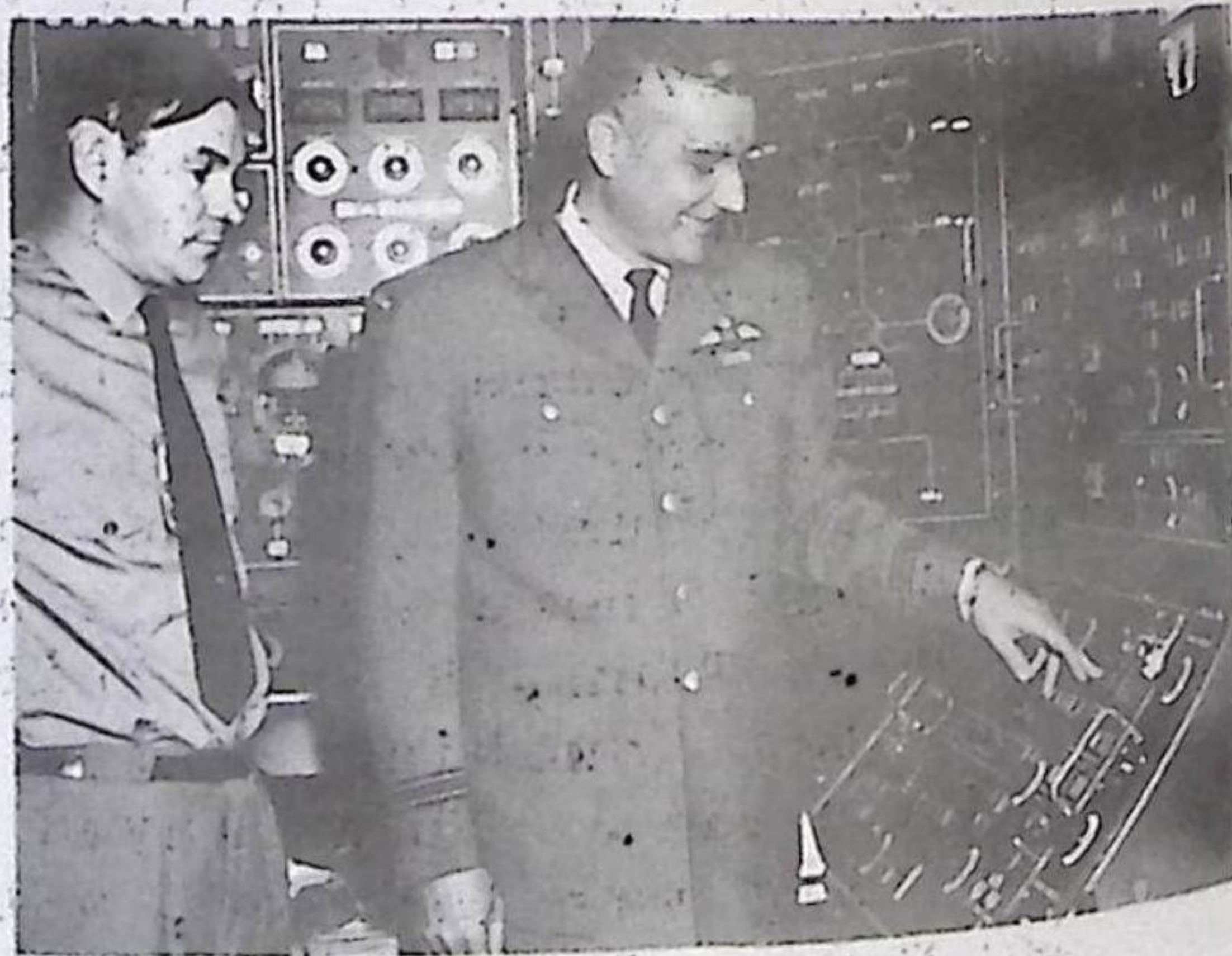

BRIGADIER-GENERAL DONAL C. LAUBMAN, DFC, CD



Brigadier-General D.C. Laubman was born in October 1921 and attended Edmonton schools, graduating from Strathcona High. He joined the RCAF in 1940 and after serving as a fighter pilot on Canada's west coast was sent overseas in 1943. With fighter squadrons overseas, he had an outstanding record, shooting down 15 enemy aircraft and being twice decorated with the distinguished flying cross.

In April 1945 he was shot down and taken prisoner of war, but was released shortly thereafter.

Leaving the RCAF for a few months, he returned in January 1946 and served on a number of flying and administrative assignments including command of 410 and 416 fighter squadrons.

He went overseas to serve at 1 Air Division Headquarters in May 1952 and was transferred to Air Force Headquarters in 1953 for duty in the chief of operational requirements.

In August 1956 he was selected to attend RCAF Staff College in Toronto, Ontario. Following completion of the course, he was appointed to the Canadian Joint Staff in Washington where he served in the directorate of requirements.

Brigadier-General Laubman was transferred to the directing staff of the Air Force College in Toronto in July 1960. In July 1963, he was appointed Commanding Officer, 3 Wing, Zweibrücken, Germany. In April 1967, he was promoted Air Commodore and appointed Director-General of Personnel Plans and Requirements. Upon reorganization of the Canadian Forces 1 Feb. 1968, he assumed the rank of brigadier-general and in November of the same year was appointed Director-General of Postings and Careers at Canadian Forces Headquarters in Ottawa.

Brigadier General Laubman will be promoted Major General and appointed Commander of 1 Canadian Air Division with Headquarters in Lahr, Germany, approximately 1 July. General Laubman replaces Maj Gen R. J. Lane, 49, of Victoria, who completes a normal three-year tour of duty as Commander of the Air Division this Summer.
