Computers now help us with our Supply Section and as the saying goes: An error is human, to really foul things up takes a computer.

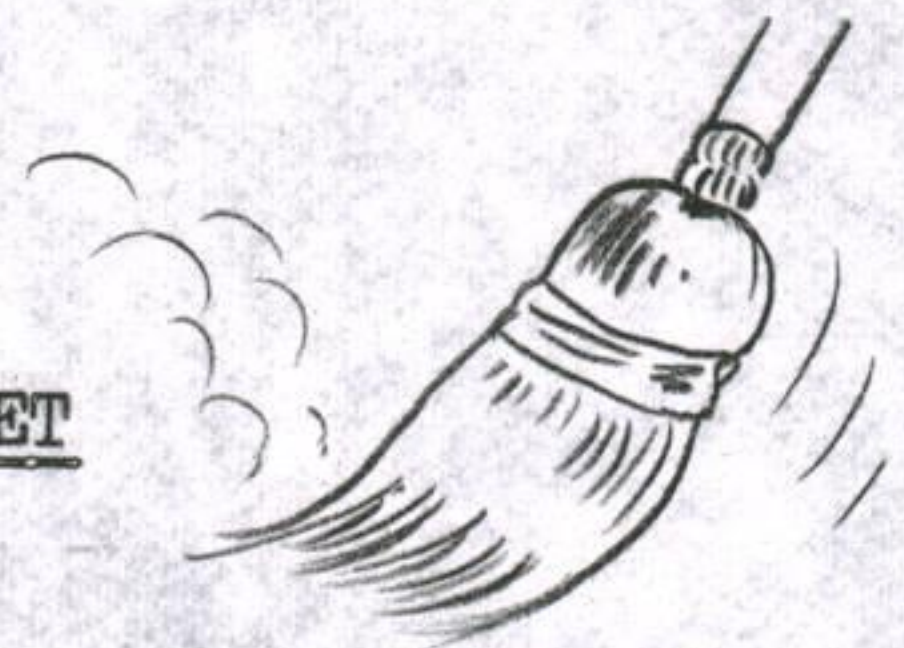

LOTRP - THE FACTS - NO MORE RUMOURS

There has been a lot of misconception, misinformation, and rumour over the past 5 or 6 months concerning LOTRP. Most of us don't know what it's all about and some of the rumours would be hilarious if they weren't so dangerous. Some of the ideas I've heard recently are so bad that they may even hurt our recruiting activities here in Saskatchewan.

Hopefully, this article will lay the rumours of a Feeder Trade (which no longer exists) to rest and let everyone know what's happening with LOTRP.

The aim of LOTRP - Land Operations Trade Reassignment Program - is to reduce unscheduled, premature attrition in the Canadian Forces...particularly the Combat Arms. The whole concept of the LOTRP package originated with the Report prepared for ADM (Per). It recognized the problem of Combat Arms servicemen who had negative preconceptions about their trades and status in relation to the rest of the CF Tradesmen. This doubt about their own value was increased every time they were tasked with a "dirty" job. That is, the dissatisfiers outweighed the satisfiers in their work compared to what they see in other CF jobs. I guess the grass does look greener on the other side.

Nevertheless, LOTRP was devised and applies only to Combat Arms trades. (Crewman 011, Artyman 021, Infantryman 031, Field Engineer 041). I specifically underline ONLY because one of those horrible rumours was that all new recruits joining the CAF would be enrolled into the Combat Arms. That simply is not so! Those people wishing to join the Combat Arms will be enrolled for 3 years - only. (All other trades sign a 5 year contract). After the soldier has served for 2½ years, he will be asked to make a choice. His options are:

1. to remain in the Combat Arms;
2. to get out of the CAF; or
3. to apply for trade reassignment to one of the 46 direct entry Designated Acceptor Trades.

This plan will also apply to serving members of the Combat Arms with more than 3 and less than 12 years service.

LOTRP has proven to be very successful. It appeals to many young men in Saskatchewan. It offers them a shorter engagement (3 years vice 5), an opportunity to get into a trade that appeals to them which may not be open when they apply at our Recruiting Centre, and for those who aren't really sure of what they want to do, it gives them a chance to experience the Armed Forces and look at the available trades to determine what job they would like as a career.

LOTRP was never designed so that all applicants would have to serve in the Combat Trades. Obviously, there are many tradesmen who wouldn't want to and probably couldn't serve well in the Combat Arms.

At the Recruiting Centre in Regina, LOTRP has proven to be very popular. We, like Centres all across Canada, have no trouble filling our limited number of Combat Arms openings. I hope that this short article will have explained LOTRP clearly and laid aside all of those erroneous rumours.

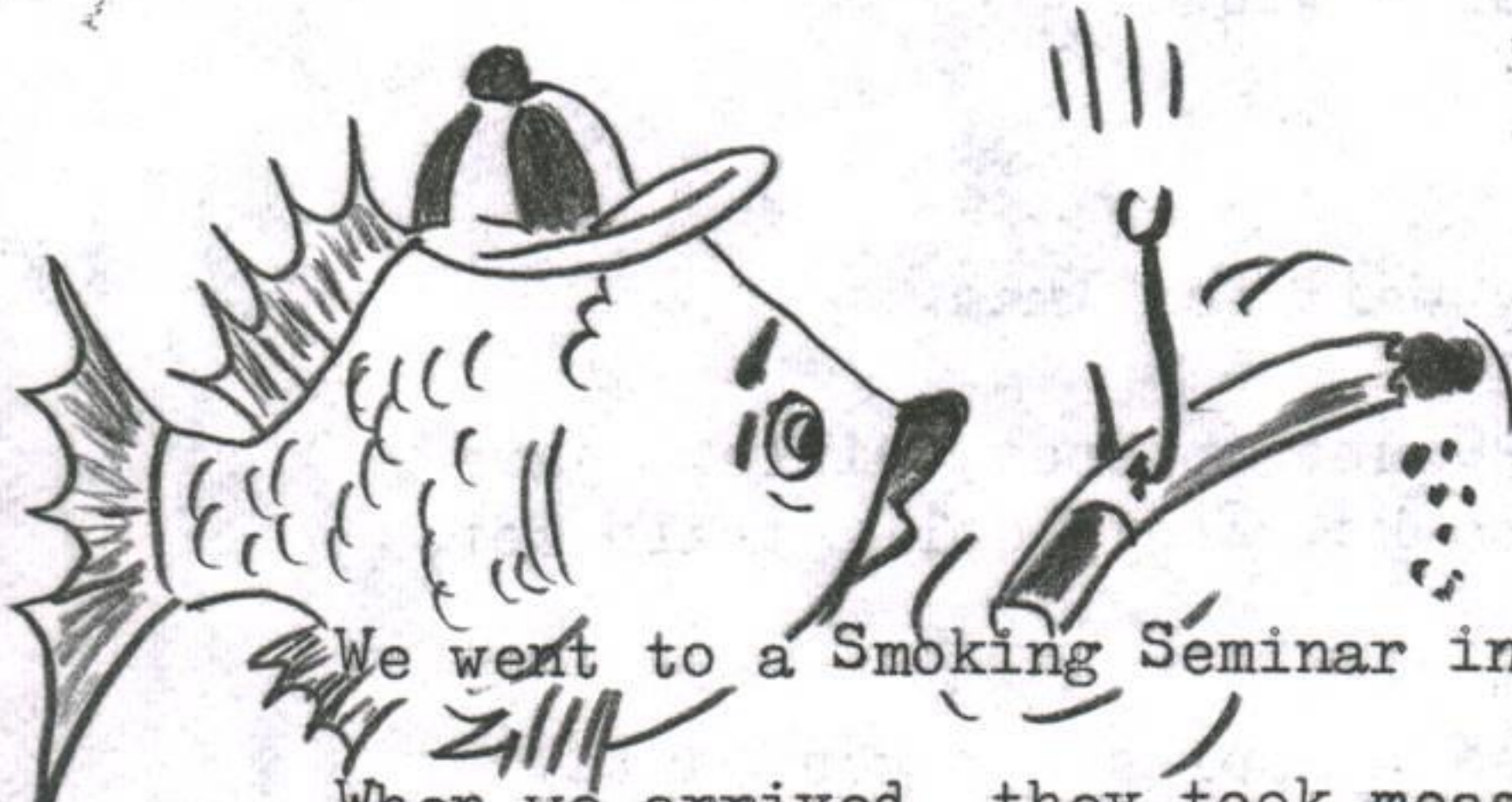

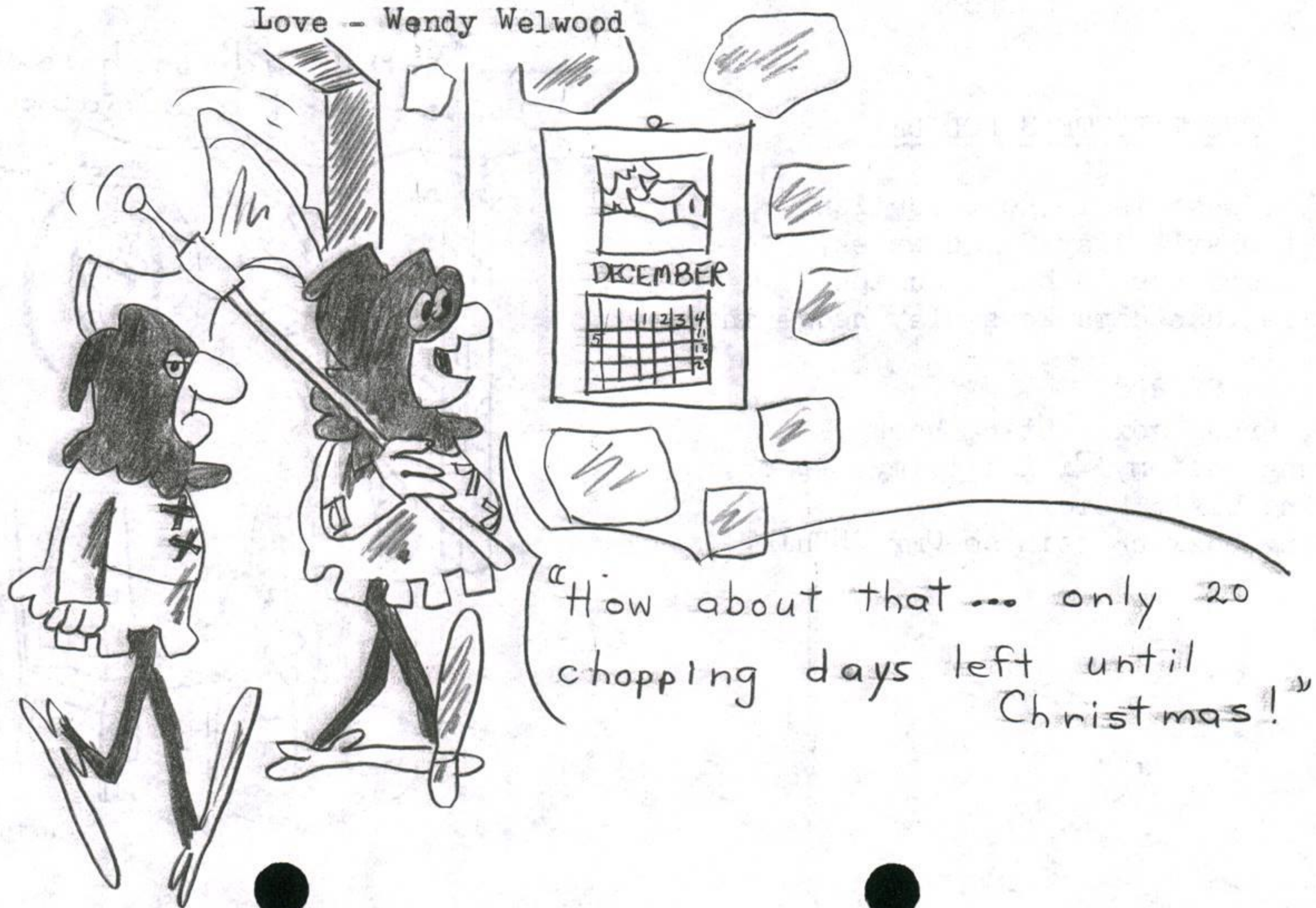

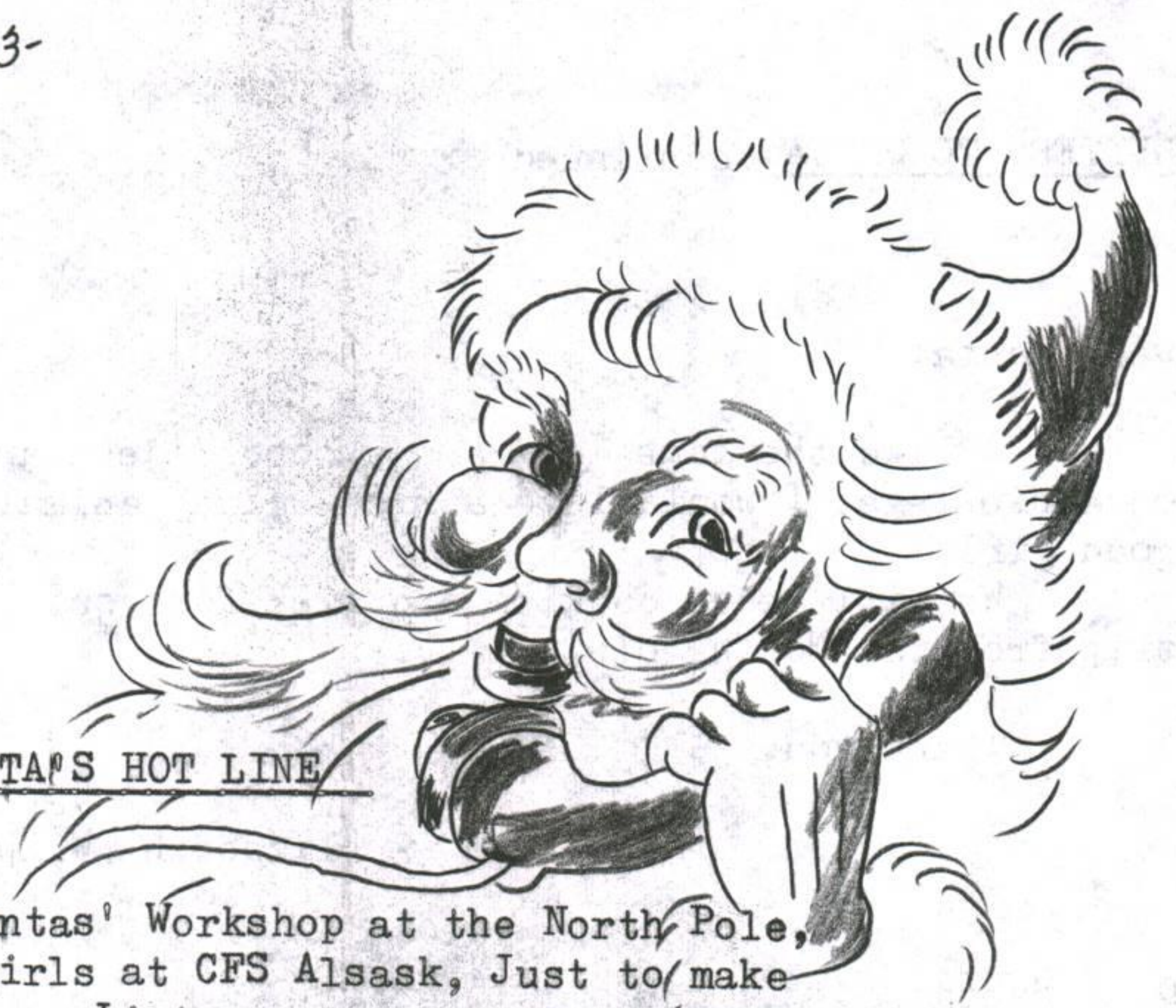
