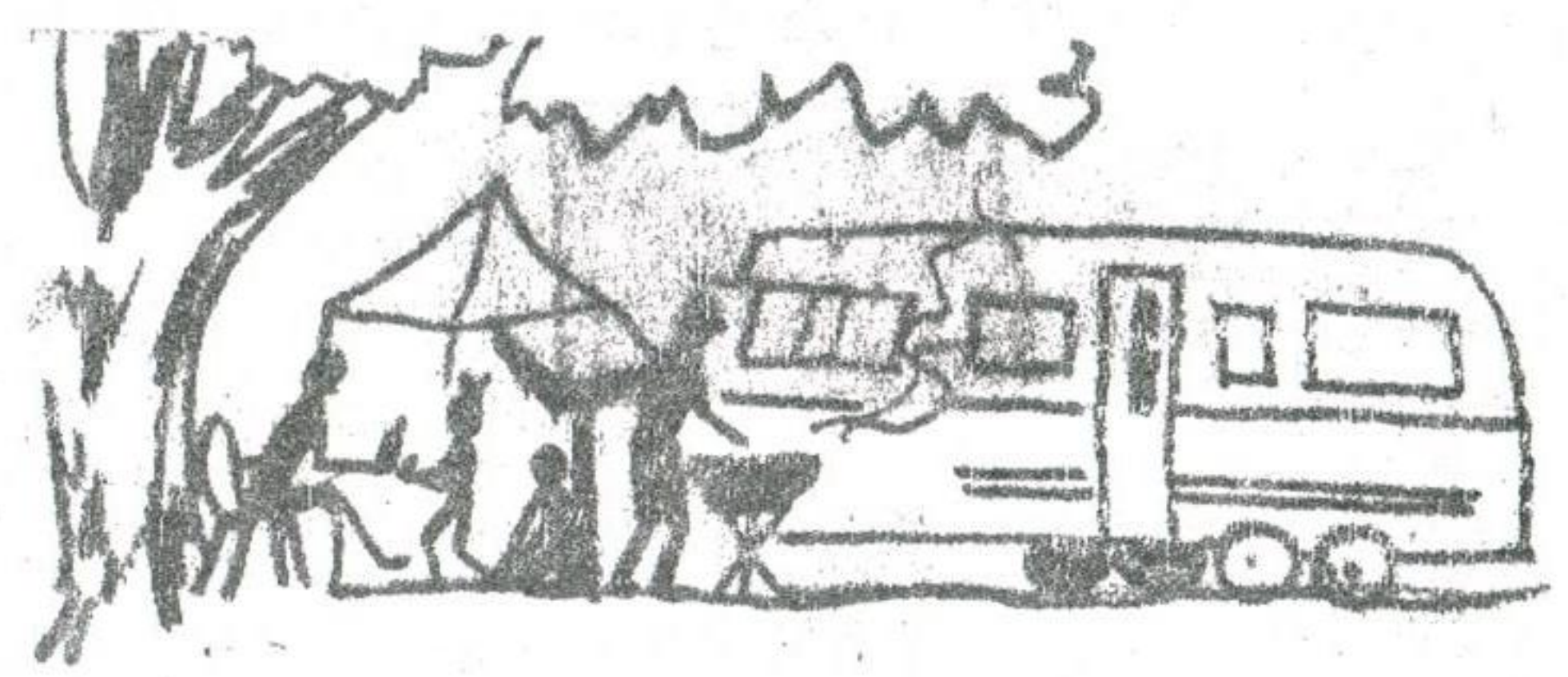

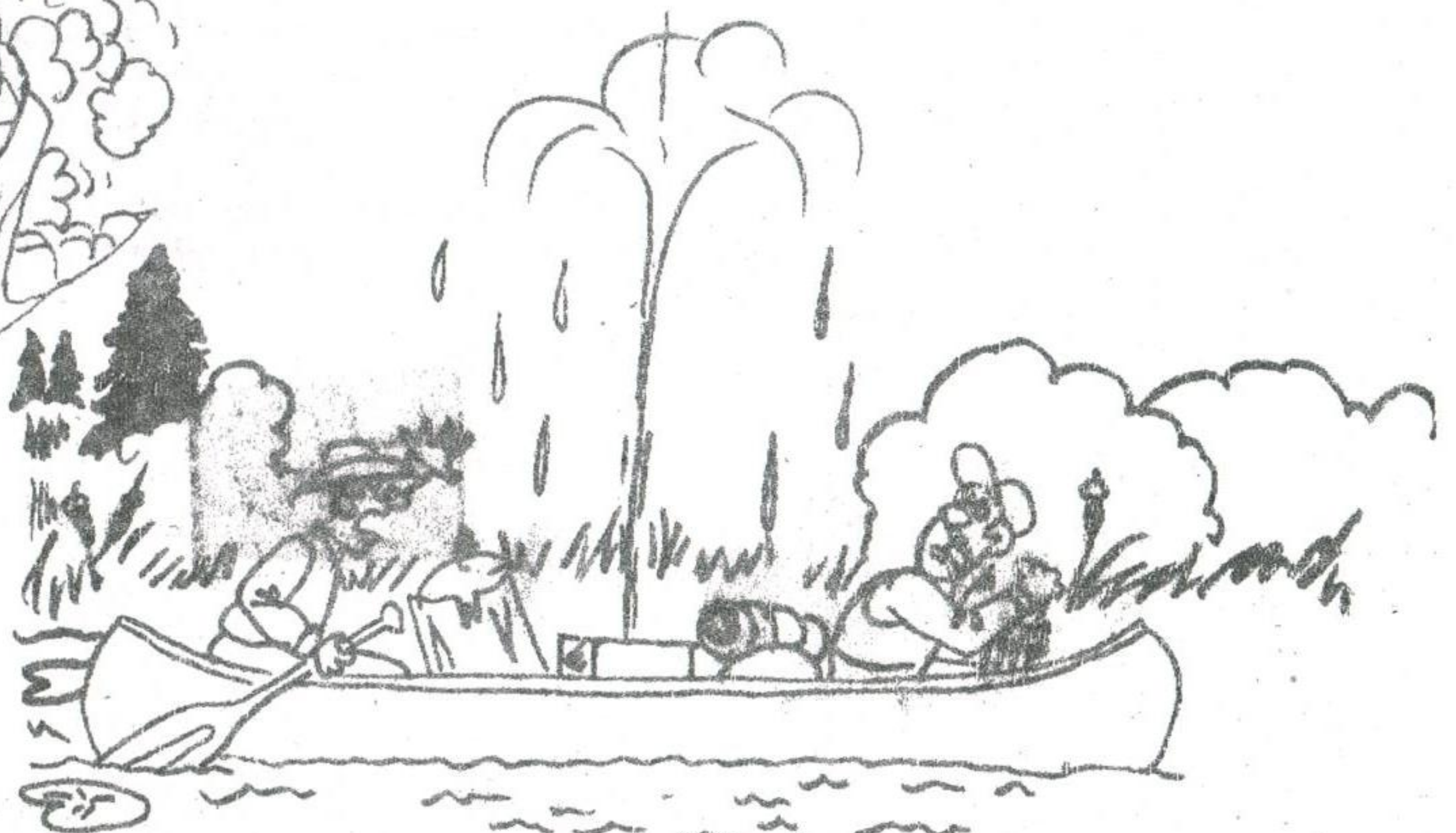

AROUND THE HOUSE

GRILL WORK

Pour enough briquettes into a grocery bag for one barbecue and fold it down. When you have a quantity of bags filled, pile one on top of the other until ready to barbecue. Then simply place one paper bag of briquettes in the barbecue and light. The charcoal will catch very quickly and you will have clean hands.

Add a delicious flavor to barbecuing by sprinkling the coals with fresh herbs that have been soaked in water first.

When flareups from fat drippings start to burn the meat, place lettuce leaves over the hot coals. Or keep a pan of water and a turkey baster next to the barbecue, and squirt water to put out flare-ups.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER

Never buy chicken on Monday. It is likely you will get one that was not bought by the weekend.

To keep fresh chicken fresher, immediately remove polyethylene wrap, loosely wrap chicken in waxed paper, and refrigerate. Fresh chicken should be used within three days.

Defrost a frozen chicken by soaking it in cold water that has been heavily salted. This draws out blood, and the breast meat will be pure white.

After flouring chicken, chill for one hour. The coating will adhere better during frying.

For an especially light and delicate crust on coated fried foods, add about three-quarters of a teaspoon of baking powder to the batter and use club soda for the liquid.

USING YOUR NOODLE

To prevent boilovers, lay a large spoon or spatula across the top of the pot to reduce boilovers and splashing while cooking.

For perfect pasta, bring salted water to a boil, stir in pasta, cover pot, and turn off heat. Let sit for fifteen minutes or until done.

When done, run cooked spaghetti under hot-not cold-water before draining to prevent stickiness.

Use your French-fry basket or a large strainer when cooking pasta.

It is so easy to lift the basket out of the water before rinsing the pasta and transferring it to the serving bowl.

POSIES IN A BASKET

3 cups miniature marshmallows
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup orange juice
 2 teas. grated orange rind
 1 cup heavy cream, whipped
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sliced almonds, toasted
 Melt marshmallows with orange juice,
 and orange rind in double boiler; stir
 until smooth. Add $\frac{1}{4}$ cup brandy, if
 desired; chill until thickened. Fold
 in whipped cream and nuts; spoon into
 paper dessert cups. Freeze. Decorate.
 6 to 8 servings

PUDDING ICING

1 pkg. instant pudding
 1 envelope cream whip
 2 cups milk
 Add all ingredients and beat
 till thick. Very light
 creamy icing.

MAKING A CAKEProcedure:

Light oven, get out utensils and ingredients. Remove blocks and toy cars from table. Grease pan, crack nuts. Measure 2 cups flour..... remove Johnnys hands from flour wash flour off him. Remeasure flour, put baking powder, flour and salt in sifter. Get dustpan and brush up pieces of bowl Johnny knocked on the floor. Get another bowl.... answer doorbell. Return to kitchen....remove Johnnys hands from bowl, wash Johnny....answer phone....return. Remove $\frac{1}{4}$ inch of salt from greased pan. Look for Johnny....remove his head from the bowl. Grease another pan. Answer phone. Take up greased pan....find layer of nuts and shells etc. in it. Head for Johnny, who flies, knocking bowl off table. Wash kitchen floor, walls and dishes.

The irrigation pipe is in the ground!!! That is 7700 feet of pipe and it took a lot of work to get it properly installed. Almost 7000 feet required cleaning out of loose dirt from the trench and shoveling in sand by hand.

The branch work parties were quite well manned in the first week but the second week saw a few problems with leave and summer rotation shortage hurting sections. Thanks to the super effort from Phil Adams, Bill Pronyk, Red Trowsdale, Jocelyn Dore and Jim Shackleton we were able to make up for any shortage of workers. Phil, Bill and myself put together 2000 feet of pipe and prepared half that much trench in one day. Branch work parties were provided by the CGEO, SLOGO/CE, and HQ personnel. Our ME section helped us out as usual in getting sand brought in and Morgan McReynolds did his thing with the loader. Lloyd Martin spent extra hours at the power plant welding together some broken pipe and doing some work on the lathe to shape a special fitting for me. It is nice to see some of the people who use the course help improve it. Russell Denney and his crew (mainly Big Foot and Doug Keats) have delivered pipe and will cement in the pump for us. Paul Lebouf and Lawrence Graham have helped with fittings, emergency repairs, pipe threading and soon will be showing us how to run the pump (and assemble it). A real team effort was evident and will pay off in the future with an excellent golf facility--second to none on the radar chain.

I would like to collectively thank all those who have contributed to this project over the past year and one half. We have come a long way towards our goal of a grass turf and greens. There is lots left to do but the water system is an absolute must for any further improvements and it will flow very soon. We are going to have a champagne opening when we finish. It has been disappointing to see some of the users of the course who have been unwilling to volunteer any of their time and effort towards course improvements but for the most part support has been good. There have been quite a few people working on the course who do not golf at all. I hope they take the game up and get some reward for their effort.

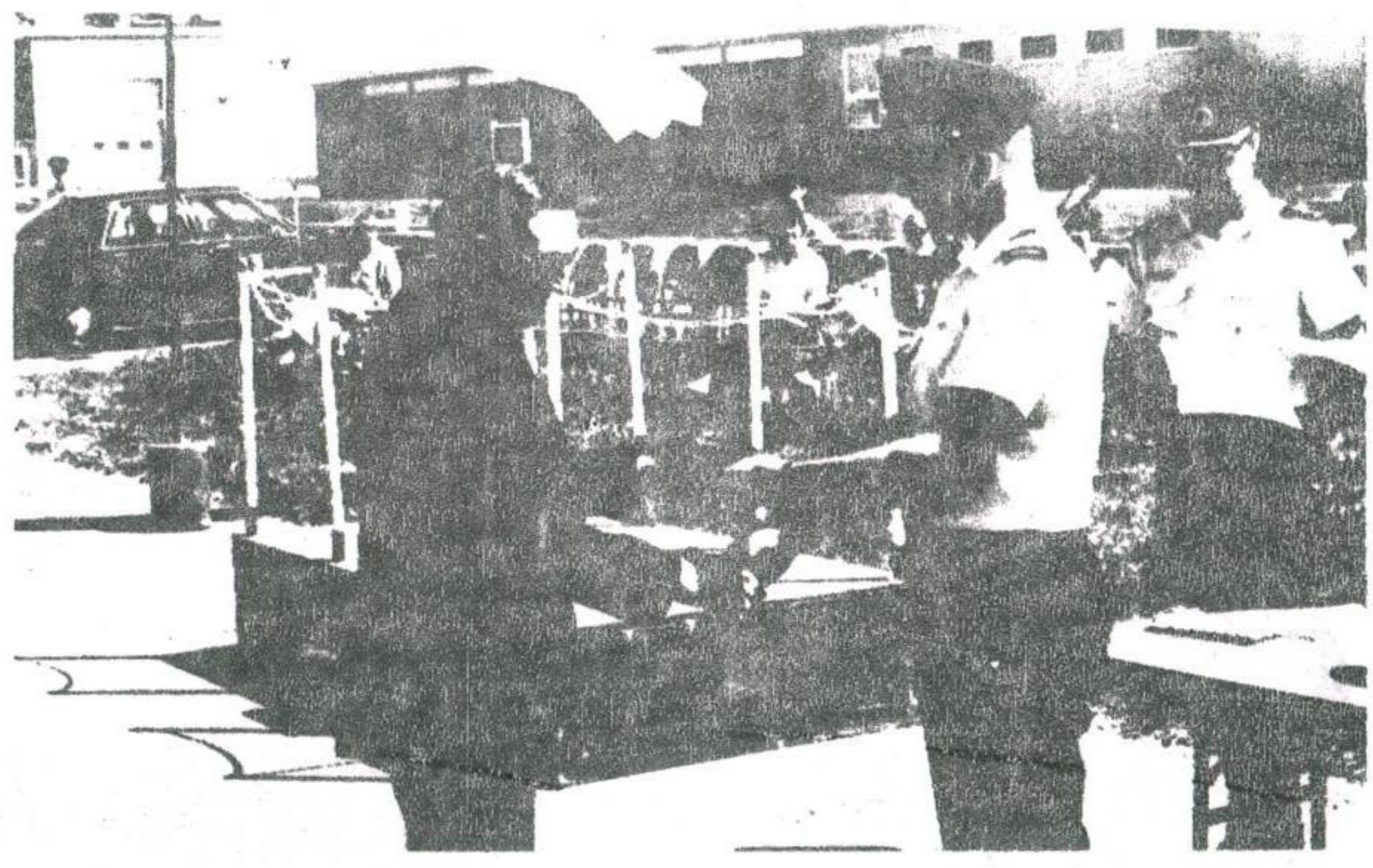

We can keep costs at a bare minimum if we all support these projects. There will have to be some form of fees to maintain these facilities but they can be very minimal with our collective efforts. Good luck to the new committee members and keep the course improvements going. Do not let all our good work go down the drain. Maybe I can return in a few years for a good round of golf as my reward for my own efforts here.

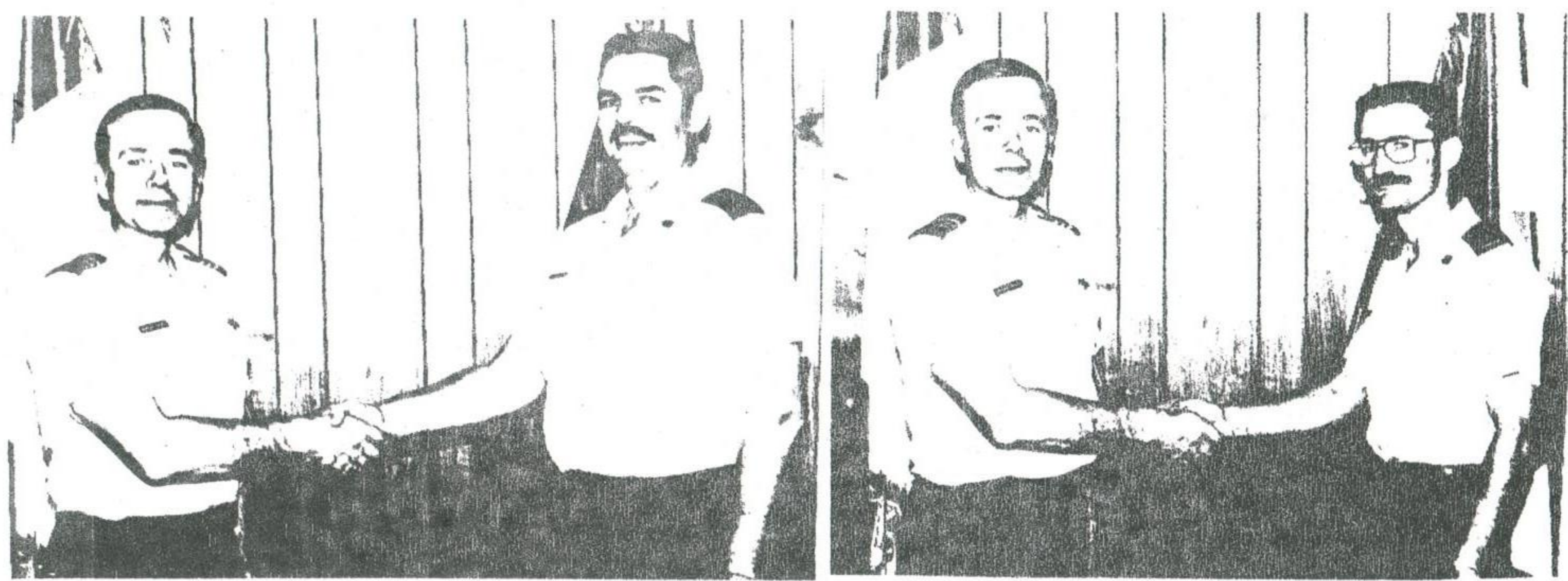


"Dear Diary: Quit smoking today."



CFS ALSASK, SASK.....Mr Russel M. Denney of Boissevain, Man receives his 25 year service plaque from Lieutenant Colonel Lenard E. Novakowski, Commanding Officer. Russel joined the RCN at Winnipeg, HMCS Chipawa, in July 1940 and went on active service in 1941 through 1946. During this time he saw duty on the North Atlantic on Convoy duty and also at Murmansk, Russia. He was on duty in the English Channel during D day Invasion. On his way to the Pacific Campaign WW II was ended and he returned to Victoria, B.C. He was released in 1946 and returned to Boissevain, but rejoined the RCN in 1948 at HMCS Chipawa until 1955 when he moved to Alsask, Sask to take up farming. He served in the Korea campaign from 1950-52 and returned to Esquimalt. In 1962, Russel was employed at CFS Alsask as a heavy equipment operator and later took over supervision of the Roads & Grounds section of the Construction Engineering Branch.

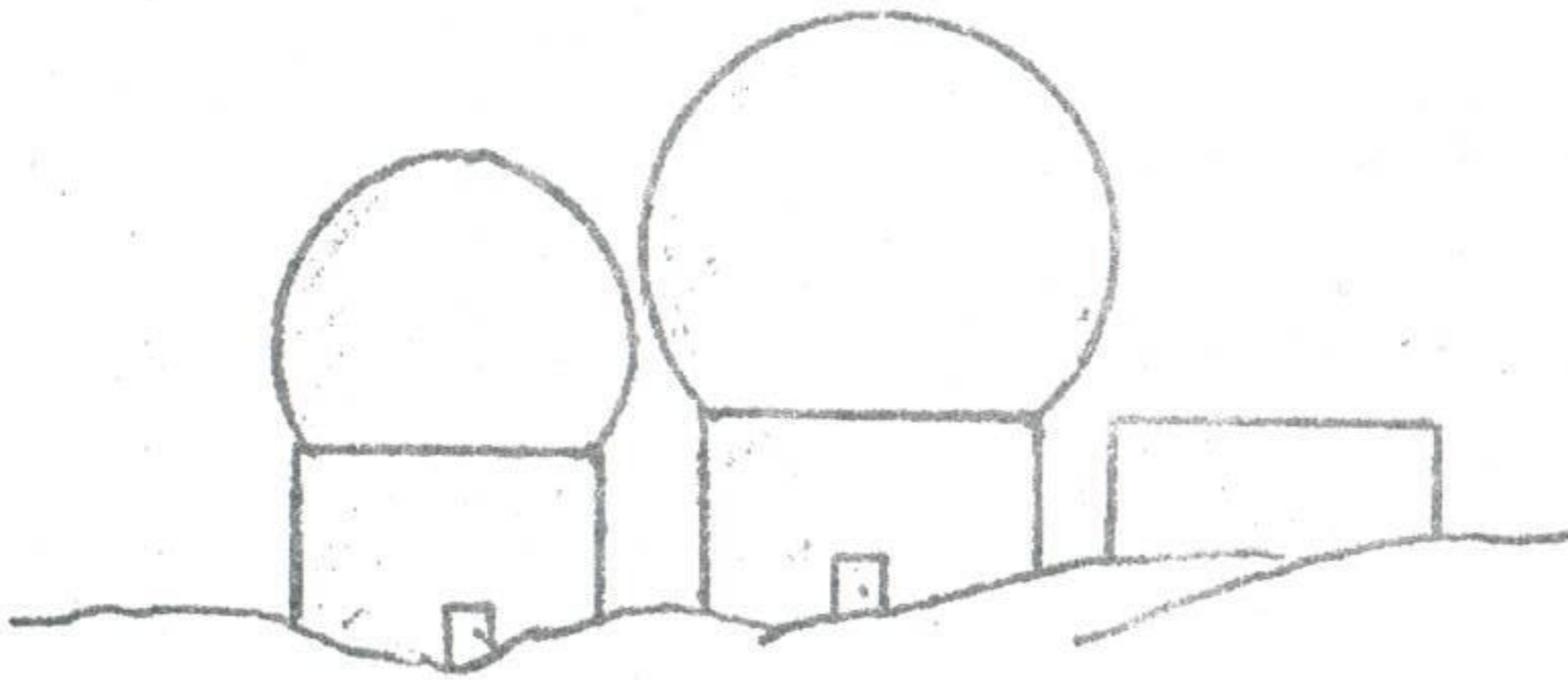

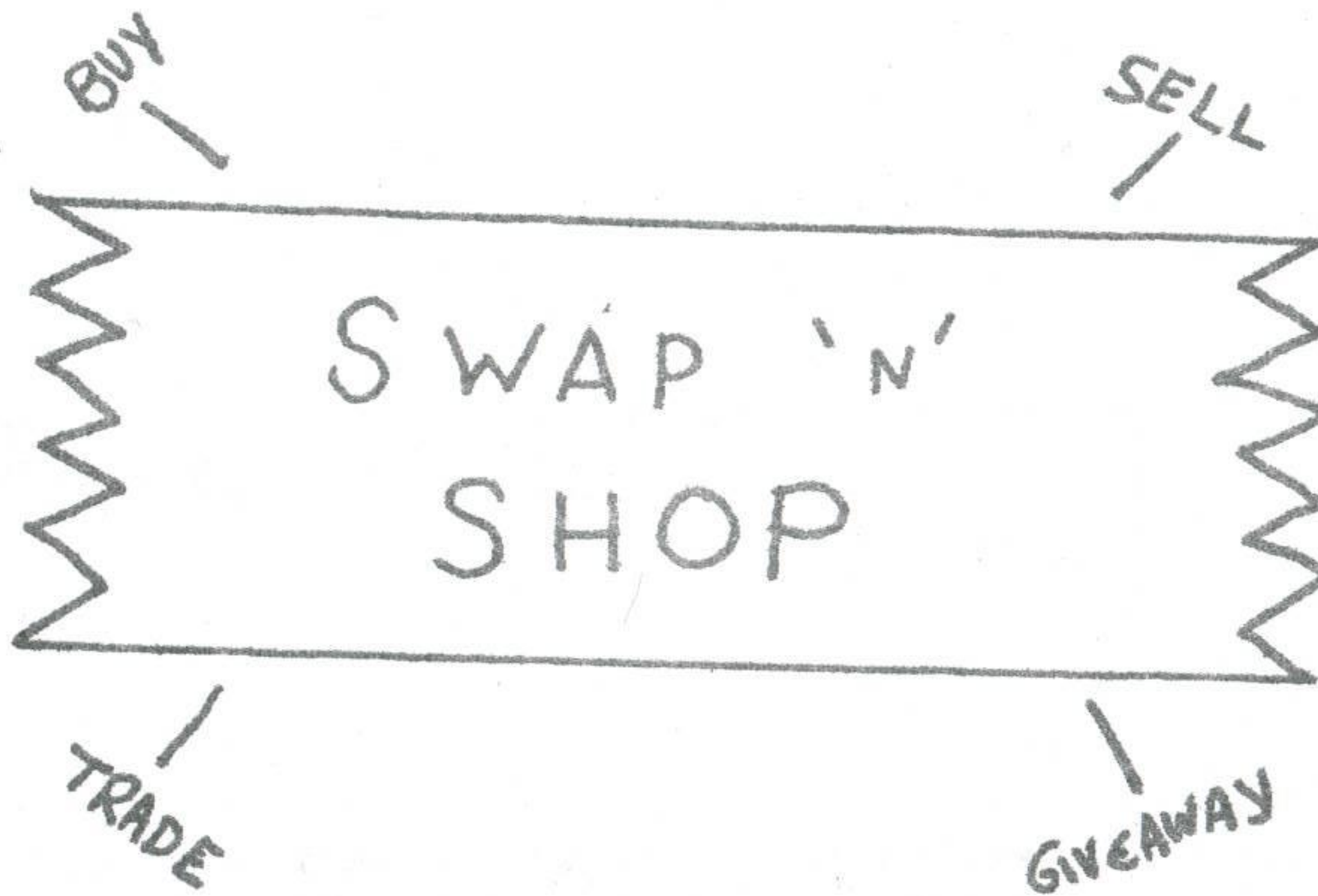



FINANCIAL - SMALL LOANS AND BENEVOLENT FUND ASSISTANCE

1. The Canadian Forces Personnel Assistance Fund (CFPAF) comprises the Canadian Forces Small Loan Programme (CFSLP) and the Canadian Forces Financial Distress Programme. The Financial Distress Programme is operated in cooperation with the Royal Canadian Air Force Benevolent Fund (RCAFBF).
2. CFSLP Small loans of \$50 to \$500 are available to all members of the Canadian Forces (Regular) for any genuine purpose that will promote the well-being of members or their dependents.
3. CFSLP repayment rates may be geared from six to 24 months depending on the amount of the loan, at a service charge of \$3.00 per \$100 per year or approximately 5 1/2% simple interest.
4. Any regular member on leave, TD, etc. away from his home unit may apply to the unit nearest him for an emergency loan.
5. If a member is on an unaccompanied posting, his dependent may make application to the loan committee where the dependent is located for assistance.
