

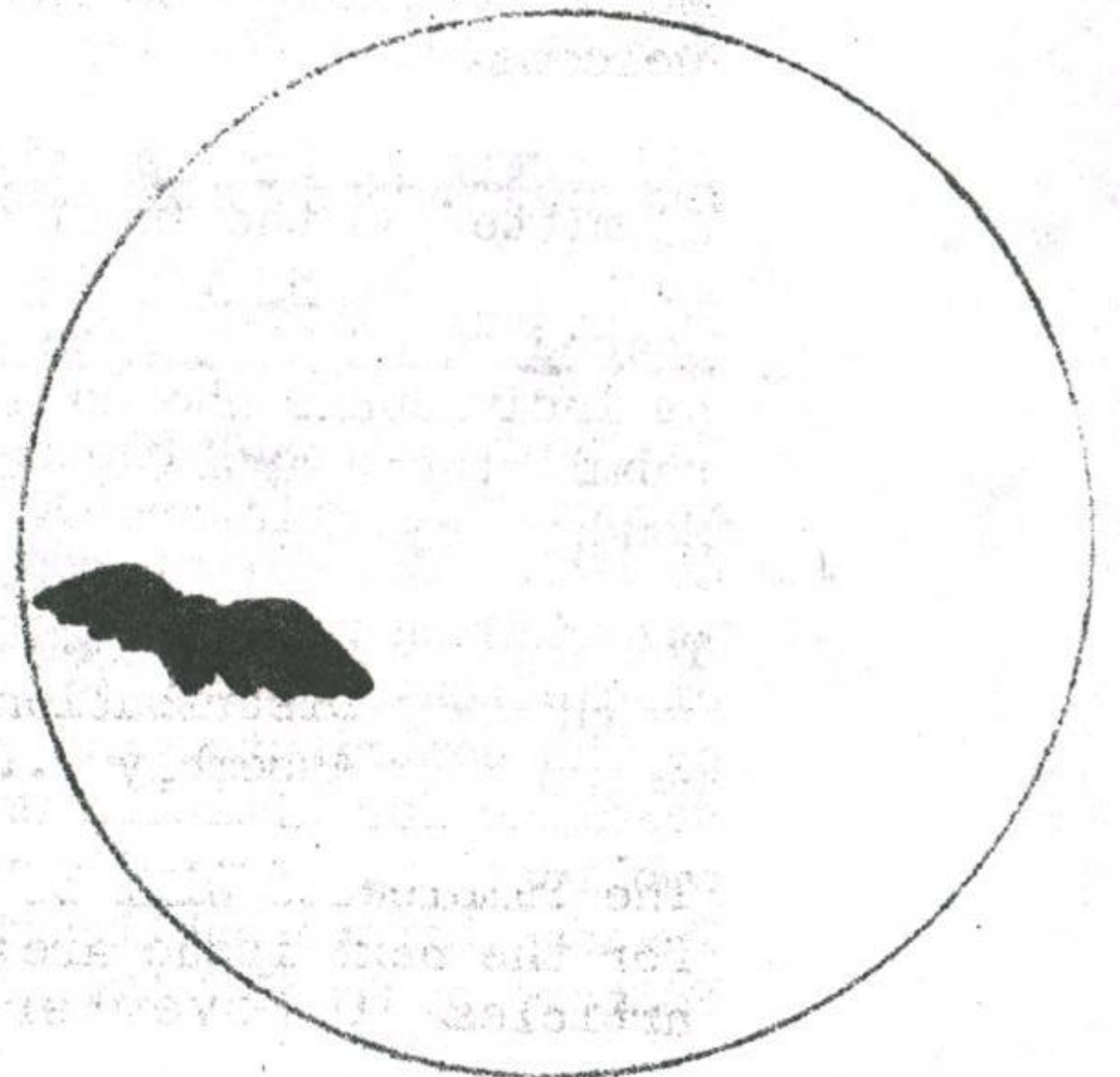

The emphasis is clearly towards local news and events. All articles which contribute to the community or enhance the newspaper are welcome.

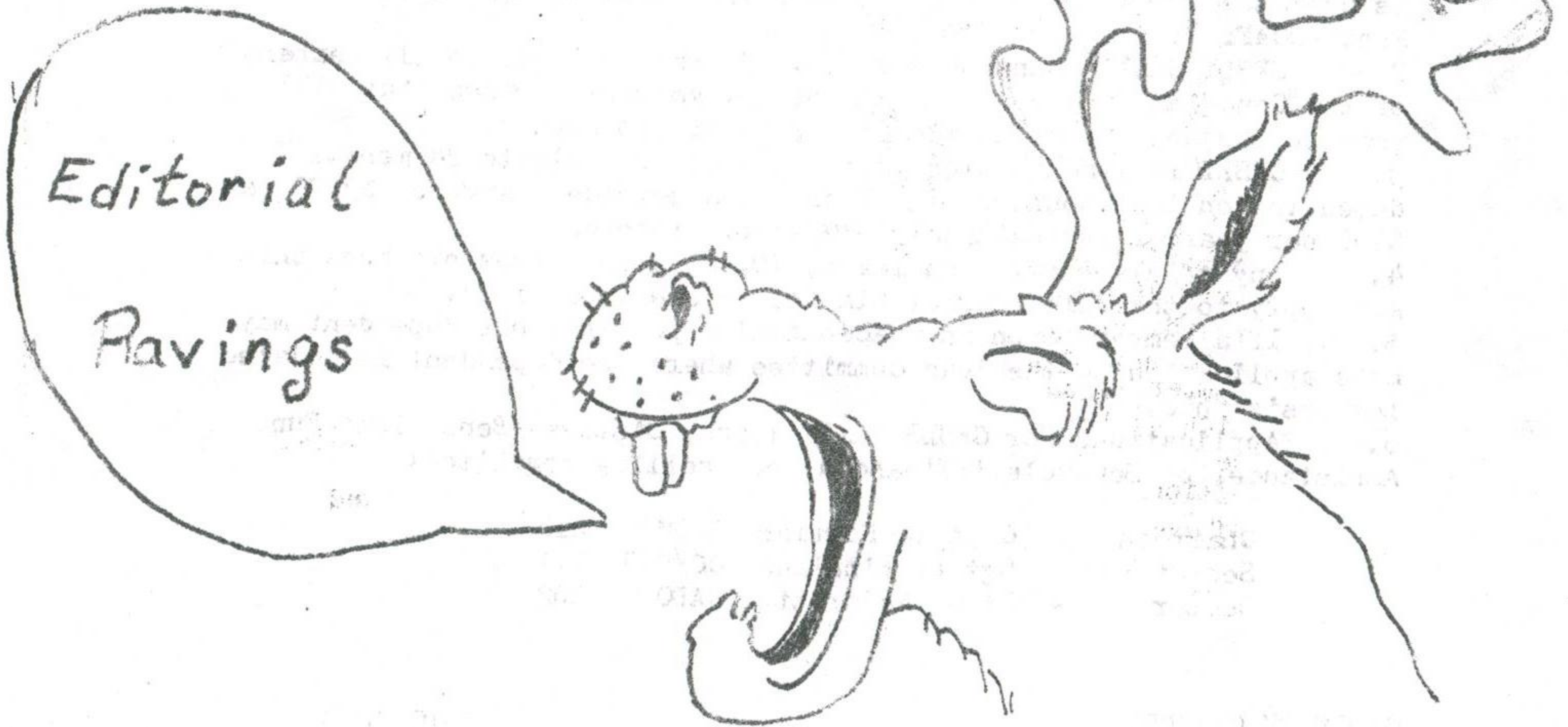

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FINANCIAL - SMALL LOANS AND BENEVOLENT FUND ASSISTANCE

1. The Canadian Forces Personnel Assistance Fund (CFPAF) comprises the Canadian Forces Small Loan Programme (CFSLP) and the Canadian Forces Financial Distress Programme. The Financial Distress Programme is operated in cooperation with the Royal Canadian Air Force Benevolent Fund (RCAFBF).
2. CFSLP Small loans of \$50 to \$500 are available to all members of the Canadian Forces (Regular) for any genuine purpose that will promote the well-being of members or their dependents.
3. CFSLP repayment rates may be geared from six to 24 months depending on the amount of the loan, at a service charge of \$3.00 per \$100 per year or approximately 5½% simple interest.
4. Any regular member on leave, TD, etc. away from his home unit may apply to the unit nearest him for an emergency loan.
5. If a member is on an unaccompanied posting, his dependent may make application to the loan committee where the dependent is located for assistance.

SUPERFUDGE - by Judy Blume. He knows a lot of big words, but he doesn't know where babies come from. He doesn't even know about the stork, but he plans to be a bird when he grows up. He's Superfudge, otherwise known as Farley Drexel Hatcher. And, according to his brother Peter, the biggest pain ever invented. Among other things.

THE SEARING - by John Coyne. Horror that strikes our ordinary life is the most frightening. Real terror touches us, not when we are braced for danger, but when we think we're safe at home. It is the shadow behind the hedge, the stirring in the basement, the first footstep at the bottom of the stairs.

This new occult thriller begins quietly on the streets of a new town near Washington, D.C.--a town peopled by young government professionals who feel that here, in Renaissance Village they are safely at home. For Dr. Sara Marks, Renaissance Village is a new life. She has left Harvard, and the doctor who was her fiance, hoping to find peace and happiness in this new community--but instead she finds Cindy Delp. Cindy, whose parents are the Village caretakers, is a strange child, diagnosed as autistic--unable to communicate with anyone or anything outside herself. Wild, ragged, and speaking in an unintelligible, hellish screech, Cindy roams the new community disturbing the Villagers, who resent her intrusions. Only Sara is drawn to the girl, who gradually replaces the child Sara lost to a miscarriage.

Then the Villagers' dislike for Cindy suddenly turns to fright when they discover that her very presence causes disaster and death. Sara's friends fear for their children, who are not safe even in their cribs. Soon not only the children are attacked, but the women's bodies are also invaded, in terrifying assaults, half pleasure, half pain, and they are all helpless.

Multiple horrors continue until only Sara Marks believes Cindy is innocent. And then the child comes to her, seeks Sara out in the quiet Village. Only then does Sara learn the truth about Cindy Delp, the secret locked in the child's brain, hidden behind Cindy Delp's beautiful, blank eyes.

In a blazing, shocking finale John Coyne masterfully orchestrates a series of bizarre and extraordinary events into an apocalyptic conclusion that means death, destruction, and finally revelation for Sara Marks, Cindy Delp, and the women of Renaissance Village.

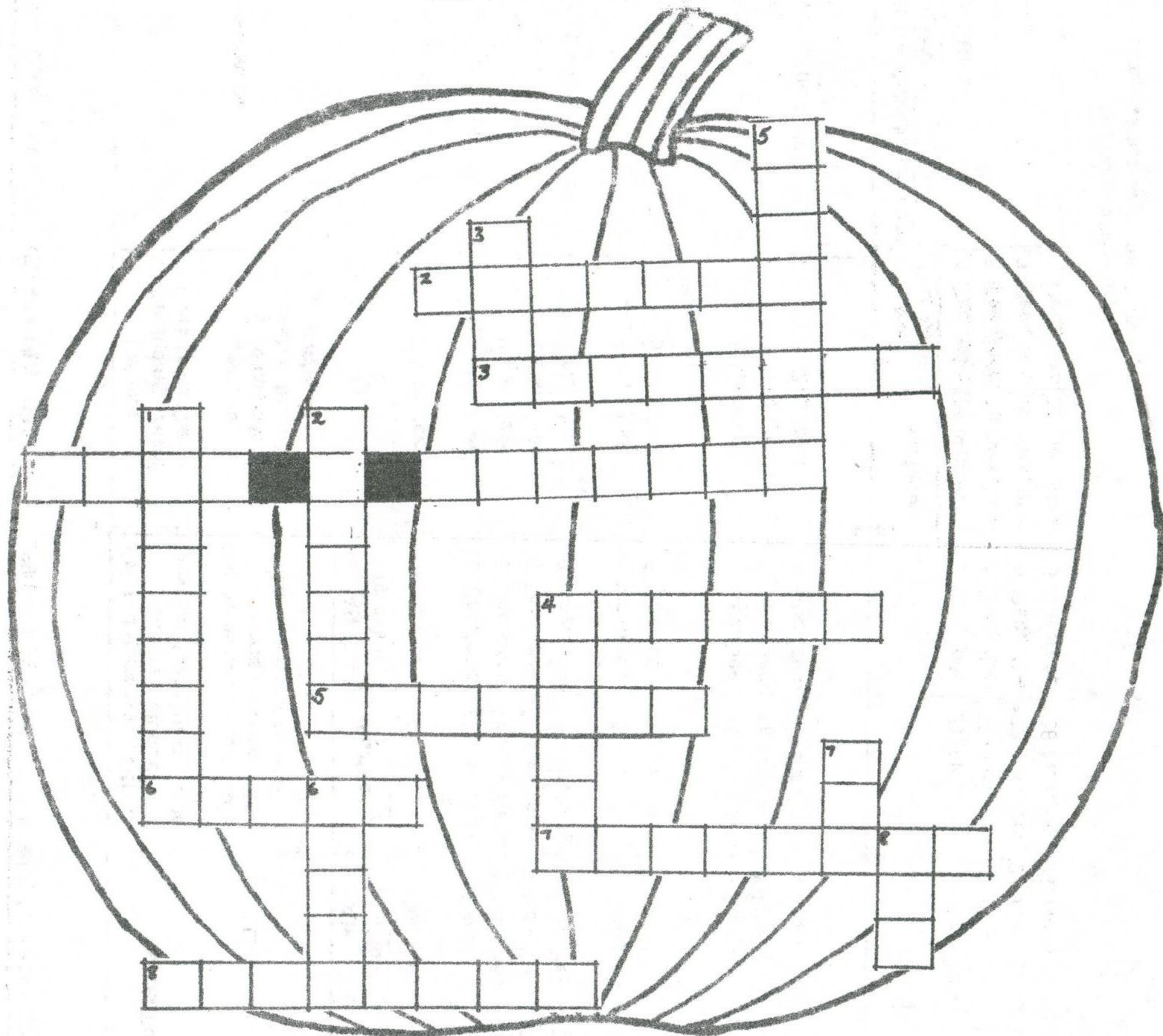

Here are some suggestions for that Hallowe'en Jack O' Lantern

PUMPKIN BREAD

- 3 cups sugar
- 1 cup salad oil
- 4 eggs (beaten)
- 2 cups pumpkin
- 3 1/2 cups sifted flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon allspice
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 2/3 cup water

- cream sugar and oil
- add eggs and pumpkin
- mix well
- sift together dry ingredients
- add to pumpkin mixture alternately with water
- mix well after each addition
- pour into 2 well greased loaf pans
- bake at 350° F for about 45 minutes or until it tests done with a toothpick

PUMPKIN CRUNCH MUFFINS

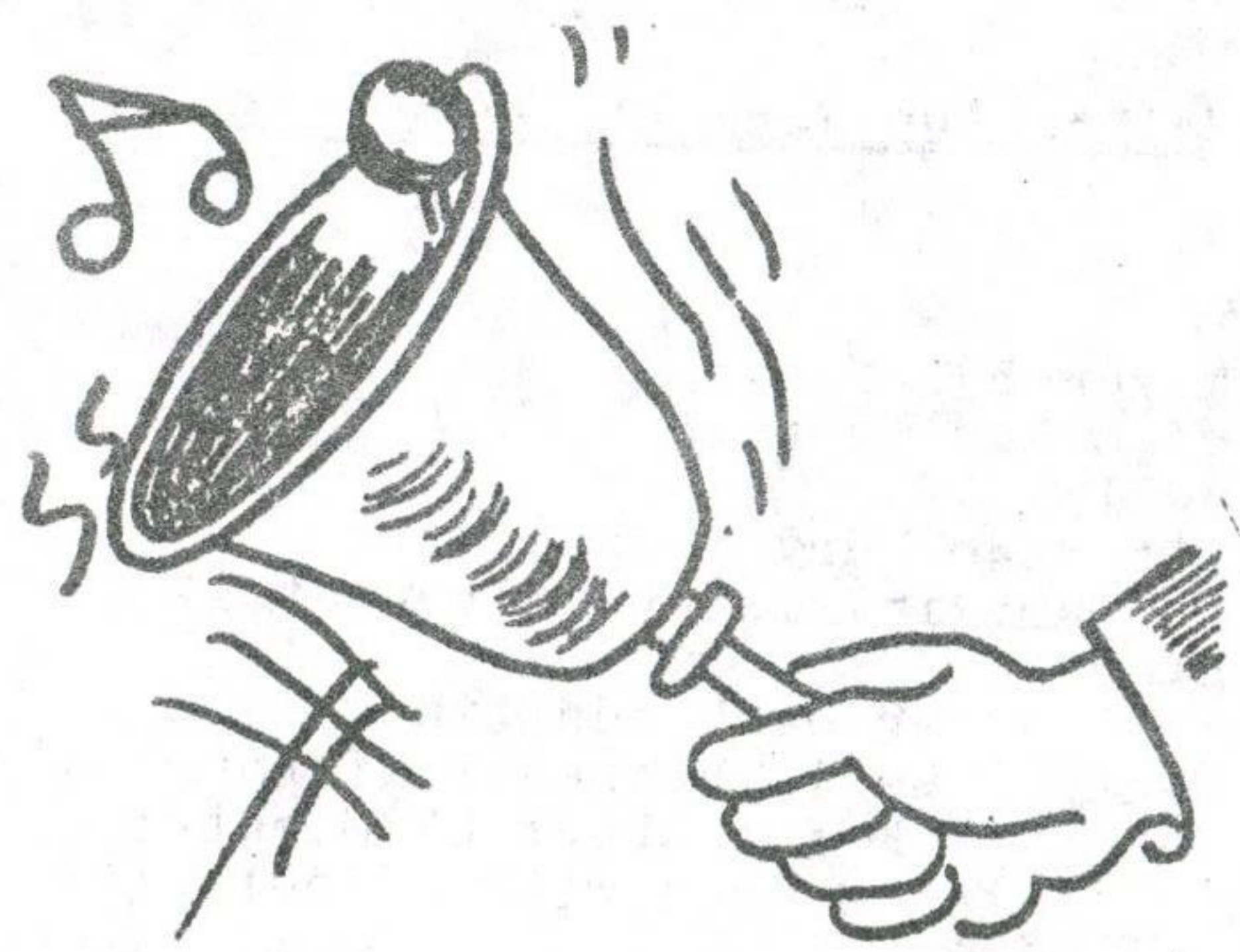
- 1 3/4 cups flour
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1/2 cup pumpkin
- 1/3 cup salad oil
- 1 egg
- brown sugar

- mix all dry ingredients except brown sugar in a mixing bowl
- stir in raisins
- combine milk, pumpkin, salad oil and egg in a small mixing bowl
- beat with a rotary beater
- add liquid ingredients all at once to dry ingredients
- stir just until all ingredients are moistened
- fill well greased muffin cups 2/3 full and sprinkle tops with brown sugar
- bake at 400° F for 20-25 minutes

PUMPKIN PIE

- 1 1/2 cups pumpkin
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoon melted margarine
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ginger
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 1/2 cups milk

- mix and pour into an unbaked pastry shell
- bake at 400° F for 30 minutes then reduce temperature to 350° and continue baking until filling can be cut with a sharp knife
