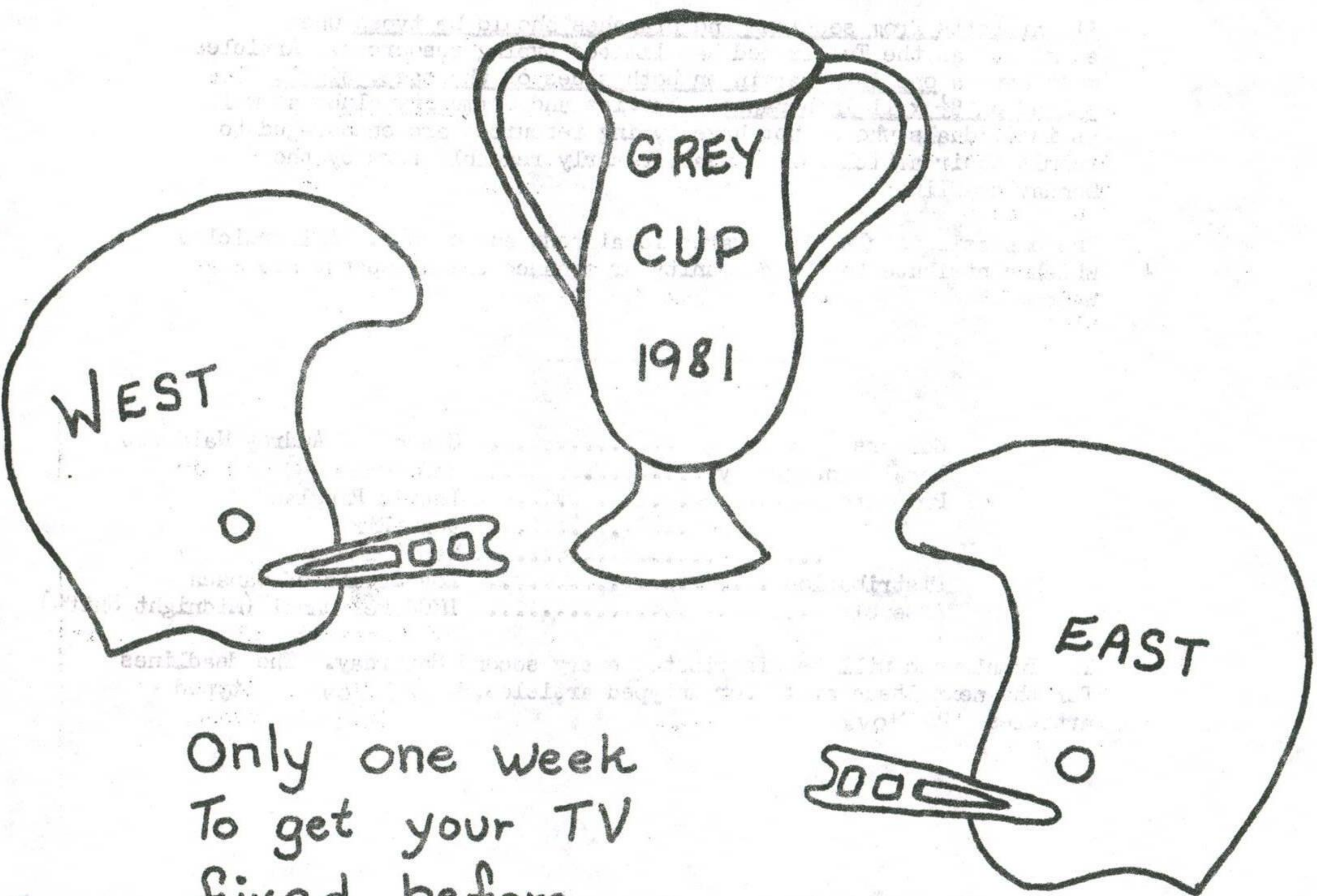

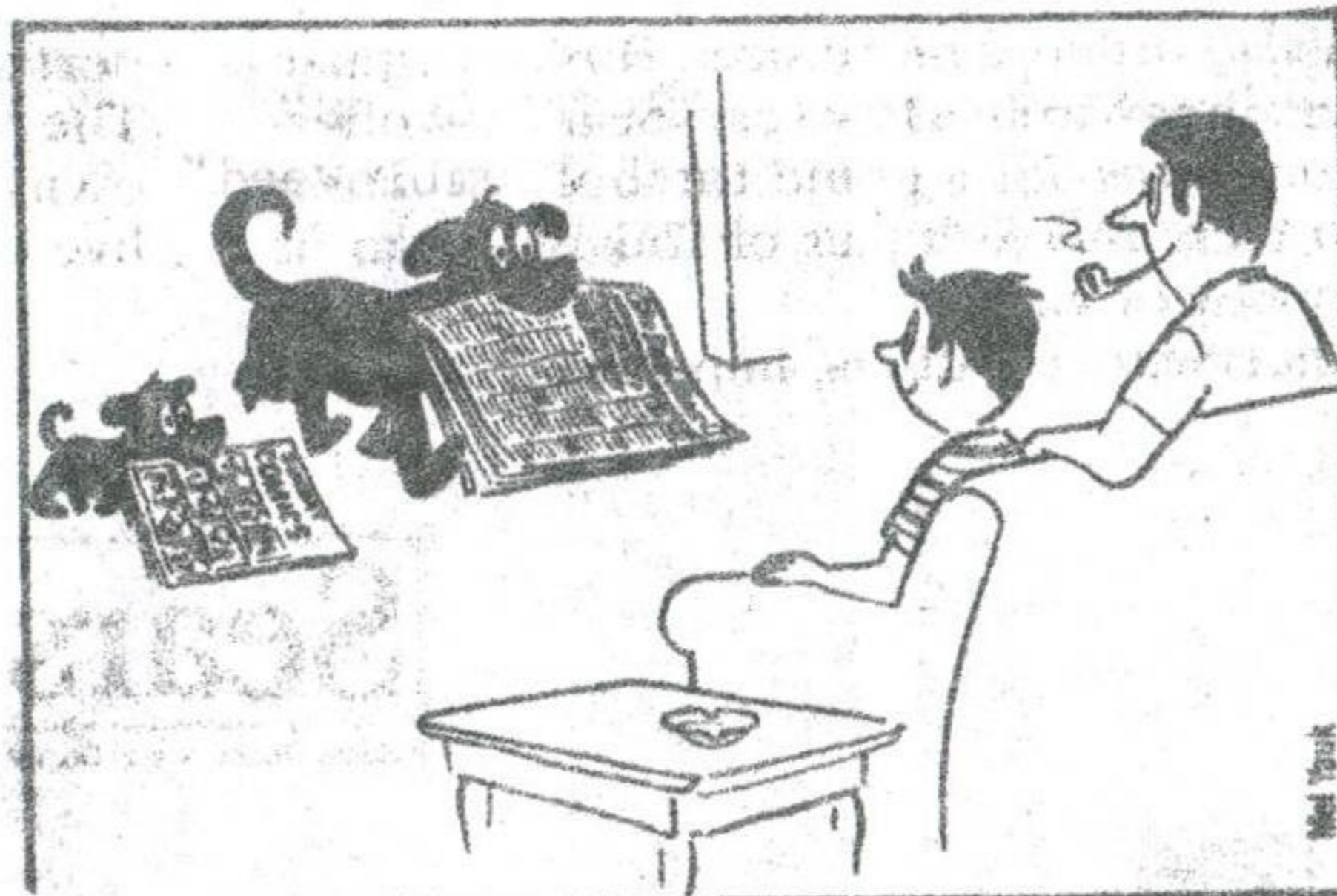

RECIPES

Cake for allergic people

The recipe for eggless, milkless and butterless cake was adapted from an Alberta Children's Hospital recipe for the hyperactive.

- 2 cups brown sugar
- 2 cups shredded carrots
- 2/3 cup oil
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 2 cups hot water

Boil for 5 minutes. Let cool and add:

- 3/4 cup frozen blueberries
- 1/2 cup washed dates
- 3/4 cup pure honey
- 1 tsp. baking soda

Combine

- 4 cups wholewheat untreated flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder (for corn free baking powder, mix 1/3 part each baking soda, cream of tartar and wheat or potato flour)

Add to mixture and pour into 9 inch tube pan or loaf pan.

Bake at 350°F (180°C) for 1 1/2 hours.

Cover with foil to avoid burning the top of the cake.

MOUSE COUNT - by Felicia Law and Suzanne Chandler. This is an excellent book for children who are learning to count or who are learning the fundamentals of arithmetic. Lively cartoon mice illustrate the book throughout as it covers: number recognition, counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and activities.

THE CRADLE WILL FALL - by Mary Higgins Clark. Its heroine is Katie DeMaio, a bright, ambitious, attractive young prosecutor in a small New Jersey town, recently widowed. A driving accident brings her to Westlake Hospital with minor injuries, where she sees--or thinks she sees--a familiar figure carrying a woman's body to his car in the middle of the night....

When the woman is found dead in her bed the next day and declared a suicide, Katie determines to find out the truth, and soon uncovers the hidden scandals and fears in the lives of a number of people who seem, on the surface, to be solid, respectable citizens, among them--

--Chris Lewis, the husband of the dead woman, who seems to be somewhat less than grief-stricken at his wife's death, and who may be having an affair with another woman...

--Edna Burns, a good-hearted spinster who works in the hospital and who may have accidentally discovered a secret that puts her own life in jeopardy...

--Richard Carroll, the handsome young coroner, who takes a very personal interest in Katie's welfare...

--Dr. Edgar Highley, the distinguished obstetrician and fertility expert, who seems to be able to perform miracles for some of his patients, but whose secretive manner may conceal something more sinister than a concern for life and birth...

--Dr. Jiro Fukhito, his associate, who seems to have something serious in his past to hide...

With brilliant skill, Mary Higgins Clark weaves the frightening story of a medical conspiracy that must be hidden at all costs, perhaps even that of murder. It builds toward a climax of overpowering intensity, as Kate herself, again a patient in the hospital for a routine operation, finds herself both the hunted and the hunter...

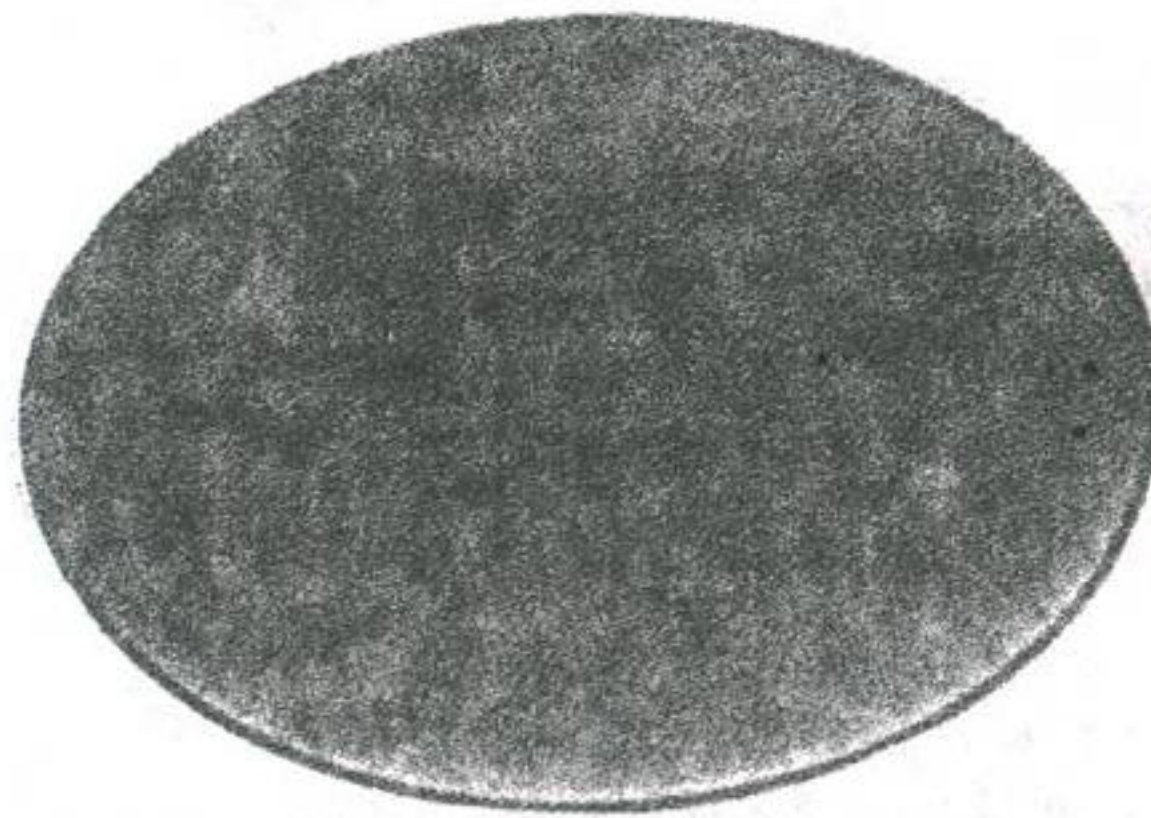

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FINANCIAL - SMALL LOANS AND BENEVOLENT FUND ASSISTANCE

1. The Canadian Forces Personnel Assistance Fund (CFPAF) comprises the Canadian Forces Small Loan Programme (CFSLP) and the Canadian Forces Financial Distress Programme. The Financial Distress Programme is operated in cooperation with the Royal Canadian Air Force Benevolent Fund (RCAFBF).
2. CFSLP Small loans of \$50 to \$500 are available to all members of the Canadian Forces (Regular) for any genuine purpose that will promote the well-being of members or their dependents.
3. CFSLP repayment rates may be geared from six to 24 months depending on the amount of the loan, at a service charge of \$3.00 per \$100 per year or approximately 5½% simple interest.
4. Any regular member on leave, TD, etc. away from his home unit may apply to the unit nearest him for an emergency loan.
5. If a member is on an unaccompanied posting, his dependent may make application to the loan committee where the dependent is located for assistance.
