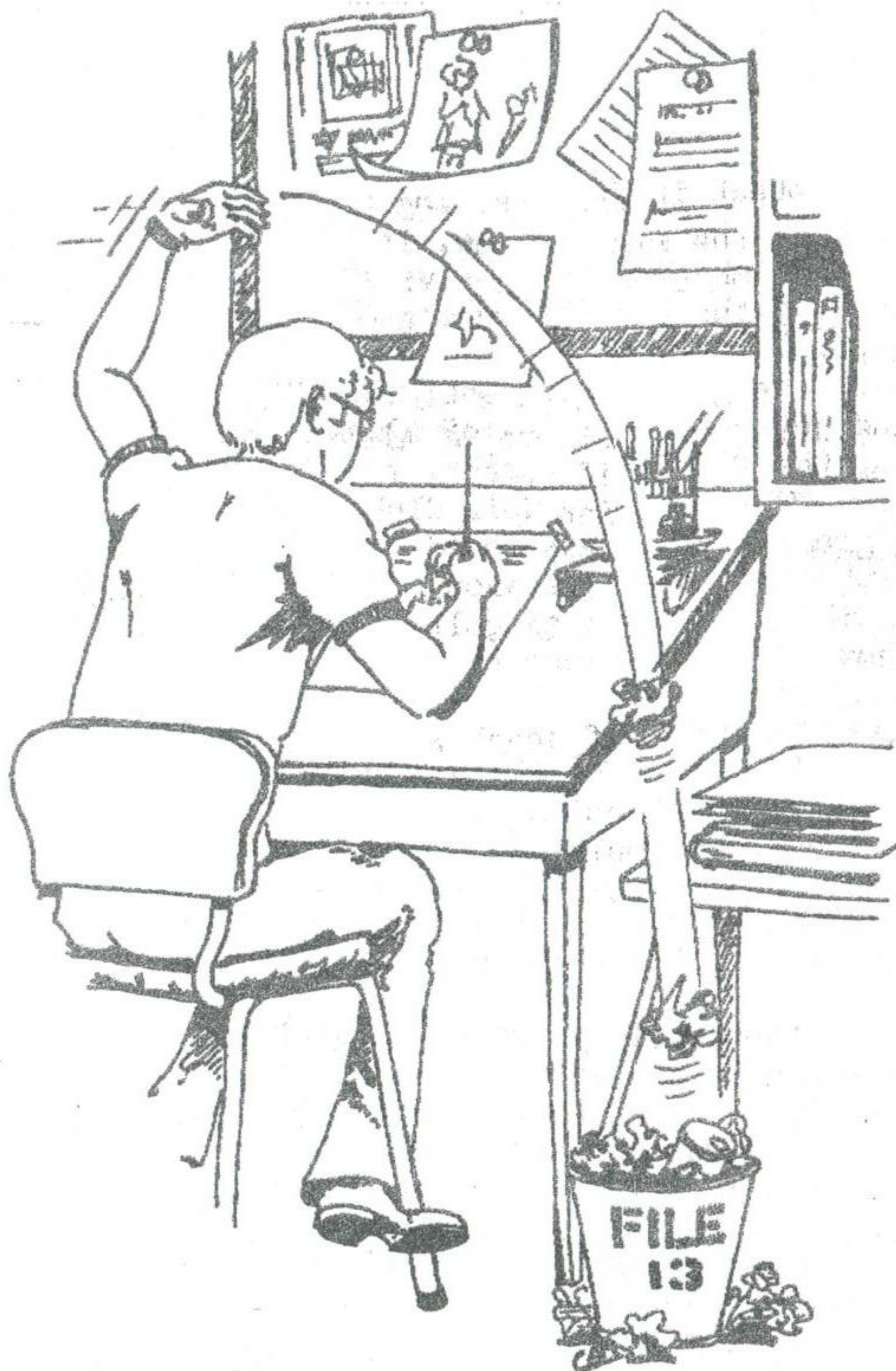

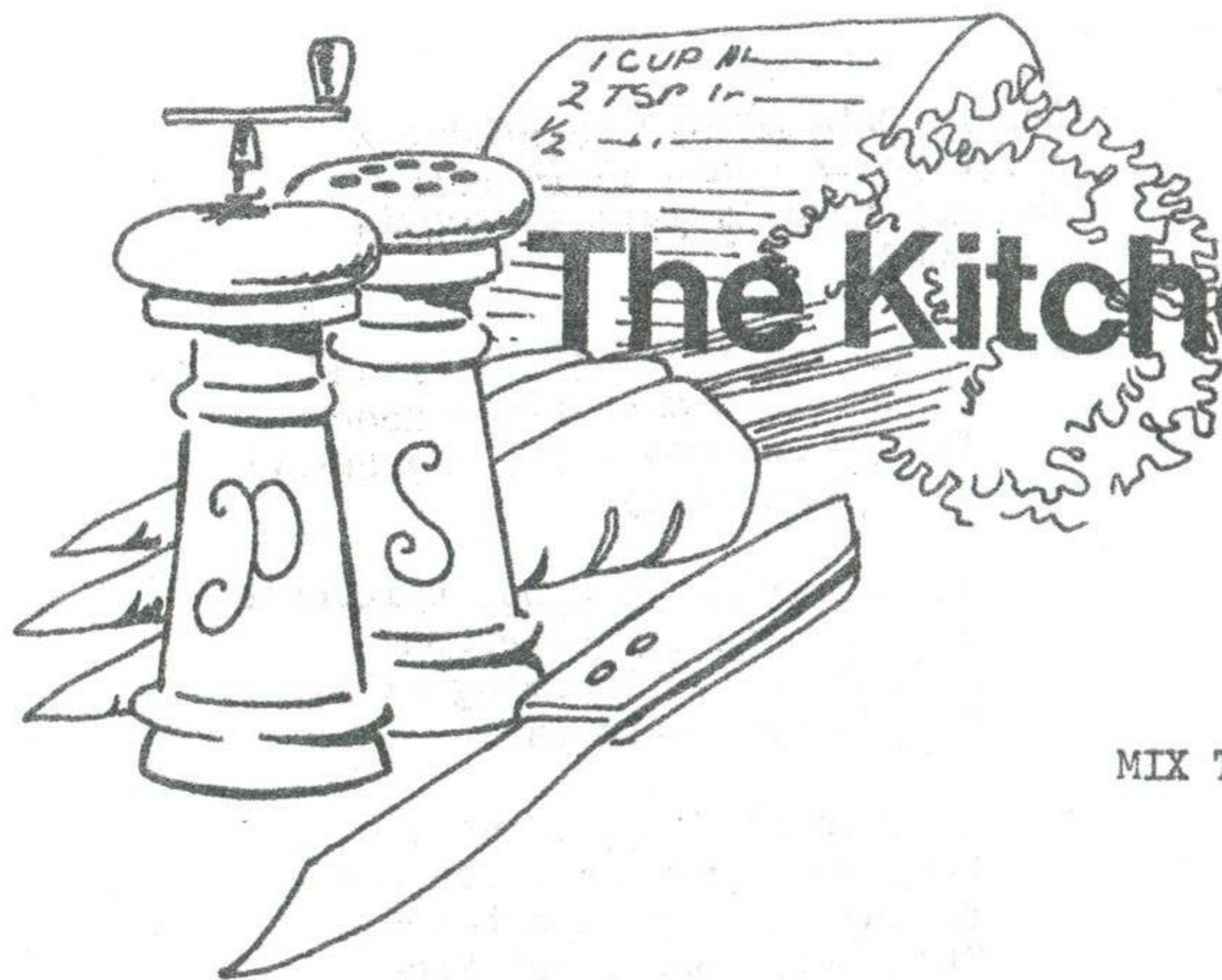

FRED'S SOUR CREAM BISCUITS (Fred Townsend)

MIX: 4 cups all purpose flour
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup shortening with a pastry blender.

ADD: 2 tbsp. baking powder
 pinch salt
 2 tbsp. white sugar
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. baking soda
 1 - 16 oz. container of sour cream or (sour milk with vinegar)

Turn on to lightly floured surface and knead. Roll out to $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick. Cut with a floured cutter. Bake on baking sheet in preheated 425 degree oven for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown.

NOTE: The secret to good biscuits is in the kneading.

DO YOU KNOW that to remove chewing gum rub area with ice, then scrape off with dull blade. Sponge with dry cleaning solvent; allow to air dry. Wash in detergent and hottest water safe for fabric.

PORRIDGE BREAD/ROLLS (Joanne Woodruff)

MIX TOGETHER:

3 cups scalded milk
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup any sweetener (sugar, honey, molasses)
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup any fat (oil, shortening, margarine)
 2 eggs
 1-2 cups leftover cereal
 (Sunny Boy or Oatmeal or combination)
 1 cup wheat germ (optional)
 1 tsp. salt

LET COOL AND ADD:

2 cup flour and beat in.
ADD: 2 pkgs dissolved yeast - $\frac{1}{2}$ cup warm water plus 1 tsp. white sugar.

MIX WELL.

Add enough white flour to make soft dough 6-8 more cups. Knead well 6-8 minutes. Let rise in warm place till double. Punch down. Make into rolls and put into well greased pans. Let rise again till almost double and bake at 375 degrees - 25 minutes or till brown.

NOTE: 1 - I freeze leftover porridge till I get enough for making the rolls.

2 - These freeze very well if you can get them to the freezer before the kids eat them up.

THE BABY-SITTER AND YOU

How old must a person be before he or she can take over the duties of a Baby-sitter?

It is strongly recommended that any person engaged for Baby-sitting purposes, should be a mature and stable individual of at least 12 years. It would be preferable to select a person with experience or training in child care.

A successful Baby-sitting job should be carefully planned to assure the safety and well-being of both Baby and Baby-sitter. Suggestions which may be of assistance are listed below:

- * The whereabouts of the parents of the child should be left with the Baby-sitter, including Telephone Numbers, Names and Addresses of people or places they will visit. Have a pencil and paper available at the telephone for messages. Special instructions as to Bedtime Rules, Feeding, Time for Lights out, etc., should be left.
- * The Telephone number of the Family Doctor, Fire and Police

Departments should be handy. A relative or other adult person who may readily assist, should be noted.

- * Check and lock all doors and windows. Do not unlock doors for anyone not expected, except in an emergency.
- * Avoid making personal telephone calls. Keep the telephone available for incoming calls from baby's parents.
- * In case of fire, first get baby and other children out of the house or apartment. Then call your local Fire Department, from a neighbour's telephone, if necessary.
- * If suspicious about strange noises, a face at the window, a telephone call that worries you, or if any emergency arises, call your local POLICE FORCE.
- * When the child's parents return, report any unusual happenings. Accept escort to your home as planned. However, if a parent is to drive you home, but appears intoxicated, insist on calling your parents to make other arrangements.

FINANCIAL - SMALL LOANS AND
BENEVOLENT FUND ASSISTANCE

The Canadian Forces Personnel Assistance Fund (CFPAF) comprises the Canadian Forces Small Loan Programme (CFSLP) and the Canadian Forces Financial Distress Programme. The Financial Distress Programme is operated in co-operation with the Royal Canadian Air Force Benevolent Fund (RCAFBF).

CFSLP Small Loans of \$50 to \$500 are available to all members of the Canadian Forces (Regular) for any genuine purpose that will promote the well-being of members or their dependents.

CFSLP repayment rates may be geared from six to 24 months depending on the amount of the loan, at a service charge of \$3.00 per \$100 per year or approximately 5½% simple interest.

Any regular member on leave, TD, etc. away from his home unit may apply to the unit nearest him for an emergency loan.

If a member is on an un-accompanied posting, his dependent may make application to the loan committee where the dependent is located for assistance.
