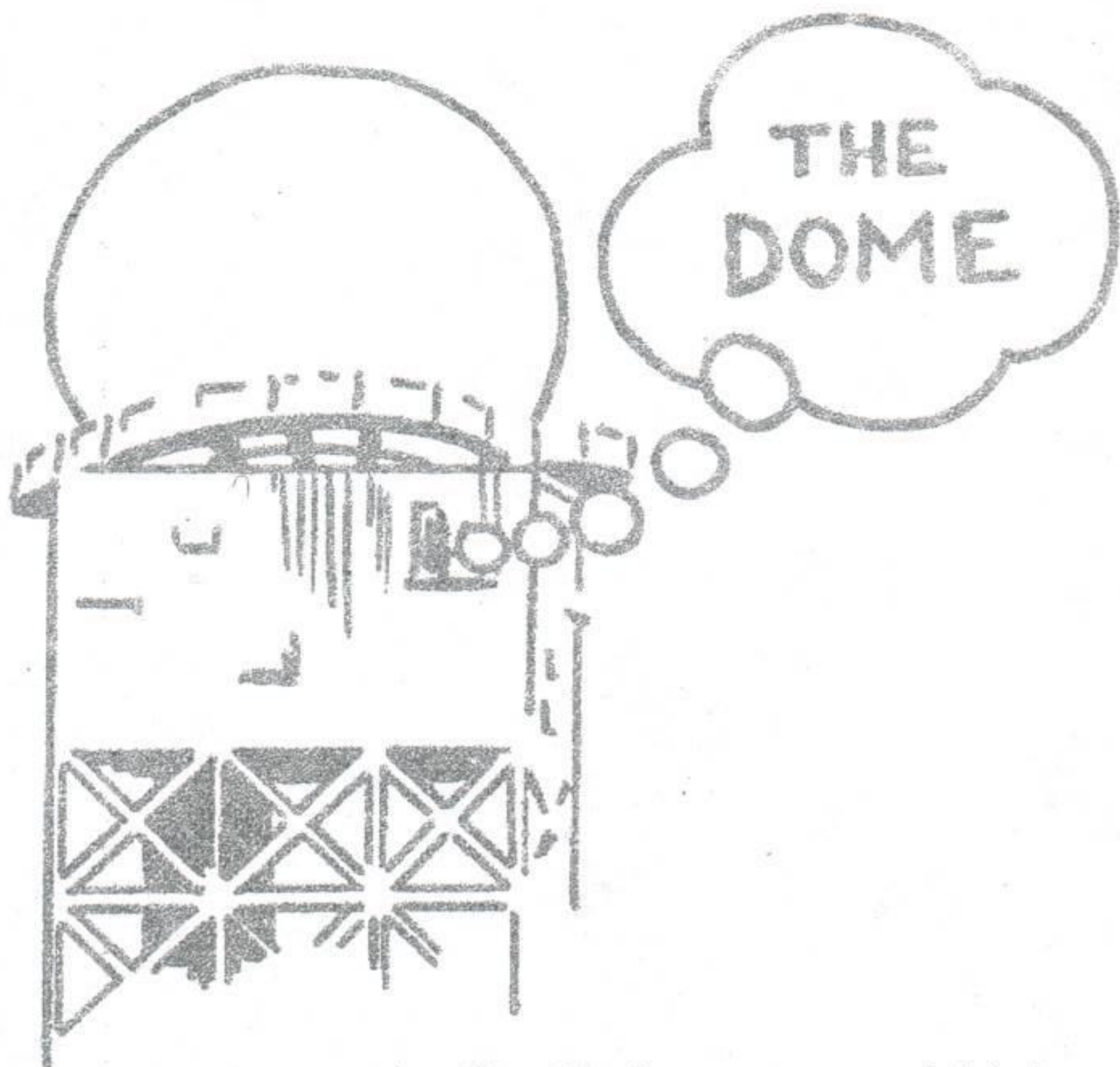

Or in the same restaurant a spelling mistake on the menu says "Dreaded veal outlets".

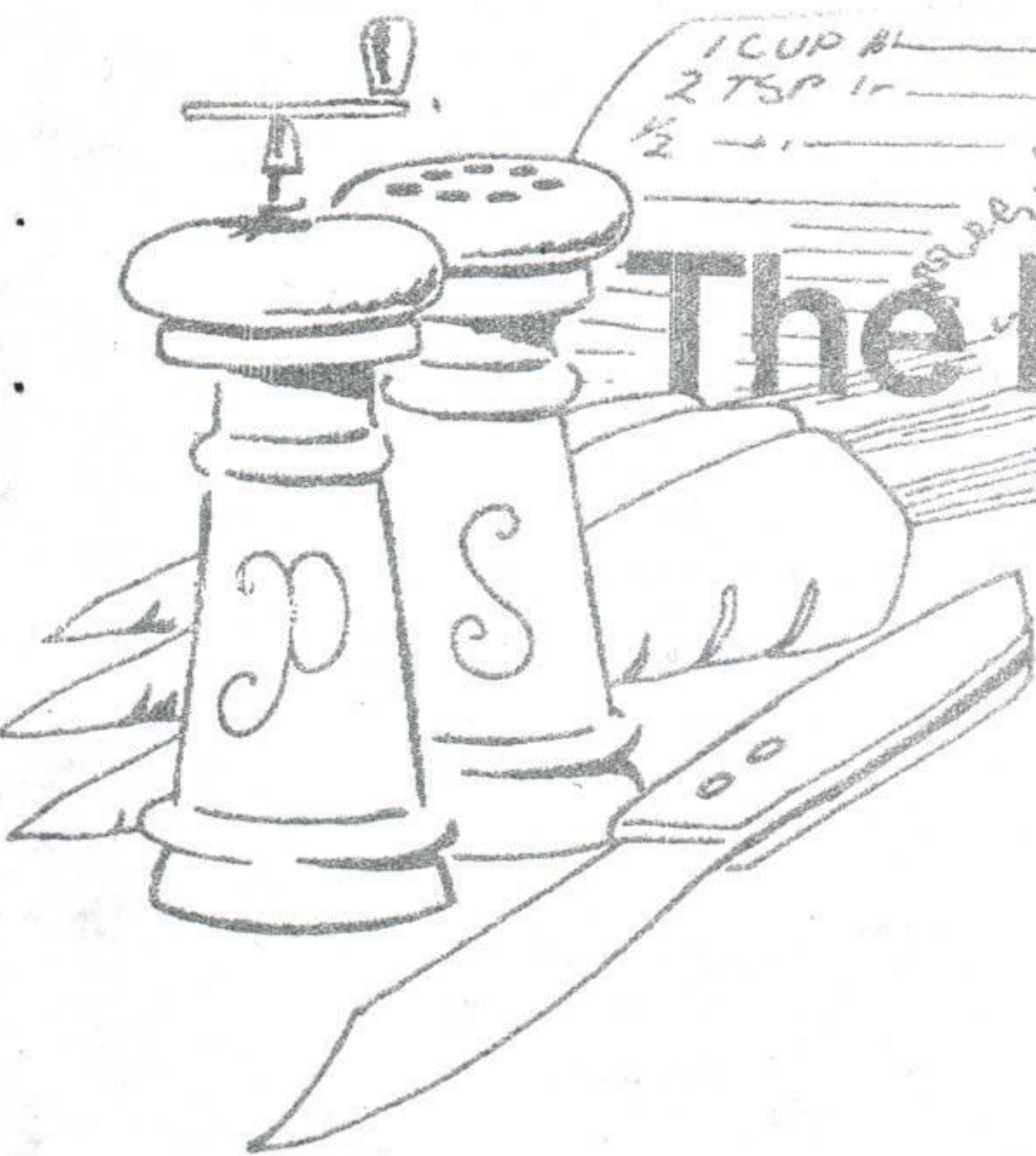
Did you know that following the path of least resistance is what makes people and rivers crooked?

# The Kitchen Page

## BARBECUED HAMBURGER MAKE-AHEAD (Joanne Woodruff)

4 pounds ground beef  
 2 medium onions chopped  
 1 14oz bottle ketchup  
 1 cup water  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup chopped celery  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup lemon juice  
 2 tbsp. brown sugar  
 1 tbsp worcestershire sauce  
 2 tsp. vinegar  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. dry mustard  
 1 tbsp salt

In Dutch oven or roasting pan, cook and stir ground beef and onion until meat is brown and onion is tender. Drain off fat. Stir in remaining ingredients; heat to boiling, stirring frequently. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 30 minutes. Cool; divide among pint freezer containers and freeze for future use. Makes 5 pints.

### SUGGESTIONS:

#### EASY CHILI

Stir 1 14 oz can kidney beans with liquid,  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 cup tomato juice and 2 or 3 teaspoons chili powder into 1 pint of Make-Ahead Mix. Heat mixture through. Makes 4 servings.

#### BARBECUED BURGER BUNS

Fill each of 6 to 8 buttered hamburger buns with about  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup hot Make-Ahead Mix. For a crowd the entire recipe will fill 30-40 hamburger buns.

#### BAKED FRANK ROLLS

If desired, stir 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese into 1 pint Make-Ahead Mix. Split 8 to 10 frankfurter buns; remove part of bread from centre of each. Spoon mixture into buns; wrap each in aluminum foil. Heat in 350 oven for 30-35 minutes.

#### MOCK PIZZA

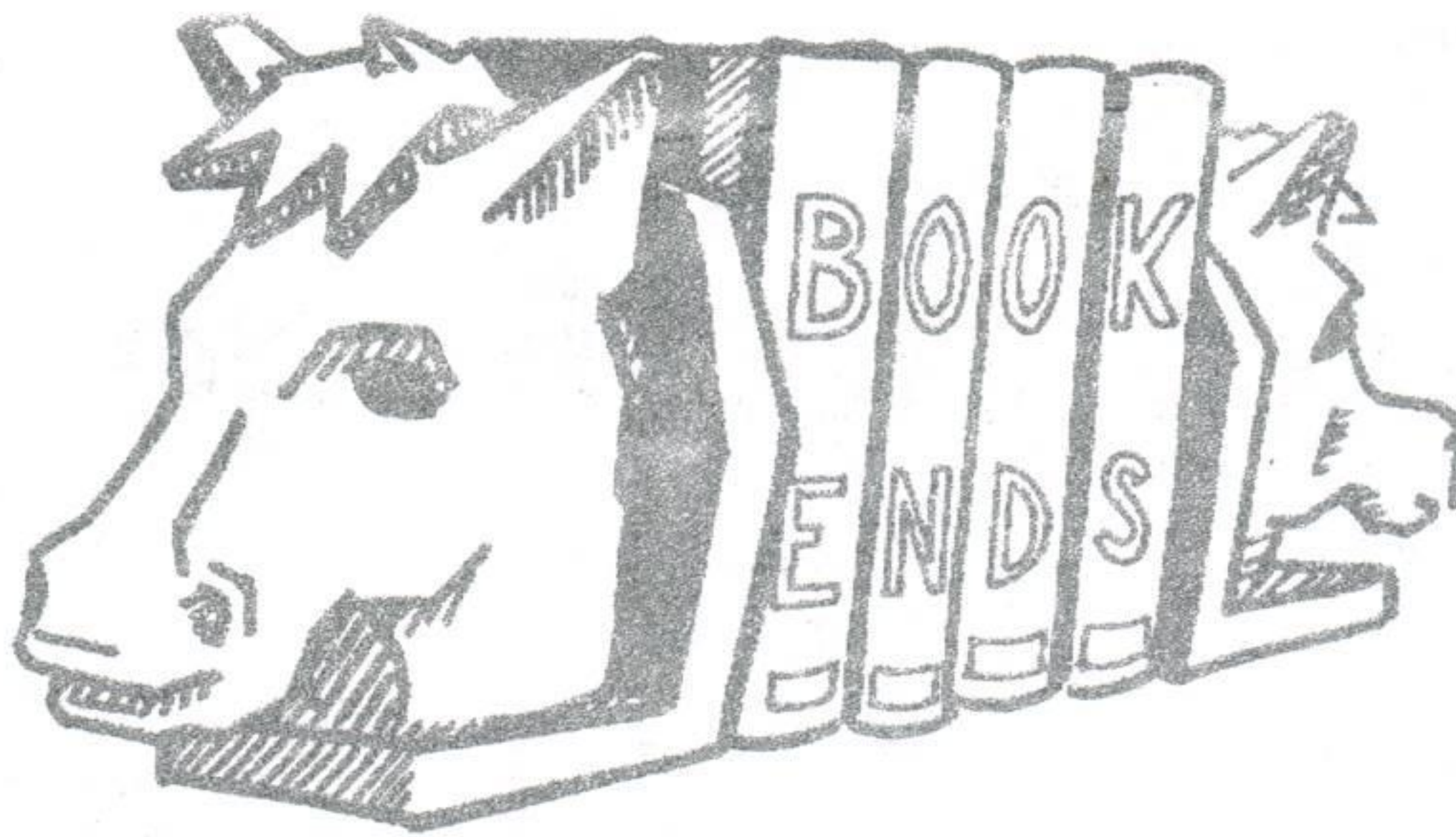
Split 6-8 hamburger buns; toast. Spoon 1 pint Make-Ahead Mix over halves; sprinkle with shredded cheese and oregano or Italian seasoning. Set oven control at broil. Broil about 3-4 inches from heat just until cheese is bubbly.

#### MICROWAVE RECIPE

#### PORK CHOP AND RICE BAKE (Ardith Paquette)

$\frac{1}{2}$  cup long grain rice  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup water  
 4 (1 $\frac{1}{2}$  lbs.) pork chops  
 1 medium sliced onion  
 1 (10 $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.) can golden mushroom soup  
 salt and pepper

In 4 qt. casserole or Country Cooker, arrange rice evenly over bottom. Cover with water. Salt and pepper to taste. Arrange pork chops with meaty portions toward outside edges on rice. Salt and pepper. Arrange sliced onion rings evenly over pork chops. Spoon mushroom soup over top. Microwave (medium 50%) covered, 45 minutes, rotating  $\frac{1}{4}$  turn halfway through cooking time.

TAX PRINCIPLES TO REMEMBER - Geoffrey Colley. This book was originally designed as a series of lessons to lead the reader through the Canadian Income Tax Act, outlining the basic structure of the statute and the interrelationships of some of the features of the income tax system.

Since the amended Income Tax Act came into force at the beginning of 1972, taxpayers and their advisors have been faced with frequent and extensive legislative changes as the need for technical amendments in various areas of the law became apparent. One of the main objectives of this book, therefore, is to assist the reader in understanding not only what the law says now, but also what the previous rules were and why they were, or will be, changed. Knowing why the law in a particular area has been amended can be of considerable help in understanding the meaning and implications of the revised provisions.

THE SEVENTH CHILD - by Brooks Stanwood. The town of Ripton Falls, where the Richardson family comes to settle, is idyllic: nestled in the Berkshires, it boasts a stunning village green, large old houses, and a breathtaking setting. It is perfect for Hal and Judy Richardson and their nine-year-old daughter, Annie. Recruited overnight from a frustrating job in Los Angeles by the Hilliards, Ripton Falls' oldest family, they and several other new firm in what seems a stroke of good luck. They are happier than they have been in years. But then the accidents begin. None is fatal, and some are so slight as to seem frivolous. It is Judy Richardson who first notices the disturbing and unmistakable pattern emerging as one by one the children of the new families are singled out. An obscure reference to a centuries-old legend begins to take on meaning for her--a legend about seven other children, children apparently so evil that the town tried to erase from its history all record of their existence. As Judy and Hal's suspicions grow, speculation turns to realization and then to horror.

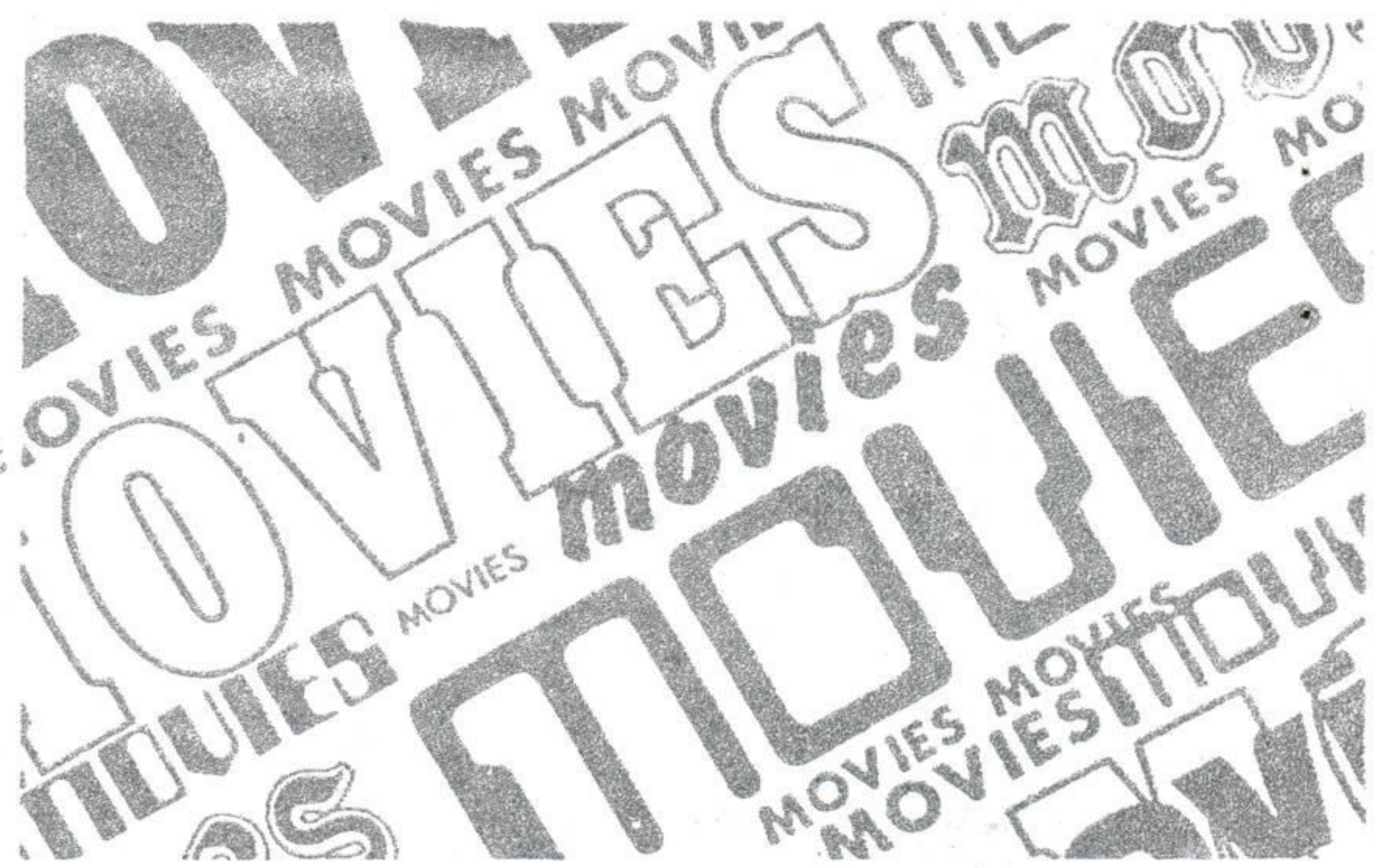

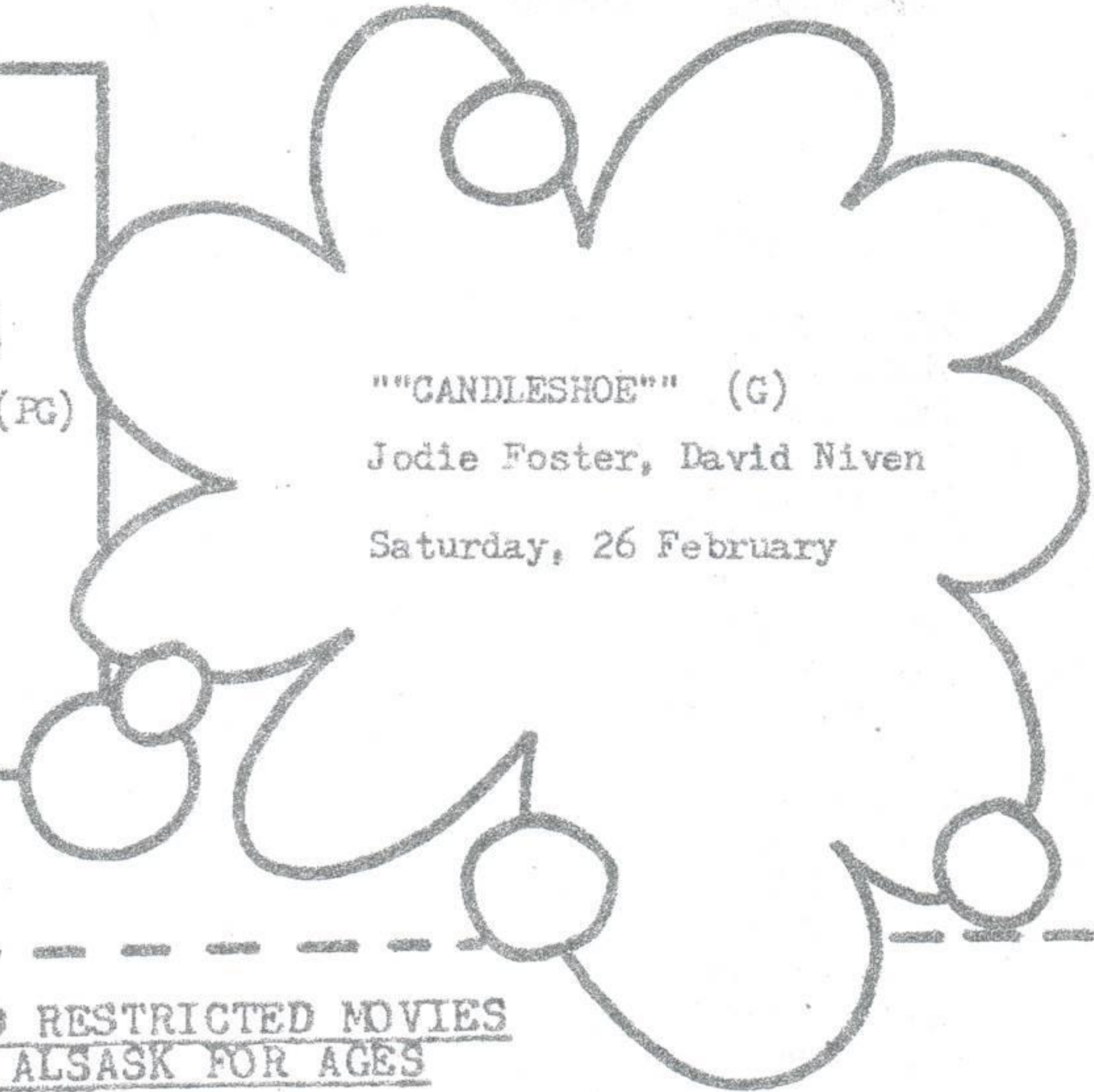

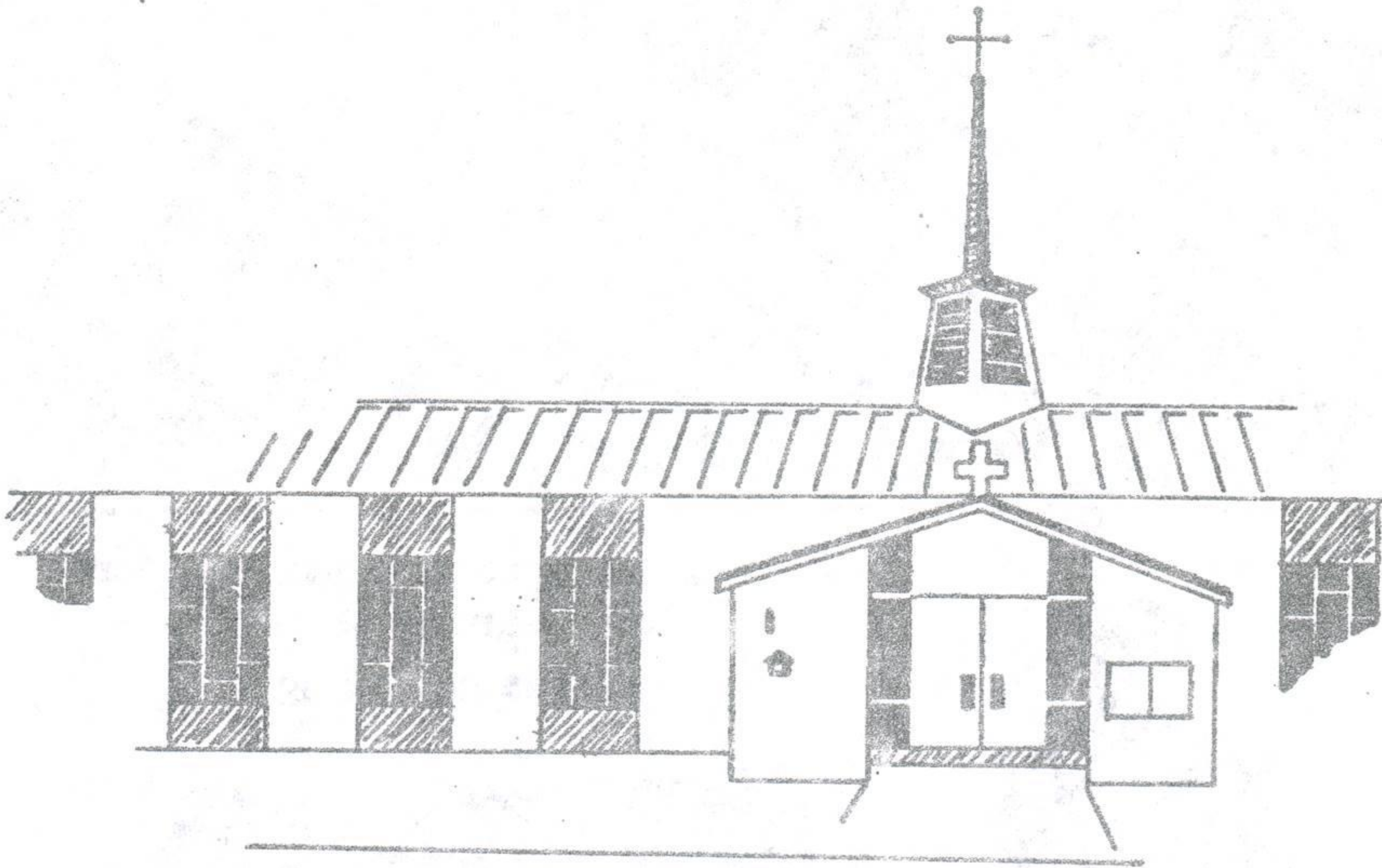

FINANCIAL - SMALL LOANS AND  
BENEVOLENT FUND ASSISTANCE

The Canadian Forces Personnel Assistance Fund (CFPAF) comprises the Canadian Forces Small Loan Programme (CFSLP) and the Canadian Forces Financial Distress Programme. The Financial Distress Programme is operated in co-operation with the Royal Canadian Air Force Benevolent Fund (RCAFBF).

CFSLP Small Loans of \$50 to \$500 are available to all members of the Canadian Forces (Regular) for any genuine purpose that will promote the well-being of members or their dependents.

CFSLP repayment rates may be geared from six to 24 months depending on the amount of the loan, at a service charge of \$3.00 per \$100 per year or approximately 5½% simple interest.

Any regular member on leave, TD, etc. away from his home unit may apply to the unit nearest him for an emergency loan.

If a member is on an un-accompanied posting, his dependent may make application to the loan committee where the dependent is located for assistance.
