# How Halloween Began

## WHY DO PEOPLE CELEBRATE HALLOWEEN?

Halloween is a combination of holidays. As a night of ghosts and witches it was started by the Celts (selts).

The Celts had a holiday Samhain, which meant "end of summer". So Samhain was a festival marking the end of the food growing season. The Celts believed that spirits of the fruits and vegetables, and also the ghosts of people, visited the earth on Samhain, which was October 31. The Celts lit huge bonfires on hiltops to scare the ghosts away.

## MANAGING YOUR MONEY by Harry L. Mardon

Summer doesn't seem to be an appropriate time to think about Registered Retirement Savings Plans. That's because Canadians have become used to the last minute RRSP rush in the first two months of the year.

However, summertime is actually when the prudent saver and investor does some earlybird tax planning. In that way you avoid getting caught up in any emotional stampede to save taxes by purchasing an RRSP, or adding to an existing plan, just before the deadline next March 1.

The sooner you put money into an RRSP this year the greater the return on your investment. That is because the interest or dividend income your RRSP earns is sheltered from tax, and the income grows on a compounding basis. It is because of this that a good number of Canadians use all or part of any tax refund they get from Ottawa to invest immediately in their RRSPs.

Of course, you have the task of choosing a type of RRSP which best suits your financial situation and needs.

Your first step should be to decide what type of RRSP you want. If you are not sure, you should seek the advice of a trustworthy financial planner. There is no point in asking a clerk at a counter in a financial institution for advice, as the clerk probably knows less about RRSPs than you do.

What you should be looking for is an RRSP which will help you to reach your financial goal. Keeping mind that although buying an RRSP provides an immediate tax advantage, by sheltering some of your income from taxation, the main purpose of owning a plan is to provide you with additional retirement income. Therefore, the plan you pick must be suited to your age bracket.

For example, if you are only five years away from retirement, you will want to buy an RRSP which will provide guaranteed results. Your money is locked away in the plan for a set period of time at a fixed rate of interest.

On the other hand, if you are 10

or 15 years from retirement, you should consider an RRSP which is offered by an investment (mutual) fund. There are two main types of RRSPs offered by investment funds:

Income fund, where your RRSP money is invested in a portfolio of mortgages or a selection of government and/or corporate bonds. The value of your investment will fluctuate over the years but over a long term the results should be good.

Equity fund, in which your RRSP money is invested in a mixed portfolio of common stocks and preferred shares of publicly owned companies. The results will vary greatly, in line with what happens to the general performance of the stock markets. But in the long term this type of investment can be a profitable one.

Of course, the closer you are to retirement the less risk you want your RRSP funds to be exposed to. For this reason it is wise to deal with an RRSP issuer who can offer you a range of plans, so that you can switch your money from a vulnerable to a protected position at the right time.

Another approach you should consider is diversifying your RRSP investments into two or three of the basic types of plans. Have some of your money in a guaranteed plan, some in an equitybased fund and some invested in bonds or mortgages. That form of diversification would limit your risk exposure.

### Padre's Corner

Peace is in fashion. This year has been declared the International Year of Peace by the U.N. We would think of it as a curious fashion in a world that is beset with wars and social conflicts: Central America, with conflicts in Nicaragua and El Salvador; the Iran-Iraqe War; the Middle East in Lebanon; The Lybian threats; the social and political upheavels in Haiti and Phillipines. The nuclear threat always weights on humanity; international terrorism is more and more the means by which pressure groups are heard; famine and drought are a constant treat in Africa; unemployment runs the danger of making the generation from 18-30, an embittered and rejected group. It does seem curious to speak of peace this year. Rather, it is a happy idea if it can be called forth to awaken the conscience and call forth a missionary sense and a faith commitment to strive for justice from those who belong to the Church and who say they are the disciples of Jesus.

The call to be the builder of peace has been given to all beleivers. Already present in the Old Testament, definite peace and justice are promises of the Kingdom. This call takes on an acute character with Jesus. He focuses believers on their vocation, their mission: those who beleive in Him, who share in His death and resurrection should be incarnate examples in the world of living hope in the Kingdom which is to come. Moreover, they should be committed during their whole lives, to building, as best they can, this Kingdom of peace and justice. This call, summed up in the Beatitudes is not optional. It is an integral part of faith life, and calls us to a complex process following other generations of believers.

Being builders of peace does not mean systematically avoiding all conflict. This would be to escape reality. Nor does it mean to take the side of the stronger under the pretext of setting problems. We must recall that in the Bible, justice and peace are closely linked; there is a false kind of peace when it is based on human exploitation, oppression, threats caused by arms, money or ideas.

Some people may feel crushed, faced with the enormity of the task to be acheived and the difficulties that have to be resolved. To them, we should recall the promises of the bible. God does not abandon his people. One day he will bring them to inhabit a time of peace. (Isaiah 32:18). God comes himself to take the part of the unimportant, the poor, the oppressed, and he promises them a Kingdom beyond their hopes. Now it is up to us to pursue this mission, faithful to the challenge given to us: "With Jesus, let's build peace in the world".

Yes, happy are those who search for God for the Kingdom of God is theirs. Happy those who are persecuted for justice, happy those who fight for peace. Happy those who stand up against the armament race. Happy those who give their lives for the development of a just world, where all can live in peace, love and unity.

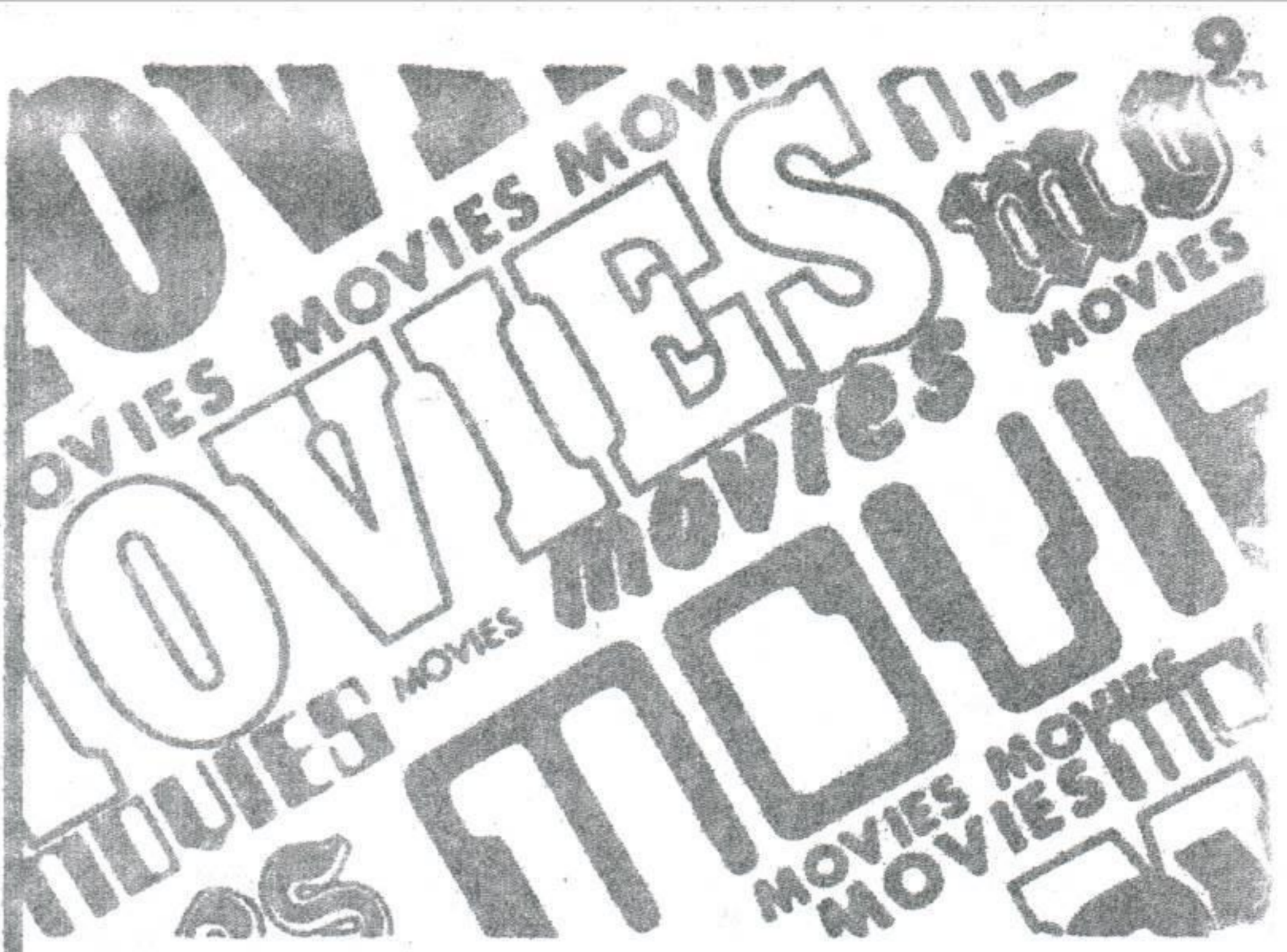
All movies shown in the Parish Hall are rated by the Canadian Forces Movie Guild. Admission to these movies is regulated as follows:

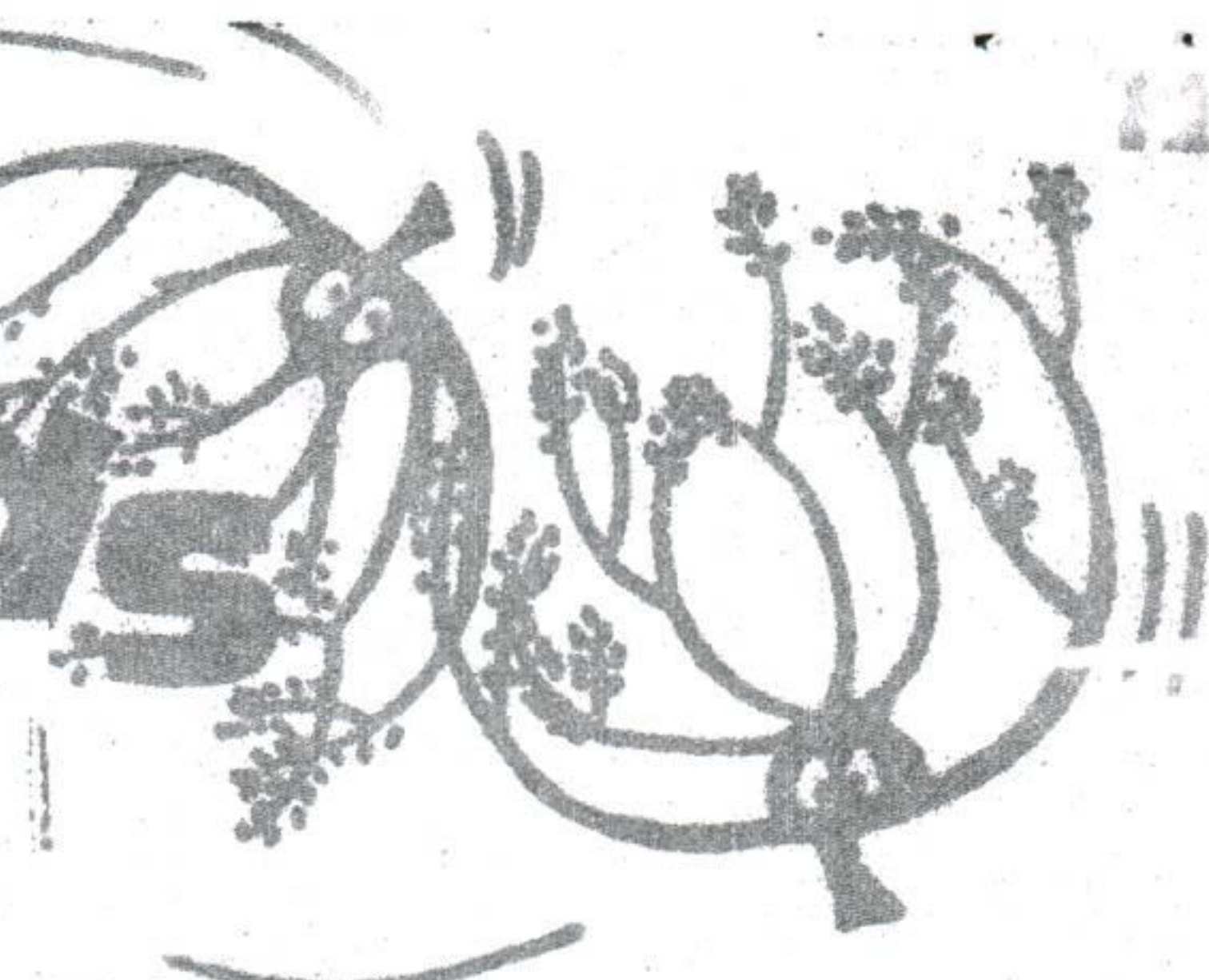

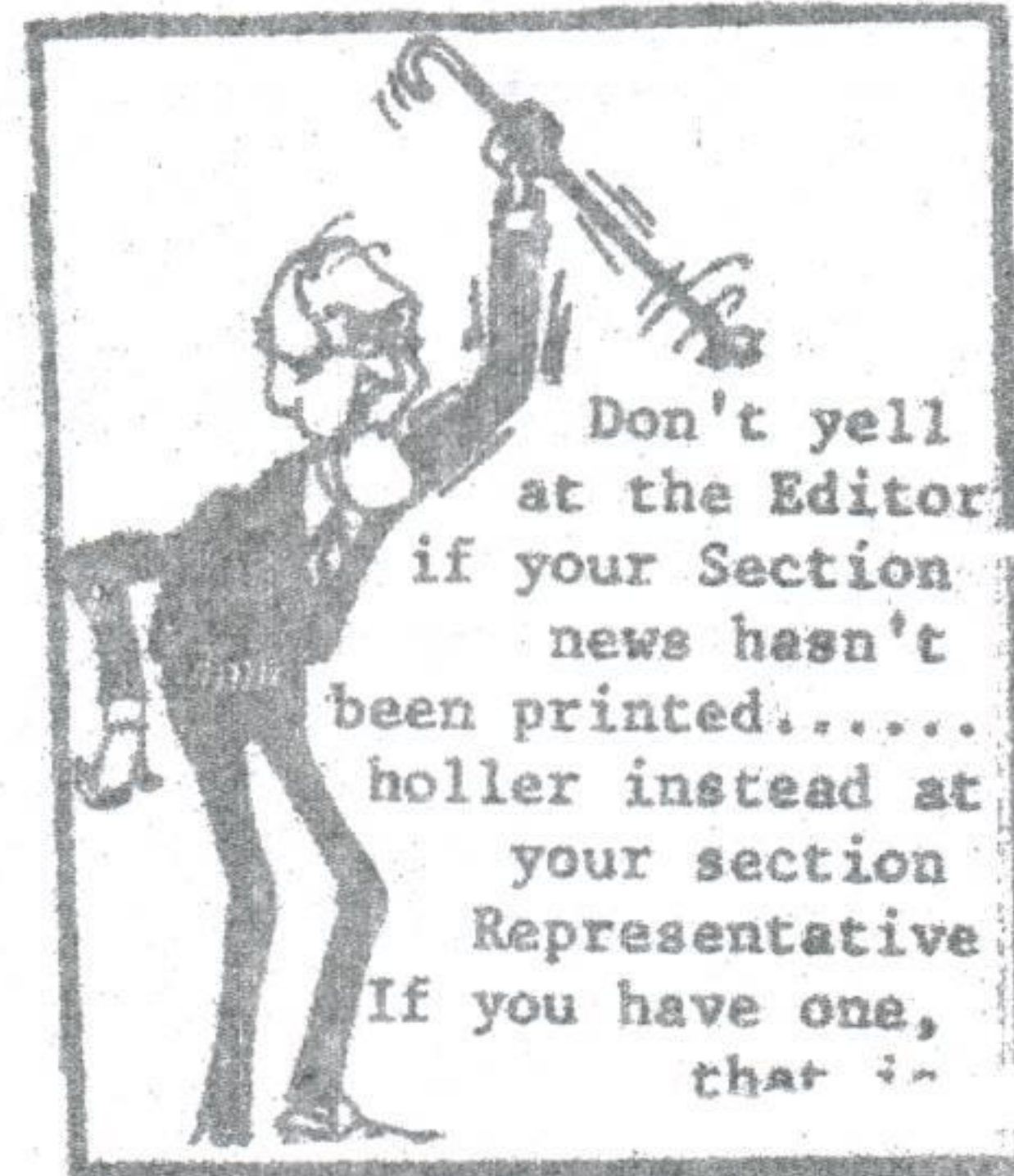
